# **GOVT RAISES GRATUITY LIMIT** TO ₹20 LAKH

Bhubaneswar, Oct 8: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday raised the gratuity limit for government employees from ₹15 lakh to ₹20 lakh.

"The raise applies to the Deathcum-Retirement Gratuity (DCRG) and is effective retroactively from January 1, 2024, for all regular state government employees," according to a statement from the Chief Minister's Office.

The decision follows requests from various service associations in the state for an increase in the DCRG ceiling.

The move aligns with the Central government's recent adjustment to the retirement and death gratuity under the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021, which also took effect from January 1, 2024

Chandigarh, Oct 8: Bucking antiincumbency, the ruling BJP pulled off a hat-trick of wins in Haryana to retain power and halt Congress' comeback attempt in the Assembly elections, results of which were announced Tuesday.

While the BJP ended up with its best-ever haul of 48 seats, 11 more than the Congress, parties like the JJP and the AAP were decimated and the INLD managed to win just two seats.

Proving wrong exit polls which predicted a comfortable Congress win, the BJP will be forming government in Haryana for the third consecutive term.

The party had contested 89 of the 90 seats. It did not contest Sirsa seat, from where its ally Gopal Kanda was a sitting MLA, though Kanda lost his seat.

The Congress also contested 89 seats leaving Bhiwani con-

stituency for the CPI (M). Three Independents also tasted

hat-trick win in Haryana by bagging 48 seats in the 90-member House, while the Congress had to be contended with 37 seats in the state polls results of which were declared Tuesday. On the other hand, people in J&K delivered a clear message to the saffron party by rejecting its plank of Article

*370* abrogation, and backed the NC-Congress combine which is now all set to form the government



Srinagar/Jammu, Oct 8: The INDIA bloc is poised to form the first elected government in Jammu and Kashmir, having secured a victory in the Assembly elections by securing 49 out of 90 seats on which polls were held for the first time since the abrogation of Article 370 five years ago.

The National Conference (NC), the oldest regional party in J&K, emerged as the clear frontrunner, winning 42 seats and falling just six seats short of a majority of its own.

Meanwhile, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) [CPI(M)] managed to secure the single seat allotted to it under the seat-sharing agreement, while the Congress party won six seats, with five of those in the Kashmir valley.

The elections in J&K virtually turned a nightmare for the Congress as it won only one seat in the Jammu region. The BJP also made notable gains, winning 29 seats -- its best performance in J&K to date, up from 25 seats in the 2014 elections.

Despite the defeat of J&K BJP president Ravindra Raina, the party's vote share increased from 23 per cent in 2014 to 25.64 per cent this year.

The AAP registered its first victory in Assembly elections when its candidate Mehraj Malik defeated his nearest rival from the BJP in Doda constituency by a margin of over 4,538 votes.

The NC saw a rise in its vote share as well, improving from 20.77 per cent in 2014 to 23.43 per cent this election cycle.

In contrast, the People's Democratic Party (PDP) experienced significant losses, winning only three seats compared to 28 in 2014 and witnessing its vote share drop from 22.67 per cent to just 8.87 per cent.

The Congress also faced a decline, securing only six seats -down from 12 seats a decade ago -- with a corresponding drop in vote share from 18 per cent to approximately 12 per cent.





#### Over 1cr women registered under Subhadra: Deputy CM BHUBANESWAR: Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida Tuesday said more than 1 crore women have registered themselves under Subhadra Yojana, a financial assistance scheme launched by the BJP government in the state. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had inaugurated the ambitious women-centric scheme September 17, and on that day, the first instalment of ₹5.000 was sent directly to the bank accounts of around 25.11 lakh beneficiaries. Subhadra Yojana, the financial assistance scheme named after the sister of Lord Jagannath, was one of the major promises made by the BJP for women in its election manifesto in Odisha. # **Tight security in twin** cities for Durga Puja

Bhubaneswar, Oct 8: The Commissionerate Police Tuesday made elaborate security and traffic arrangements to ensure smooth Durga Puja in the twin

According to the twin city police, Bhubaneswar and Cuttack will have 187 and 166 Durga Puja

pandals, respectively, this year. Ten additional DCPs or ASPs will be deployed to oversee the arrangements in the Capital city.

