New Delhi, June 27: Marking its first arrests in the NEET-UG paper leak case, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Thursday took into custody two persons from Patna claiming that the duo provided safe premises to the aspirants before the examination where they were given leaked papers and answer keys.

"Manish Kumar and Ashutosh Kumar provided safe accommodation to NEET-UG aspirants before the test where they were given leaked question papers and answer keys," CBI officials said.

Both were produced before a special court in Patna which sent them to judicial custody, they said.

The CBI will now seek their remand from the court to ques-

Mumbai, June 27: Benchmark Sensex breached the historic 79,000-mark while Nifty scaled the 24,000 peak for the first time Thursday as buying in blue-chip stocks like Infosys, Reliance and TCS helped markets extend gains to the fourth straight day and close at lifetime high levels.

The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 568.93 points or 0.72 per cent to settle at a new closing peak of 79,243.18 amid the expiry of monthly contracts in the derivatives segment. During the day, it zoomed 721.78 points or 0.91 per cent to hit the new lifetime peak of 79,396.03.

The Nifty ended at a fresh record high of 24,044.50, rising 175.70 points or 0.74 per cent. Intra-day, it soared 218.65 points or 0.91 per cent to hit the all-time peak of 24,087.45. Among the 30 Sensex companies, UltraTech Cement jumped over 5 per cent after the country's leading cement maker said it will acquire a 23 per cent stake in its Chennai-based rival India Cements Ltd.

Bhubaneswar: Sara that had been a cherished wild tigress and an integral part of Nandankanan family died at the age of 18 Thursday, said reports. The beloved tigress breathed her last at 4:42am on the Nandankanan Zoological Park (NZP) premises. Sara's journey began when she was rescued from Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve in MP October 18, 2006, when she was just five months old, and was reared at Van Vihar Zoological Park in Bhopal. She came to NZP April 18, 2009, under an animal exchange programme. "Sara became a vital participant in our conservation breeding programme. She infused new life into the tiger population by giving birth to Asha, Ankita and Subhashree January 13, 2012, sired by tiger Rishi," said an **P3** official of NZP.

Nod to ₹903.41 crore green energy projects

Bhubaneswar: The state government Thursday approved investment proposals worth Rs 903.41 crore in the renewable energy (RE) sector, according to an official statement. The single window committee (SWC) of the Energy department, led by Principal Secretary Vishal Kumar Dev, cleared the investment proposals with an aim to meet the state's RE target of 10 GW by 2030. The panel approved the proposal of HPCL Renewable & Green Energy Ltd to set up a 48-MW wind energy project at Umerkote in Nabarangpur district, while ONGC Tripura Power Company Ltd got the go-ahead to develop a 49.5-MW wind energy project in Astaranga in Puri district, the statement said. The total investment for these two wind energy projects stands at Rs 881.28 crore, it said. P3

Britain's true ruler? Larry, the Downing Street cat

London, June 27: There has been one figure of stability in the nearly 14 years of political turmoil in the UK — Larry, the cat that has been serving as the Chief Mouser to the Cabinet Office at 10 Downing Street in London.

Now, with a general election set for July 4, the ageing tabby could be in line for his sixth prime minister

He has already had five Conservative prime ministers serve under him but if polls are correct, he will soon get his first from the Labour party.

Incumbent Rishi Sunak's departure would see him take his fox-red labrador retriever, Nova, too. Not that Larry would mind. According to Sunak's wife, Akshata Murty, the two have

had some 'heated exchanges' But Larry has always prevailed.

Staboner rheader Keir cently told the BBC that his family has a cat, Jojo, that his children spoil more

than him. They also have a hamster, Bear, he told the Metro newspaper. But it remains to be seen if either would move with him if he wins. Larry has been fiercely protective of his territory, frequently fighting to be top cat with his counterpart at the Foreign ministry, Palmerston. His rival

eventually retired to the countryside.

Urban foxes and unsuspecting pigeons have also been chased away, although one feathered interloper narrowly avoided his clutches, as the media looked

London. He was recruited

Cameron to get rid of mice and even given an official title: Chief Mouser. But his performance in that department left much to be desired, despite a few early successes.

Cameron himself tried to quash rumours that he and Larry did not get along, while reporters on the politics beat have said he is friendly with journalists. "He's interested," the appropriately named BBC political correspondent Helen Catt said in a recent item on Larry.

"He tends to come up and have a look when you're there with the camera crew. He likes to see what the press are up to.'

But that has its downsides, she added.

'When you're in Downing Street and you're doing lives, you're always very aware that if he pops out behind you, a lot of people really aren't going to be listening to what you're saying anymore," she said.

For the general election, Larry has set out his campaign manifesto on his official @Number10cat social media account.

"I don't get to vote in the general election but I do have to live with whoever you elect. No pressure," one post read after Sunak announced the election May 22. "Whatever the result of the

election, I'll be here to keep an eye on things," read another.

Interviewed by AFP on the 10th anniversary of his arrival in power, Larry, via the human running his social media account, revealed the secret to his longevity.

"The key thing to remember is that I live here permanently, the politicians just lodge with me for a bit until they're fired," he said.

'They all work out sooner orlater that it's me that runs the place.



The investment in green energy projects to reduce pollution includes a 48-MW wind power project to be set up by

HPCL Renewable and Green Energy Ltd at Umerkote in Nabarangpur district and the 49.5-MW wind power project to be set up by ONGC Tripura Power Company Ltd at Astaranga in Puri district.

A total investment of ₹881.28 crore will be made for these two projects.

Similarly, in the field of solar energy, the SWC has approved a 0.72-MW solar project at Manesar, Sambalpur by

Bhubaneswar, June 27: The state government Thursday asked the Director General of Police (DGP) to provide information regarding the leave availed by IPS officer Ashish Kumar Singh.

In the letter, Muralidhar Mallick, Officer on Special Duty (OSD) cum additional secretary, Home said that Singh was al lowed to avail leave for one month, from May 4, 2025, on health grounds by the Home department. "In the meantime more than one month has passed. but no communication is received in this department weather Singh has resumed duty after availing the leave or he extended the leave. It is therefore

requested to kindly furnish information to Home department for further necessary action in

the matter," the letter stated. It may be noted that the Election Commission of India (ECI) had directed Singh to appear before a board of AIIMS-Bhubaneswar for a health check-up following complaints from the BJP that the IPS officer was working in favour of the

BJD in polls though officially he was on sick leave. She joined NZP April 18, 2009, under an animal exchange programme. "Sara became a vital participant in our conservation breeding programme. She infused new life into the tiger population by giving birth to Asha, Ankita and Subhashree January 13, 2012, sired by tiger Rishi. Asha was later transferred to Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad, under another animal exchange programme," said an NZP official.