"As many as 22 deputy superintendents of police (DSPs), 45 inspectors, 200 sub-inspectors (SIs)/assistant sub-inspectors (ASIs), 35 traffic havildars and 85 training constables will be deployed to maintain law and order, and traffic flow during Durga Puja festivities under Bhubaneswar UPD," they said.

As many as 38 platoons of force, two Special Tactical Units (STUs), two ODRAF units, two units of bomb disposal squads and 10 points of static VHF among other personnel will be deployed.

Similarly, one SP, seven additional SPs, 39 DSPs or ACPs or Additional Commissioners, and 60 inspectors will oversee the security and traffic arrangements in Cuttack UPD.

"These apart, 350 SIs/ASIs, 55 havildars, 100 traffic constables, 64 platoons of force, two STUs, one ODRAF unit, one bomb disposal squad, 80 points of static VHF, 100 manpack sets, six platoons of CRPF, three platoons of RAF, one unit of anti-terror squad and 400 home guards are among those to be deployed in Cuttack,' they added.

Moreover, special arrangements have been made in civil cloth to prevent incidents of snatching, hooliganism, and other crimes like eve-teasing.

# SOP soon on behaviour with Defence personnel at PS

Cuttack, Oct 8: The state government Tuesday informed the Orissa High Court that the Home department will soon frame a standard operating procedure (SOP) on appropriate behaviour with Defence personnel at police stations.

This was conveyed through an affidavit by senior IPS officer Dayal Gangwar, who was previously instructed by the High Court to submit a report following a recent incident at Bharatpur police station in Bhubaneswar.

In early September, there was widespread outrage after an Army officer and his female

friend were allegedly assaulted by police officers inside Bharatpur police station when they went to lodge a complaint about a road rage incident.

During a hearing related to this matter, the High Court expressed concern over the violation of Supreme Court guidelines regarding installation of CCTVs at police stations.

In response, Gangwar appeared before the court and said measures were being taken to install CCTV cameras in all police stations across the state, with completion expected within 15 days. He also mentioned that the state government is working on two new video management systems (VMS) that would allow

the DGP and all 32 district police

chiefs to monitor CCTV footage

at police stations. The HC expressed satisfaction with the steps taken by the state government in relation to the incident involving the Army officer and adjourned the mat-

Meanwhile, the state government has instituted a Judicial Commission of Inquiry into the incident, transferred the police investigation to the Crime Branch and suspended at least five police personnel involved in the case.

# ML pioneers win Physics Nobel

Stockholm, Oct 8: Two pioneers of artificial intelligence (AI) – John Hopfield and Geoffrey Hinton - won the Nobel Prize in Physics Tuesday for helping create the building blocks of machine learning (ML) that is revolutionising the way we work and live but also creates new threats to humanity, one of the winners said. Hinton, who is known as

the Godfather of AI, is a citizen of Canada and Britain who works at the University of Toronto and Hopfield is an American working at Princeton. "This year's two Nobel

Laureates in Physics have used tools from Physics to develop methods that are the foundation of today's powerful machine learning," the Nobel committee said in a press release.

Ellen Moons, a member of the Nobel committee at the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, said the two laureates "used fundamental concepts from statistical physics to design artificial neural networks that function as associative memories and find patterns in large data sets." She said that such networks have been used to ad-



vance research in Physics and "have also become part of our daily lives, for instance in facial recognition and language translation.'