On February 29, 2024, Sara was observed to be dull, unable to stand, and had laboured breathing. After treatment with antibiotics and supportive therapy, she was able to stand up and accept meat March 3, 2024. She was confined to the feeding and small paddock area, the official added. She developed decubitus ulcers on both hip joints March 21, 2024, and was being treated, the official said. Despite accepting food, she gradually became emaciated, he added. June 26, 2024, Sara was seen in lateral recumbency with feeble respiration. Despite all efforts, she breathed her last at 4:42am Thursday.

ltra-processed foods (UPFs) are displacing healthy diets "all over the world" despite growing evidence of the risks they pose and should be sold with tobacco-style warnings, according to the nutritional scientist who

first coined the term. Prof Carlos Monteiro of the University of São Paulo will highlight the increasing danger UPFs present to children and adults at the International

Congress on Obesity this week. "UPFs are increasing their share in and domination of global diets, despite the risk they represent to health in terms of increasing the risk of multiple chronic diseases," Monteiro told the Guardian ahead of the con-

ference in São Paulo. "UPFs are displacing healthier, less processed foods all over the world, and also causing a deterioration in diet quality due

to their several harmful attributes. Together, these foods are driving the pandemic of obesity and other diet-related chronic diseases, such as diabetes.'

The stark warning comes amid rapidly rising global consumption of UPFs such as cereals, protein bars, fizzy drinks, ready meals and fast food.

In the UK and US, more than half the average diet now consists of ultra-processed food. For some, especially people who are younger, poorer or from disadvantaged areas, a diet comprising as much as 80 per cent UPF

is typical. In February, the world's largest review of its kind found UPFs were directly linked to 32 harmful effects to health, including a higher risk of heart disease, cancer, type 2 diabetes, adverse mental health and early death.

Monteiro and his colleagues



first used the phrase UPF 15 years ago when designing the food classification system "Nova". This assesses not only nutritional content but also the processes food undergoes before it is consumed.

The system places food and drink into four groups: minimally processed food, processed culinary ingredients, processed food and ultra-processed food.

Monteiro told the Guardian he was now so concerned about the impact UPF was having on human health that studies and reviews were no longer sufficient to warn the public of the health hazards.

"Public health campaigns are needed like those against tobacco to curb the dangers of UPFs, he told the Guardian in an email. "Such campaigns would include

"Advertisements for UPFs should also be banned or heavily restricted, and front-of-pack warnings should be introduced similar to those used for cigarette packs." He will tell delegates: "Sales of UPFs in schools

and health facilities should be banned, and there should be heavy taxation of UPFs, with the revenue generated used to subsidise fresh foods.

Monteiro will tell the conference that food giants marketing UPFs know that, in order to be competitive, their products must be more convenient, more affordable and tastier than freshly prepared meals. "To maximise profits, these UPFs must have lower cost of production and be overconsumed," he said.

However, Dr Hilda Mulrooney, a reader in nutrition and health at London Metropolitan University, said comparing UPF to tobacco was "very simplistic".

"There is no such thing as a safe cigarette, even second-hand, so banning them is relatively case is very clear.

Landmark SC ruling could spur more climate cases in India

The Supreme Court recognises the right against adverse effects of climate change part of rights to life and equality

New Delhi, June 27: A landmark ruling by the Supreme Court of India which recognised the right against adverse effects of climate change as a distinct fundamental right could drive more climate litigation in the country, according to a global report released Thursday.

Citing the case of MK Ranjitsinh and Others vs Union of India, the report by the London School of Economics' Grantham Research Institute on Climate Change and the Environment said that climate cases in the Global South are increasing and gaining more attention.

The report said that over 200 climate cases from Global South countries are recorded in databases, comprising about eight per cent of all cases globally.

"While research indicates a growing trend in utilising the courts as instruments in climate policy responses in some Global South countries, there may be a strategic avoidance of climate litigation in others," the report said.

For instance, it noted that India's historically low number of climate cases reflects a conscious decision to avoid an overly narrow focus on emissions, as this can overlook broader issues related to livelihoods, rights. and ecological concerns.

"However, there may be a shift following a landmark judgment by the Supreme Court of India," the report added.

Ranjitsinh case originated from concerns about the impact of overhead power cables on the Great Indian Bustard. It evolved into a broader discussion on balancing climate action with other conservation measures, as the government argued that the power transmission lines were essential to India's climate change response.

The authors said the case exemplifies a significant type of non-climate-aligned litigation that has emerged in recent years, known as green versus green litigation. These cases involve a trade-off between climate and biodiversity or other environmental aims

The authors analyzed a database of 2,666 climate litigation cases compiled by the Sabin Center for Climate Change Law at Columbia University. Around 70 per cent of these cases have been filed since 2015, the year the Paris Agreement was adopted. In 2023 alone, 233 new cases were filed.

cases, with 1,745 cases in total and 129 new cases filed in 2023. Following the US, the UK, Brazil and Germany have the highest numbers of recorded cases.

Climate cases were filed in 2023 for the first time in Panama and Portugal, while older cases in Hungary and Namibia were identified, bringing the total number of countries with recorded climate cases to 55. The report also noted a rise in

cases concerning 'climate-washing' - exaggerated or misrepresented climate credentials - with 47 such cases filed in 2023, bringing the total to over 140. The year 2023 saw a signifi-

cant increase in cases against climate action, with 50 filed, including backlash litigation against environmental, social, and governance initiatives, as well as lawsuits targeting NGOs and shareholder activists.

Internationally, 2023 was an important year for climate litigation. The European Court of Human Rights confirmed that Switzerland's failure to act on climate change violated the European Convention on Human

a dog's role could include interrupting a panic attack or lying across veterans' laps to calm them. People with disabilities have a legal right to be accompanied by their service dogs in public, whether they're at a supermarket or a baseball game.

The findings can inform policvmakers, health clinicians and insurance companies on the value of service dogs for veterans with PTSD, potentially increasing funding for groups that train and place service dogs and shortening wait times.

What's next

The researchers are conducting a randomised clinical trial called the Service Dog and Veteran Experiences Study, or SERVES. It's being done in collaboration with K9s for Warriors and Canine Companions, another nonprofit that trains and provides service dogs to veterans. THE CONVERSATION

Lower Suktel oustees live in darkness

Bolangir, June 27: The landless villagers of Kharsabahal village in Bolangir district, who were displaced for the Lower Suktel Irrigation Project, have been pushed to darkness after the district administration rehabilitated them at Barapudagia village without power supply to their makeshift houses.

The displaced villagers comprising 15 landless families mostly from Scheduled Caste (SC) and Muslim community have been rehabilitated on government land. They earn their living by working as daily wagers or by peddling bangles in the nearby villages.

Being landless, the villagers have been deprived of government assistance except for a ration card with which they get rice every month. The state government has neither given them any plot to build houses nor announced a big package for them

Court awards life sentence to man for double murder

Jagatsinghpur, June 27: The Additional District and Sessions Judge in Kujang awarded life imprisonment to a man Thursday in connection with a brutal double murder in Jagatsinghpur district.

The convict Jyotiprakash Nathsarma alias Kalia had murdered two women separately in June 2023. Kalia hacked a woman who was plucking flowers on the roadside in Kujang Expressway Colony with a sword killing her on the spot. Kalia did not stop there. On his way home, he again attacked another woman who was opening the gate of her house

and killed her brutally. Kujang police had arrested him and investigated the case.

The oustees have built makeshift houses on the land at their own cost. Living in the temporary huts, they are passing through a harrowing time in complete darkness after evening due to lack of power supply. It has been over a year since they have been rehabilitated but their sufferings do not seem to end. They were not even given solar panels or even a torch to light up their houses

Sources said the first rainwater was stored in the reservoir in July, 2023. However, people in many of the villages were in the submergence area were not displaced then. Later, incessant rainfall occurred. As a result, the backwaters of the reservoir gushed into the riparian Kharsabahal, Gadashankar, Dunguripalli, Banchhorpali and

Kumiapalli villages. Alarmed over the development, the district administration hurriedly evacuated hundreds of



landless families and rehabilitated them at the hostel of a tribal school at Chudapali, August 2, 2023. The evacuation was so swift that the displaced villagers even failed to bring with them many of their belongings. The state government only announced financial assistance of ₹3.45 lakh for each family. Later, the district adminis-

tration announced that a government land at Barapudagia village has been identified for their rehabilitation and shifted

the villagers there. It was also announced that the displaced families will be given a housing plot each under Vasundhara Yojana.

The villagers were rehabilitated on the government land but the place does not have basic facilities such as a good road, drinking water, power supply or readymade houses to live in.

As a result, the villagers constructed houses on their own and started living in the area. Meanwhile, over 10 months have passed since then, but the district administration is yet to ensure the basic facilities for them. The whole area plunges into darkness after sundown.

Women are the worst sufferers as there is no pond or any water body in the area. Children have failed to study sans an Anganwadi centre in the area. The villagers always live in constant fear of wild animals and snakes as the area is close to a forest. Rains further worsen their sorrows. They have lodged several complaints but the district administration is yet to address their pleas.

When contacted, Nutan Seth, project director (in-charge) of Lower Suktel Irrigation Project (rehabilitation and resettlement), a final estimate has been prepared for power supply and sent to TPWODC. The RWSS department has also installed two tube wells for the villagers. Rest of their problems will be resolved gradually, he added.

Vig court convicts 3 corrupt RDA officials

Rourkela, June 27: A Vigilance Court in Sundargarh has sentenced three officials of Rourkela Development Authority (RDA) to Rigorous Imprisonment (RI) after convicting them for corruption. The convicted officials are

Medisetti Seshadri, ex-secretary, Siva Charan Mohanty, ex-executive engineer, PHD-cum-engineering member and Manoj Kumar Dash, legal assistant, of RDA.

They were chargesheeted by Odisha Vigilance U/s 13(2) r/w 13(1)(d) of PC Act, 1988/34 IPC for their alleged involvement in a corruption case.

The first two accused Seshadri and Mohanty were convicted by the Special Judge, Vigilance, Sundargarh for abusing their official power and showing undue official favour by violating rules of the government for pecuniary gain.

The court sentenced both Mohanty and Dash to rigorous imprisonment for a period of



two years and slapped a fine of ₹5,000. In case of default, they will undergo additional jail term of three months or more.

A non-bailable warrant has been issued against Medisetti Seshadri as he did not appear before the court for hearing of sentence.

Vigilance will now move the competent authority for stoppage of pension of Mohanty and dismissal of Dash from service following their conviction.



Pathway to Peace

rench President Emmanuel Macron's decision to dissolve parlia-┥ ment and call a snap election this Sunday will divert the world's attention from another possible political earthquake. On Friday, Iranian voters will fill the vacancy left by President Ebrahim Raisi's death in a helicopter crash last month.

Even without the French vote, it would be tempting to trivialise the Iranian election's significance. After all, the Islamic Republic's Supreme Leader, Ali Khamenei, is a bitter opponent of the West, and Raisi, his loyal follower, won decisively in 2021. So, won't Khamenei simply manipulate the upcoming vote in a way that will assure the victory of another extreme hardliner?

Not so fast. Iranian politics has taken a decisive turn in the three years between Raisi's rise and fall. Under Iran's constitution, candidates must be approved by the Council of Guardians, dominated by the clerical elite, before they can run for office. In 2021, Raisi owed his victory to the Council's refusal to award a place on the ballot to any strong opponent of Khamenei's militant anti-Westernism.

But escalating public protest forced the Council to allow a leading opponent of Khamenei to enter the race this time – under conditions that make it very likely that he will win

and revolutionise policy in a pro-Western direction. As a consequence, if US President Joe Biden's administration plays its cards right, the victory of an Iranian peacemaker could well permit – believe it or not – lasting peace in the Middle East.

Should that happen, rather than aiming for a fragile ceasefire agreement, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken can begin constructing a multilateral arrangement in which the US and Iran serve as military guarantors of a twostate solution for Israelis and Palestinians.

To see how, step back to 2021 and consider how the Guardians' ban on serious opponents provoked widespread public alienation. Although Raisi won handily over rival hardliners, this was because most Iranians refused to vote. To be precise, only 49% of Iran's 59 million voters went to the polls - down from 70% four years earlier.

That tacit boycott served as the foundation for grassroots activism. A turning point came in the fall of 2022, when a young woman, Mahsa Amini, was arrested for failing to veil her face in public and died in police custody three days later. Her death provoked countrywide demonstrations, and the government responded with media blackouts, tear gas, and gunfire that killed hundreds of protesters over the next year. Despite the brutal repression, stu-

dents and workers continued to engage in peaceful protest against Raisi's extremism

Raisi's death triggered another cycle of protest. The opposition movement demanded that, in contrast to 2021, some of its own leaders be allowed to campaign for the presidency, and vowed that otherwise they would organise massive street demonstrations that would catapult the country to the brink of civil war.

The Guardians caved in to this demand. While they approved five hardliners to run in the election, they also allowed Masoud Pezeshkian to place his name on the ballot. Pezeshkian represents a stunning contrast to his rivals. Instead of seeking divine inspiration, he went to medical school, became a cardiac surgeon, and served as president of the University of Medical Sciences in Tabriz for five years. Between 2001 and 2005, he was Iran's health minister, before turning to electoral politics, serving as the parliament's first deputy speaker from 2016 to 2020. Few Iranians have combined academic, bureaucratic, and political achievement in such a remarkable fashion. What is more, Pezeshkian responded to Amini's brutal death in 2022 by immediately denouncing the police efforts "to implement religious faith through the use of force." At the time, he could not know whether Raisi would respond by ordering his arrest - which is why many other Iranian elites held their tongues The Guardians' decision to allow five hardliners to run will only improve Pezeshkian's chances. In fact, with the religious vote fragmented, a champion of the Enlightenment could win a landslide victory. If Pezeshkian wins, a dramatic shift in America's long-standing view of Iran as its archenemy will be essential to respond constructively. Blinken, thankfully, is nimble enough for such an about-face. Moreover, his nonstop shuttle diplomacy in the Middle East means that he can readily reach out to potential Iranian negotiators. No less important, Biden will be eager to take Blinken's reports seriously because the split in the American Jewish community and Arab-Americans' growing opposition to his candidacy represent a major threat to his re-election. The threat will get even bigger after Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu arrives in Washington to address a joint session of Congress on 24 July. By that point, Biden could be in a position to invite Netanyahu to join multilateral negotiations with Iran. Such a scenario could not only dramatically reduce the risk of nuclear proliferation and a wider war in the Middle East, but also prepare the way for a two-state solution that would permit both Israel and Palestine to coexist in peace. Raisi's death represents a rare opportunity in which political leaders of long-standing rivals have powerful incentives to inaugurate a new era of diplomacy. But Biden must seize the moment. If he views Pezeshkian as an enemy, Khamenei will be able to sabotage the new president's popular standing and convince voters to repudiate his Enlightenment vision the next time around. This is not the first time in recent history that a few quick decisions in the White House determine the future of the Middle East. Some have led to years of bitter conflict. This one could mark out a pathway to peaceful coexistence for decades to come.