While the committee honoured the science behind ML and AI, Moons also mentioned its flipside, saying that 'while machine learning has enormous benefits. its rapid development has also raised concerns about our future. Collectively, humans carry the responsibility for using this new technology in a safe and ethical way for the great-

est benefit of humankind.' Hinton shares those concerns. He quit a role at Google so he could more freely speak about the dangers of the technology he helped create.

Tuesday, he said he was shocked at the honour.

"I'm flabbergasted. I had no idea this would happen," he said when reached by the Nobel committee on the phone. Hinton predicted that AI will end up having a 'huge influence' on civilization, bringing improvements in productivity and health care.

"It would be comparable with the Industrial Revolution," he said in the open call with reporters and the officials from the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences. "Instead of exceeding people in physical strength, it's going to exceed people in intellectual ability. We have no experience

of what it's like to have things

smarter than us. And it's

going to be wonderful in many respects," Hinton said. 'But we also have to worry about a number of possible bad consequences, particularly the threat of these things getting out of control." Six days of Nobel an-

nouncements opened Monday with Americans Victor Ambros and Gary Ruvkun winning the medicine prize for their discovery of tiny bits of genetic material that serve as on and off switches inside cells that help control what the cells do and when they do it. If scientists can better understand how they work and how to manipulate them, it could one day lead to powerful treatments for

diseases like cancer. The Physics prize carries a cash award of 11 million Swedish Kronor (USD 1 million) from a bequest left by the award's creator, Swedish inventor Alfred Nobel. The laureates are invited to receive their awards at ceremonies December 10, the anniversary of Nobel's death.

Nobel announcements will continue with the chemistry prize Wednesday and literature Thursday. The Nobel Peace Prize will be announced Friday and the economics award October 14.

Barbil, Oct 8: The court of Judicial Magistrate of First Class (JMFC) here in Keonjhar district granted conditional bail Tuesday to Anuprash Mohanty, the brother of actor and former MP Anubhav Mohanty after he surrendered on the direction of Orissa High Court in a cheque bounce case, Tuesday.

# Life term for wife killer

Keonjhar, Oct 8: District sessions judge Ashok Kumar Panda Tuesday sentenced a man to life imprisonment after convicting him of killing his wife brutally.

The convict was identified as Dilip Bentkar, 44, of Gopinathpur Sahi in Raisuan under Sadar block and the deceased as Sabita Bentkar, 38, his wife. The court has also slapped a penalty of Rs 5,000 on him, apart from the punishment. In case of defaulting on payment of penalty, the convict has to undergo an additional one month of rigorous imprisonment, the judge observed while delivering the order.

The court also directed the district legal services authority (DLSA) to provide financial assistance to the three children who have been abandoned and orphaned after the death of their mother while father would be in jail, public prosecutor Pradeep Kumar Das said. The judged pronounced the order after examining the statements of 11 witnesses, three eve-witnesses and the final chargesheet submitted by the police in the case, the public prosecutor said.

According to the case diary, the incident occurred when Dilip Bentkar beat up his wife Sabita Bentkar following a heated arguement over a domestic dispute January 6, 2021 evening. Enraged Dilip killed Sabita by hitting her head with a brick near the puja mandap in the village. On receiving a complaint from the deceased's brother Madhusudan Bentkar, police registered a murder case and arrested Dilip, who was then lodged in Keonjhar district jail.

# **Mixed Fortunes**

he National Conference-Congress alliance will form the government after winning a comfortable majority in the Jammu and Kashmir elections, while the BJP defied all pollsters and bounced back in Haryana creating history of sorts by retaining power for the third consecutive time. The election results declared 8 October come as a morale booster for the BJP whose confidence was low after failing to secure even the basic 272 seats in the recent Lok Sabha polls. This makes the party to be so jubilant that Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who has been maintaining a low profile since the loss of face in the general elections, celebrated the victory by addressing party workers at the BJP headquarters in an apparent show of return of confidence. But, despite the victory in Haryana, the BJP has suffered a major setback in Jammu and Kashmir after having abrogated Article 370. This was  $\,$ an integral part of the BJP's original favourite political agenda. But, all its efforts to dismember the state and establish its control over it have met with resounding failure exemplified in the day's election outcome. The National Conference, known as the largest pro India regional party, has formed an alliance with the Congress and made restoration of J&K's status that existed before the repeal of Article 370 its main poll plank. That battle cry seems to have yielded handsome dividends in the Valley. The BJP win in the Jammu region was entirely