Hanumanthaiya argued that members of the Constituent Assembly have drafted a document that has the "music of an English band" instead of the "music of Veena or Sitar." In his book A People's Constitution, lawyer-historian Rohit De argues that, unlike such presuppositions, the Constitution is in fact a document that reflects and stands for the values and rights of the common people. The book's central argument is defended not merely through legal analysis but through narratives of marginalised Indians.

De buttresses his argument by citing the rise of cases in judiciary. In the colonial era, most cases involved civil litigations. Post Independence, civil litigation declined while cases against State increased exponentially. In 1950, the Supreme Court heard 600 writ petitions compared to 169 cases of its colonial predecessor in a span of over a decade. The cases increased to 3833 in 1962. De contrasts this with the cases of US Supreme Court during the same period. Such a comparison, however, is not valid given that US Supreme Court only hears cases relating to the federal law while the Indian Supreme Court is the final court of appeal in all cases.

In this review. I will focus on the case of butchers. Post Independence, agitation and demand for a nationwide ban on cow-slaughter grew. Seth Govind Das, a Congress parliamentarian, led the charge for a ban on cow slaughter. Though Das introduced a Private Member's Bill in Parliament on cowslaughter, it was opposed by Jawaharlal Nehru. Nehru con-

sidered it to be against the spirit and the letter of the Constitution. Nevertheless. Congress state governments enacted laws which completely banned cow slaughter. A group of Muslim butchers petitioned arguing that ban on cow slaughter violated the right to practice their occupation as well as religion. Tackling the issue of the fundamental right to religion, the court ruled that it did not prohibit religious practice as Muslims were not conjoined to specifically sacrifice a cow during Bakr Id but an animal which could also be a goat or a camel. There was a precedence of Muslim rulers in the past having banned cow slaughter. The question of the fundamental right to livelihood was more complex. The court noted the strong sentiments that the Hindus have towards this issue. While noting that sentiment cannot solely be enough, it was one of the factors that the court explicitly took into consideration. Cattle slaughter was justified on the ground that the cow was extremely useful to

India's agricultural economy. The court also recognised that banning of cattle slaughter would lead to dislocation of the business of butchers while depriving many of their source of protein. Taking all these factors into account, the court ruled that the slaughter of bulls. bullocks, and buffaloes were permitted when the animals stopped being useful. The court did, however, upheld complete ban on cow slaughter.

De argues that the judgement ensured that in practice cattle slaughter would not be penalised as strongly as the state laws prescribed it to be. The court echoed views of Nehru by prioritising economic logic. This did not do much to position itself against majoritarian sentiments. The slaughter of cow was prohibited but not consumption or possession of beef. The sale of beef was prohibited but not gift of beef. Such ambiguity in the judgements creates conditions to protect the livelihood of butchers while being cautious towards sentiments of Hindus. De does not ad-

dress the fact that such ambiguity has created unclear precedence. A ban on cow slaughter is upheld on the argument that it is not mandatory in Islam. One could similarly argue that the singing of Bhajans in temples is not mandatory. Does that give the government the right to make a law that bans the singing of Bhajans across the country? There are many regional rituals that are specific to certain states and hence not obligatory in Hinduism. This does not make it permissible for the state to ban them. It is also hard to argue that the worship of cow is mandatory in Hinduism. There is no reason to assume that the cow that is not slaughtered will necessarily be used for agricultural economy. The owner may choose to abandon the cow. Moreover, there are other animals like sheep, goat and mules which are equally crucial for the agricultural economy in providing manure and milk. Yet, there is no discussion concerning a law prohibiting their slaughter. There is a serious argument to be made that under the veneer of faulty economic logic the law is specifically made to satiate the sentiments of the majority. These arguments are not addressed by De. It is hard to see through this case how the Constitution stands up for the

subaltern. De's book is important, thought provoking and for the most part well-argued and extremely well written. At the same time, it falls prey to its own belief in the Constitution While De certainly looks at the Constitution cautiously, he does not sufficiently address the centralising tendency of the Constitution which seems to be clearly a reflection of elite romanticisation of the State.

Curbing emissions

Sir, Denmark is making history by becoming the first country to implement a carbon tax specifically for agriculture. This groundbreaking policy, reached after months of collaboration with farmers and environmental groups, marks a significant shift in tackling climate change. The tax will begin in 2030 and will require farmers to pay a fee based on the amount of greenhouse gas their operations produce. This fee will start at 120 Danish kroner (€16) per ton of carbon dioxide equivalent and increase to 300 kroner (€40) by 2035. To ease the transition, the government will offer a 60% tax break with even greater reductions for farms demonstrating lower emissions. The primary goal of the carbon tax is to curb agricultural emissions, a major contributor to climate change. Denmark has set a bold target of reducing its overall emissions by 70% by 2030, and this policy is expected to play a crucial role in achieving that goal. While environmental benefits are a priority, the Danish government is also mindful of the economic impact on farmers. The tiered tax structure and tax breaks aim to ensure that the policy is financially sustainable for the agricultural sector. Beyond the immediate environmental and economic benefits, the carbon tax is likely to trigger a wave of innovation. Farmers will be incentivised to explore new technologies and practices to minimise emissions. This could lead to breakthroughs in areas like sustainable feed production, manure management, and even selective breeding programmes for livestock. Kolkata, June 27: The row over the venue for the swearing-in ceremony of the two newly elected TMC MLAs escalated Thursday as the legislator refused to take oath in the Raj Bhavan as asked by Governor CV Ananda Bose and sat on a dharna in the Assembly complex.

Baranagar MLA Sayantika Bandyopadhyay and Bhagabangola MLA Rayat Hossain Sarkar sat on the dharna in front of the BR Ambedkar statue in the West Bengal Vidhan Sabha complex and demanded that Bose enable them to perform their duties as legislators by facilitating the oath-taking ceremony in the Assembly.

The Governor had invited the two MLAs, who were elected in the recent bypolls, to take the oath at the Raj Bhavan Wednesday. However, they declined the invitation, claiming convention dictates that in the case of bypoll winners, the Governor assigns the Speaker or the Deputy Speaker to administer the oath. The Governor refused to hold

Banerjee alleged that she has received complaints from women who claimed that they felt unsafe going to the Raj Bhavan after reports of certain activities were reported from there. "Nearly a month has passed but my MLAs - Sayantika Bandyopadhyay and Rayat Hossain Sarkar - are unable to take oath. The Governor is obstructing them from doing so. 

Kolkata, June 27: Stating that hawkers' eviction is not the goal of the West Bengal government, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Thursday gave them one month to clear the footpaths and the stretch of roads they have encroached on to carry on with their business

Banerjee's statement came amid the ongoing eviction of encroachers including hawkers from various parts of the state.

The chief minister, who held a review meeting regarding the issue of hawkers' encroachment, also constituted a committee to conduct a survey in this regard and submit a report to her office within 15 days.

She said that the state government would identify 'hawking zones' in the state, erect buildings to accommodate the hawkers, godowns for keeping their wares and issue identity cards to them.

"I have no right to take away anyone's source of income or render anyone unemployed. Millions run their family by doing hawking. There will be no eviction for one month. During this period, the hawkers have to clear footpaths." said Banerjee, also the Trinamool Congress supremo.

"We will conduct a survey. The government will see where legal hawkers can be accommodated. Godowns will also be set up. But roads cannot be occupied. If new hawkers are found (encroaching footpaths), they will be arrested,"



she said.

Kolkata, June 27: Nobel laureate Amartya Sen has asserted the recent Lok Sabha poll results point to the fact that India is not a 'Hindu Rashtra'.

He also expressed displeasure that keeping people behind bars "without trial" has continued in the country since the British rule and it is more in practice under the BJP government in comparison to the Congress regime.

"That India is not a Hindu Rashtra only has been reflected in the election results," Sen told a Bengali news channel at the Netaji Subhas Chandra **Bose International Airport** here. The 90-year-old economist arrived in Kolkata from the US Wednesday evening.

'We always hope to see a change after every election. Some of what happened earlier (during the BJP-led central government) like putting people behind bars without trial, and widening the gap between the

ing. That must stop," he said. The eminent economist said there is a need to be politically open-minded, especially when India is a secular country with a secular Constitution. "I do not think the idea of

turning India into a Hindu Rashtra is appropriate," Sen said. He was also of the opinion that the new Union cabinet is "a copy of the earlier one". "The ministers continue to hold similar portfolios. Despite a slight reshuffle, the politically powerful are still powerful," he said.

Sen recalled that during his childhood when India was under the British rule, people were jailed without any trial. "When I was young, many of my uncles and cousins were put in jail without trial. We had hoped that India would be free from this. Congress is also to blame for the fact that this did not stop. They didn't change it ... But, this is more in practice under the present government," the

Few cities have effective heat action plans: Report

New Delhi, June 27: Only a small fraction of cities with heat action plans have mapped vulnerable populations and developed specific strategies to mitigate the impact of extreme heat, according to an analysis published Thursday.

The International Forum for Environment, Sustainability and Technology (iFOREST) assessed the heat action plans of nine cities and five districts. which revealed that none had allocated separate resources or mentioned financial allocations in their plans.

The environmental think tank also recommended redefining

heat waves based on the "feels like" temperature or heat index and developing new thresholds for warm nights. National **Disaster Management Authority** (NDMA) guidelines require cities to develop local thresholds for early warning systems, considering factors such as the built en-

vironment, slum population, and urban heat island effect. However, very few cities, including Ahmedabad. Bhubaneshwar, and Thane, have implemented such measures.

iFOREST's CEO and President Chandra Bhushan said. Delhi, which recorded at least 21 heat wave days this summer season — the highest in at least 14 years -has not developed local thresh-



olds. It is instead using the India Meteorological Department's (IMD) maximum temperature threshold to declare heatwaves, he said.

The IMD's threshold for a heatwave is met when the maximum temperature reaches at least 40 degrees Celsius in the plains, 37 degrees in coastal areas, and 30 degrees in hilly regions, with a departure from normal of at least 4.5 degrees. A severe heatwave is declared if the departure exceeds 6.4 degrees

Chandra Bhushan stressed the need to declare heatwaves based on the heat index, which considers air temperature and relative humidity. The iFOREST analysis showed that Delhi's heat index ranged from 51 to 53 from June 21 to June 26, when the maximum temperature was below 40 degrees Celsius and no

heatwave was declared From June 15 to June 19, Delhi's maximum temperatures hovered around 44-45 degrees Celsius, prompting the IMD to declare a heatwave, but the heat index ranged from 48 to 51.

Highlighting shortcomings in Delhi's heat action plan, Bhushan pointed out that the city's warmest temperatures are recorded on the outskirts, vet none of the heat hotspots identified by the Delhi Disaster Management Authority are in these areas. Delhi, which has experienced 40 consecutive days of temperatures above 40 degrees Celsius since May 13, recorded around 60 heat-related deaths this year, according to media reports. Bhushan also noted that while India has around 5,000 urban local bodies, only around 120 have heat action plans.

CASE SC issues notice to **NTA over OMR sheets**

New Delhi, June 27: The Supreme Court Thursday asked the National Testing Agency (NTA) to apprise it whether there is any time limit for raising grievances regarding the OMR sheets provided to the candidates who appeared in NEET-UG 2024.

A vacation bench of Justices Manoj Misra and SVN Bhatti, which issued notice to the NTA on a fresh plea filed by a private coaching centre and few NEET candidates, tagged the petition with the pending matters and listed it for hearing July 8.

Senior advocate R Basant, appearing for the coaching institute and the candidates, submitted that a few students, who have appeared for the examination. have not got the OMR sheets. The bench at the outset pointed out to Basant as how can a private coaching institute file an Article 32 petition in the Supreme Court and what kind of fundamental rights of the institution are affected.

Counsel appearing for the NTA submitted that the OMR sheets have been uploaded on the website and given to the candidates. The bench asked him whether there is any time limit for raising the grievance of OMR sheets. The NTA counsel said that he needs to take instructions and sought listing of the petition along with the pending matters.

'We will file a short reply by then to the query," he said. Basant pointed out that there is no set procedure or time limit to raise the grievance and therefore as an interim relief the candidates are seek-

NEET aspirant hangs self; 12th suicide since Jan

Kota, June 27: A 17-year-old medical aspirant allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself from a ceiling fan in his rented accommodation here. police said Thursday.

This is the twelfth case of suspected suicide by a coaching student in Kota since January. The number of student suicides in Kota stood at 26 in 2023. Bihar native Hrishit Kumar Agrawal, a student of Class XII, was preparing for NEET (National Eligibility cum Entrance Test) at a coaching institute here, Dadabari ASI Shambhu Dayal said.

He lived in a rented room in a building in Chota Chaurahin Dadabari area where some other coaching students also resided. he said. At around 1 pm Thursday, the other students informed police after Agrawal did not open his door when they knocked, he said. When a police team broke open the door, they found Agarwal hanging from a ceiling fan inside his room, he said, adding that no suicide note was recovered from the room

The body was in a decomposing state. It is suspected that he committed suicide sometime Wednesday, he said.

Agarwal was preparing for the medical college entrance exam and taking coaching for the same in Kota for the last two vears. Dadabari circle inspector Naresh Kumar Meena said, adding that the boy's parents have been informed.

The body has been sent to MBS hospital for a postmortem, which will be conducted after the arrival of his parents. he said. Another Bihar native, Ayush Jaiswal (17) committed suicide June 16 ainside his PG room in Kota. He was preparing for the IIT-JEE competitive exam.

Only 4% could not access an urban centre in 2020: Study

New Delhi, June 27: In 2020, only four per cent of India's population lacked access to an urban centre -- a densely populated built-up area -- and three per cent could access only towns within an hour of travel, according to a study published in the journal Nature Cities.

The research, led by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations. Italy, looked at over 30,000 urban centres around the world and, based on the number of people accessing them, classified them as one of four -- town, small city, intermediate city or large city. Of the 92 per cent, 55 per cent were found to live in or near a

town or a small city, while 37 per cent were found to live in or near an intermediate or a large city. Further, in 2020, 41 per cent of the 7.8 billion world population could access multiple tiers (such as a town and a small city) within an hour's travel, while 57 per cent and 64 per cent (five billion) were able to reach multiple tiers by travelling for two and three hours, respectively.

However, many locations close to a town or a small city can also access a higher tier within an hour's travel and, therefore, the authors summed up that two-thirds of the people around the world (five billion) live within an hour's travel from either an intermediate or a large city providing more specialised serv-



While a town had about 20,000 people living there, accessing basic facilities, such as groceries and primary education, a large city housed more than a million people and offered the most diversified facilities, including an airport, according to the research

Even with half the world's population living outside the urban centres, the authors found "substantial interconnectedness" as 92 per cent were able to access them in under an hour of travel, which could be seen as 'commuting distance'

ices. They added that "large cities are less relevant than smaller ones in regard to engaging populations outside their urban core". The study represented the "first systematic worldwide delineation of city-regions across multiple urban tiers," according to lead author Andrea Cattaneo, Senior Economist at FAO.

"This unprecedented dataset (spanning across 213 countries and territories) offers a powerful tool for understanding how societies are organised around urban centres, unlocking new insights for sustainable development strategies," Cattaneo said. In a warmer world and with commuting on the rise, such studies are increasingly imperative for assuring energyefficient and equitable trans-natural resource management,' the lead author said.

Washington, June 27: The US State Department's 2023 religious freedom report on India noted violent attacks on minority groups, especially Muslims and Christians, including killings, assaults and vandalism of houses of worship.

The report on international religious freedom released Wednesday said that in 2023, senior US officials continued to "raise concerns about religious freedom issues" with their Indian counterparts.

Human rights experts say India has seen a rise in attacks on minorities under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who recently won a third term, and his Hindu nationalist Bharativa Janata Party (BJP).

"In India, we see a concerning increase in anti-conversion laws, hate speech, demolitions of homes and places of worship for members of minority faith communities," US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said when the report was released, in a rare direct rebuke of India.

Criticism of India by the US is usually restrained due to close economic ties and New Delhi's importance for Washington to counter China, political analysts say

The US report listed dozens of incidents. Among them was a fatal shooting of a security official and three Muslims on a train near Mumbai by a suspect who was a railway security official. A probe by Indian authorities into that case is ongo-



France saw rise in all types of racism in '23

Racism and intolerance are rising in France, fuelled by the war in Gaza and far-right ideas in public debate, France's human rights commission, the CNCDH, said in an annual report published Thursday. The far-right National Rally (RN) is leading in the polls for upcoming legislative elections, running on a platform that proposes restricting the rights of immigrants in France, which the CNCDH has said is in "frontal opposition to the principles of equality, fraternity and freedom" enshrined in the French constitution and will embolden racist opinions. The Gaza war has triggered a rise in antisemitism and Islamophobia in France, as in other parts of the world. Reports of antisemitic and anti-Muslim acts increased by 28.4% and 29% respectively, while other types of racist acts increased by 21%. 51% of survey respondents from the general population don't feel at home in France anymore, compared to 43% of French citizens in 2022, which the report authors link to a rejection of immigration. This sentiment rises to 91% among RN supporters. 43% of French residents surveyed think that insecurity is mainly due to immigration, compared to 83% of RN supporters, 69% do not support the RN's "national preference" idea that French people should be favoured for jobs, benefits and housing over foreigners.

In a first, 2 ex-Chinese defence ministers to be tried for corruption

Beijing, June 27: Two former Chinese defence ministers, Wei Fenghe and his successor Li Shangfu, who worked under President Xi Jinping's watch were Thursday expelled from the ruling Communist Party and are set to be prosecuted in what was regarded as the worst scandal to hit the People's Liberation Army.

The Communist Party headed by Xi, has expelled General Wei, 70, and General Li, 66, for al leged corruption and launched prosecution proceedings against them after investigations reportedly found both of them indulged in corruption, separate official announcements said.

The year 2023 will also go down as the worst year for Chinese ministers as three of them including former Foreign Minister Qin Gang besides Wei and Li disappeared from public view.

Li, who went missing last year following an investigation into alleged corrupt practices, was expelled from the party Thursday for serious violation of Party discipline and the law, the state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

A similar announcement said Wei too was expelled from the party and to be prosecuted.

Wei served as Defence Minister from 2018-23 and Li barely served a few months as his successor.

Li, a Chinese aerospace engi neer who headed the People's Liberation Army's all-important Rocket (Missile) Force and was personally picked up for the top defence post by Xi himself, went missing last year, sparking speculation that he was being investigated for corruption and indiscipline.

Both served as State Councillors, the top post in the party and as a member of the Central Military Commission (CMC), the overall high command of the PLA headed by Xi

Tensions have been building in Bolivia ahead of general elections in 2025, with leftist ex-President Evo Morales planning to run against former ally Luis Arce

La Paz, June 27: Bolivian armed forces pulled back from the presidential palace in La Paz Wednesday evening and a general was arrested after President Luis Arce slammed a "coup" attempt against the government and called for international support.

Earlier in the day, military units led by General Juan Jose Zuniga, recently stripped of his military command, had gathered in the central Plaza Murillo square, home to the presidential palace and Congress.

"Today the country is facing an attempted coup d'état. Today the country faces once again interests so that democracy in Bolivia is cut short," Arce said in comments from the presidential palace, with armed soldiers outside.

"The Bolivian people are summoned today. We need the Bolivian people to organize and mobilize against the coup d'état in favor of democracy.

Inside the presidential palace, Arce swore in José Wilson Sanchez as the military commander, Zuniga's former role. He called for calm and order to be restored.

"I order that all personnel mobilized on the streets return to their units," Sanchez said. "We entreat that the blood of our soldiers not be spilled.'

The United States said it was closely monitoring the situation and urged calm and restraint. Tensions have been building in Bolivia ahead of general elections in 2025, with leftist ex-President Evo Morales planning

to run against former ally Arce, creating a major rift in the ruling socialist party and wider political uncertainty.

Many do not want a return of Morales, who governed from 2006-2019 when he was ousted amid widespread protests and replaced by an interim conservative government. Arce then won election in 2020.

Zuniga said recently that Morales should not be able to return as President and threatened to block him if he attempted to, which led Arce to remove Zuniga from his post.

Ahead of the attack on the presidential palace, Zuniga had addressed reporters in the square and cited growing anger in the landlocked country, which has been battling an economic slump with depleted central bank reserves and pressure on the boliviano currency as gas exports have dried up.

"The three chiefs of the armed forces have come to express our dismay," Zuniga told a local TV station, calling for a new cabinet of ministers."Stop destroying, stop impoverishing our country, stop humiliating our army," he said in full uniform, flanked by soldiers, insisting the action being taken was supported by the public.

Zuniga told reporters later Wednesday that Arce had Sunday asked him to "raise something up" to boost his popularity, without offering evidence.

Interior Minister Eduardo del Castillo later said Zuniga was seeking to court popular support and that the nine people_ injured in the attempt proved "this was not a drill.

Ruto is grappling with the most serious crisis of his two-yearold presidency.

Taiwan raises travel warning for China

Taipei: Taiwan's government raised its travel warning for China Thursday, telling its citizens not to go unless absolutely necessary, following a threat from Beijing last week to execute those deemed 'diehard" Taiwan independence supporters. Liang Wen-chieh, spokesperson for Taiwan's Mainland Affairs Council, told reporters the raised travel warning also applied to the Chinese-run cities of Hong Kong and Macau.

Paris, June 27: A new deadlier strain of mpox that transmits more easily between people is killing children and causing miscarriages in the Democratic Republic of Congo and may have already spread to neighbouring countries, researchers have warned.

All countries should be prepared for "this new strain before it spreads to other places, before it is too late," Jean Claude Udahemuka, a researcher at the University of Rwanda studying the outbreak, told AFP.

A global outbreak of a new strain of Mpox, previously known as monkeypox, in 2022 spread to more than 110 countries, mostly affecting gay and bisexual men. That was the clade II strain.

But there have been regular outbreaks of the clade I strain, which is 10 times deadlier, in Africa since it was first detected in DR Congo in 1970.

While the global outbreak was largely sexually transmitted, people in Africa normally caught clade I from infected animals, such as when eating bushmeat.

But "it was obvious something was different" about an mpox outbreak detected among sex workers in the remote mining Congolese town of Kamituga in September last year, Udahemuka told an online press conference. Unlike previous outbreaks in the central African country, the virus was being transmitted via sex between heterosexuals.

Testing revealed it was a mutated variant of the original strain called clade Ib.

It is "undoubtedly the most dangerous strain so far,' Udahemuka said.

Colombo, June 27: Ten Indian fishermen, arrested for allegedly engaged in illegal fishing in the Sri Lankan waters Monday, will be charged with the death of a Navy sailor, who was killed in an operation to seize their trawler, authorities here said.

A senior sailor from the Navy Special Boat Squadron sustained critical injuries due to "the aggressive manoeuvres of the Indian trawler, resisting its seizure," said a statement issued by the Sri Lankan Navy.

"Unfortunately, the senior sailor succumbed to his injuries after being admitted to the Teaching Hospital, Jaffna,' it added.

The Navy said that 10 Indian fishermen were arrested and their trawler was seized Monday.

The trawler was brought to the Kankesanthurai Harbour and the fishermen were handed over to the Mailadi Fisheries Inspector for legal proceedings.

The Kankesanthurai Police had filed a 'B' report with the Mallakam Court in Jaffna, 🔫 seeking the prosecution of 10 Indian fishermen.

"They face charges for illegal fishing in Sri Lankan waters, death of a naval person during the operation and for causing damage to naval property," the statement said.

Los Angeles, June 27: The Los Angeles home where Marilyn Monroe died was declared a historic landmark Wednesday, thwarting plans by its current owners to demolish the property.

The house was home to the "Some Like It Hot" screen siren for the final six months of her life up to her death from a drug overdose in 1962.

More than half a century on, Monroe remains one of the most beloved figures in US pop culture, and fans as well as conservationists have closely followed a row over the future of the home.

Property heiress Brinah Milstein and her reality TV producer husband Roy Bank bought the Spanish Colonial-style home

in the swanky Brentwood neighbourhood last summer for \$8.35 million.

The couple owned the house next door and intended to combine the two properties. That construction would have involved razing the Monroe home. But when a demolition permit was issued last September, a furore

quickly followed, and local politicians moved quickly to designate the building's protected status. Last month, the owners sued

the city of Los Angeles for "illegal and unconstitutional conduct." Their petition noted Monroe had "occasionally" lived in the home for "a mere six months",

and the couple claim that more than a dozen previous owners since 1962 have already changed the building beyond recognition. Those objections were over-

ruled Wednesday, as city councillors approved the designation of the house as a historic cultural monument.

"In our latest round of hiring almost 25 per cent of women are married. Married women are welcome to wear traditional metal ornaments while working in our facilities," it said. It added that the company pro-

vides qualified job seekers equal treatment and it works with relevant local agencies to ensure that all recruitment efforts follow Foxconn's recruitment standards and guidelines, as well as local labour regulations.

Tata Group retains top spot as most valuable brand

Mumbai, June 27: Capital markets watchdog Sebi Thursday decided to regulate financial influencers or finfluencers amid growing concerns about potential risk associated with such persons.

In order to address the concerns related to certain persons including unregulated entities inducing investors to deal in securities based on inappropriate claims, Sebi board approved norms to restrict associations between its regulated entities and unregistered individuals. This came amid growing concern over the potential risks associated with unregulated finfluencers who might offer biased or misleading advice. They usually work on a commission-based model. The persons regulated by Sebi

and the agents of such persons will not have any association like any transaction involving money, referral of a client, interaction of information technology systems with any other person who, directly or indirectly, provides advice recommendation or makes explicit claim of return or performance.

Also, the regulator has decided to create a closed ecosystem for fee collection by Sebiregistered Investment Advisers (IAs) and Research Analysts (RAs) from their clients.

This ecosystem will help investors ensure that their payments are reaching only registered IAs and RAs. This would also help investors identify, isolate, and avoid unregistered entities, who would be unable to access this closed ecosystem.

The real gross domestic product (GDP) rose by 8.2 per cent in 2023-24 against 7 per cent in the preceding fiscal, despite muted private and government con-

sumption and external demand conditions acting as a drag.

The FSR report showed that the gross non-performing assets (GNPA) ratio of scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) fell to 2.8 per cent and the net non-performing assets (NNPA) ratio to 0.6 per cent at the end of March 2024. The GNPA ratio of all SCBs

may improve to 2.5 per cent by March 2025, the report noted. The FSR said there are several

positives for the near-term economic outlook, including robust domestic demand conditions. high business optimism, the government's sustained focus on capital expenditure (which should crowd in more private investment through multiplier effects), firms utilising high profits to augment investible resources, and real estate activity gathering pace.

Another big positive is that credit growth is deepening, supported by healthier bank balance sheets, it said.

What to expect as India enters JPMorgan EM debt index

Mumbai, June 27: India's government bonds will gradually become a part of JPMorgan's widely tracked emerging market debt index, beginning Friday.

The announcement of the change was made in September, setting the stage for billions of dollars to flow into the world's fifth-largest economy.

Here are five things to know as the South Asian nation draws more investment from global bond investors and its stock markets attract increased portfolio inflows.

WHAT KIND OF INFLOWS?

Indian bonds should receive \$2 billion inflows from index-tracking funds around the June 28 inclusion date, followed by a similar quantum each month and total inflows of at least \$20 billion over the next 10 months as the country slowly reaches maximum weight in the index. The market has received inflows from active fund managers

and other investors totalling \$10.5 billion since September's announcement, nearly six times the inflows received from early 2021 to August 2023.

About 32-40% of the expected \$20-25 billion of index-related inflows to India may have already arrived, JPMorgan strategist wrote in a note on June 25.

WHAT FACTORS ARE LURING **FOREIGN INVESTORS?**

Global investors are keen on India's high growth, the gov-



ernment's commitment to fiscal prudence, the rupee's low volatility and the central bank's pledge to bring inflation down.

Foreign holdings of India's debt are around 2.4% of total outstanding debt and JPMorgan expects the level to nearly double by the end of 2025.

Small firms often rely on more debt and are usually heavily reliant on consumer spending which tends to slow when interest rates are high.

India offers a positive real yield. Although lower than other big emerging markets, its appeal is increased by a backdrop of moderate and controlled inflation and that government's commitment to fiscal prudence and low currency volatility.

HOW WILL LARGE INFLOWS IMPACT THE RUPEE?

Any dollar inflows should boost the local currency, but a large appreciation is not expected as Lower volatility of the Indian rupee makes it an attractive carry story

the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is likely to absorb dollars and accumulate forex reserves.

At \$652.9 billion, India's currency reserves are the fourth largest in the world. This indirectly benefits the rupee as large buffers allow the central bank to intervene and smooth volatility.

The rupee, largely because of India's active central bank, has been the most stable among major emerging market currencies.

HOW WILL THE FLOWS IMPACT THE BOND MARKET?

Large foreign flows have pushed government bond trading volumes to the highest in nearly five years.

In recent months, foreigners have started buying longer tenor government bonds in the hope of better returns once the RBI starts cutting rates later this year.

The larger long-end buying has led to further flattening of India's yield curve with the 3-year to 40-year yield spread at only 11 basis points.

Securities included in global bond indices do not have any foreign investment limits.

Rohit, Surya prop India SA END SEMIFINAL JINX

PROTEAS IN T20 WORLD CUP FINAL WITH QUICK **DEMOLITION OF AFGHANISTAN IN THE SEMIS**

Tarouba (Trinidad), June 27: South Africa exorcised their agonising semifinal jinx through an exceptional spell of pace bowling as they walloped an emotionally drained Afghanistan by nine wickets to enter their firstever T20 World Cup final here.

However after the game South African skipper Aiden Markam stated that he is happy that they 'will not play on this pitch anymore' while Afghanistan coach Jonathan Trott termed it as 'unfit for a contest of this magnitude'.

Marco Jansen (3/16) Kagiso Rabada (2/14) and Anrich Nortje (2/7) ripped the soul out of the Afghanistan top-order while bundling them out for a paltry 56 in just 11.5 overs after being invited to bowl. Spinner Tabraiz Shamsi (3/6) also came to the party by demolishing the tail.

Despite the early departure of Quinton de Kock, bowled through the gate by impressive pacer Fazalhaq Farooqi, the Proteas had little trouble in reaching 60 for one in 8.5 overs Reeza Hendricks (29 n o) and

skipper Aiden Markram (23 n o) navigated them safely to the shores of victory as they finally freed themselves from the painful tag of chokers in global events.

Gukesh starts in positive fashion

Bucharest (Romania), June 27: Indian Grandmaster D Gukesh started off on a positive note, beating Deac Bogdan-Daniel of Romania in the first round of the Superbet Classic chess tournament here Thursday.

Set to challenge reigning World Champion Ding Liren of China later this year, Gukesh got a bit lucky in the middle game as both players missed a tactical nuance but the Indian emerged on top soon after to give his campaign a positive start in his first 'Classical' game since winning the Candidates tournament.

Wimbledon (England), June 27: Two-time Wimbledon champion Andy Murray still has not decided as of Thursday whether he will be able to compete at the grass court Grand Slam tournament which begins next week but his management company said 'he is

The 37-year-old Murray has indicated this is likely to be his last season on tour before retirement. He has been dealing with a series of injuries in 2024, and had a surgical procedure on his back over the weekend after stopping during a match at a tune-up event.

"Andy is recovering well from his surgery and has started training again," Murray's representatives said in a statement Thursday. "At this stage it is too soon to confirm for definite whether he will play Wimbledon, but he is working towards that and a final decision will be made as late as possible to give him the best chance of competing," the statement added. Play at the All England Club begins Monday. The draw to determine the singles brackets is Friday. Murray had planned to compete at Wimbledon and then the Paris Olympics, before retiring. He has won three major championships, twice at Wimbledon and once at the US Open and also has two Olympic gold medals in his kitty.

Chanu eyes +90kg snatch lift in Paris

New Delhi, June 27: Tokyo Olympics silver medallist weightlifter Mirabai Chanu, who is taking it easy since returning to action following a sixmonth injury lay-off, is targeting a lift of above 90kg in snatch in next month's Paris Games.

Chanu, who suffered hip tendonitis and finished fourth in the 49kg women's category in the last Asian Games, returned to competition with a lift of 184kgs (81kg snatch and 103kg clean and jerk) at the Phuket World Cup in April this year.

She knows that anything less than a 200kg total lift won't be enough to win a medal in Paris and she is working towards that with her long-time coach Vijay Kumar Sharma.

"The injury is fine, I have completely recovered from it but I am going slowly in training. In train-



ing now I am lifting 80-85 per cent in repetitions, I am not lifting 100 per cent till I am close to the Olympics," Chanu said Thursday

'So far 88kg in snatch and 119kg in clean and jerk are my best lifts, but my target is 90kgplus in snatch at Paris, and I will try my best," Chanu added. Chanu said that she will try her level best to win a medal in Paris.

"I will do what it takes and try to give my best performance to win a medal, but I can't predict the colour of the medal," Chanu said with a smile.

Georgia stun Portugal, in pre-quarters



Gelsenkirchen, June 27: Georgia secured a historic place in the knockout stages of Euro 2024 after a stunning 2-0 win over Portugal here Wednesday, while Turkey, Belgium, Romania and Slovakia all advanced to the last 16 as the group stage came to an end.

Appearing at their first European Championships, Georgia had to register their first-ever victory at the tournament to reach the last 16 when they played Portugal. The latter had already qualified for the last 16 as Group F winners, and their coach Roberto Martinez made eight changes to his team.

Georgia went ahead inside the opening two minutes thanks to a fine finish from their star player, Napoli winger Khvicha



Kvaratskhelia. Georges Mikautadze, who set up the goal, made it 2-0 from the penalty spot early in the second half to become the competition's top scorer on three.

It was a frustrating night for Portugal, who were denied on several occasions by Georgia's impressive goalkeeper Giorgi Mamardashvili. The 39-year-old Cristiano Ronaldo, who has a

Euros record tally of 14 goals, was left still waiting for his first at this year's competition.

Turkey finished second in the same group after a 2-1 win over the Czech Republic as their opponents were eliminated. Cenk Tosun's goal in stoppage time sealed the victory for Turkey, who had been playing with an extra man since the 20th-minute sending-off of Antonin Barak.

Sreeja targets **Olympics** glory

New Delhi, June 27: India's top-ranked women's table tennis player Sreeja Akula credits her enhanced mental and physical strength over the past two years for her stunning victories against higher-ranked players as she hopes to carry this momentum into the Paris Olympics.

Sreeja created history last week by becoming the first Indian table tennis player to win a WTT Contender singles title and Tuesday she became the country's top paddler with a careerhigh ranking of 24.

"For the last two years, I have been working a lot on improving my mental strength and I think that is the first aspect where I have improved, especially in 2024. I am mentally well-prepared to play against any opponent, whoever it is," Sreeja said.

"It's my debut Olympic Games but I think I am well prepared for the tournament. I just want to play my best," she added.

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