It was an irony of fate that the Congress had begun celebration in the morning expecting victory in Haryana after early trends showed it was doing well. As the day progressed, it became clear that the BJP was all set to retain power for a historic third term in a row. Despite forecasts of a sweeping victory for the Congress, the BJP was on the way to improving its 2019 performance, when it secured 40 seats in alliance with the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP).

It was over-confidence and infighting that proved the Congress' undoing in Haryana. Its better performance in the LS polls and the BJP top leadership going on the backfoot since then infused so much false hope and confidence in the Congress that the state leadership decided not to accommodate other Opposition parties including the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). The bloated ego of its leadership was so obvious that it eroded people's faith. The refusal of the state unit to enter into a seat sharing arrangement with the AAP as favoured by Rahul Gandhi eventually split anti-BJP votes. The internal dissension in the Congress also

On the other hand, the BJP went ahead with its task of consolidating its voter base silently and relentlessly polarising votes between the Jats accounting for about 25 per cent of the state's population and non-Jats and OBC voters constituting 75 per cent of the people. It was virtually a do or die for the BJP to refurbish the image of the party and its mascot PM Modi after the Lok Sabha polls. It pulled out all stops to win the election holding nearly 50 rallies, many of which addressed by the PM and Union Home Minister Amit Shah, against the Congress'

It was a much needed victory in Haryana for the BJP that is likely to rejuvenate the party rank and file in the ensuing crucial Assembly elections in Maharashtra. The defeat in Jammu and Kashmir will, however, be the bitterest pill it will have to swallow. Time will tell whether the NC-Congress can achieve its goals in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir where the Lt Governor holds great powers vested in him by the Constitution to put roadblocks to the plans of the ruling

Results of these two states should convince the BJP top leadership that their 'One Nation One Vote' idea might not be all that bright. Any ruling party might have temporary setbacks but it also needs intermittent morale boosters to hold the cadres together. Multiple elections may well be the only method to put healing balm on defeated organizations.

# THE POSTAL EVOLUTION

THE GLOBAL **BOOM IN ONLINE RETAIL EXPECTED TO GENERATE \$6.3 TRILLION IN SALES BY 2024, HAS CREATED IMMENSE DEMAND FOR PARCEL DELIVERY SERVICES** 

s the Universal Postal Union (UPU) celebrates 150 years of existence on 9 October, its Director General, Masahiko Metoki, emphasised the organisation's enduring mission: connecting people through reliable postal services. Despite significant transformations in communication and logistics, postal networks continue to play a vital role, but face unprecedented challenges in today's digital world. From the first letter that travelled across borders to today's complex global logistics network, the postal systems worldwide are striving hard to stay relevant in an era dominated by digital technology and rapid e-commerce growth. It is clear that traditional postal services are at a turning point. Physical mail volumes, once the foundation of postal revenue, have plummeted across the globe. The decline in letter mail-accelerated by the rise of digital communication technologies like email and instant messaging-has led to a fundamental shift in how postal networks operate. According to UPU reports, global mail volumes have dropped by over 45% since 2007, as consumers and businesses move away from paper communication. Yet, as Metoki pointed out in his anniversary address, postal networks are not obsolete; they are evolving. The challenge now lies in reimagining their role to meet modern needs.

Illustratively, India Post, the largest postal network in the world having its extensive network of over 1.65 lakh post offices, has experienced this decline firsthand. In the early 2000s, India Post handled nearly 16 billion pieces of mail annually. By 2021, that number had fallen below 3 billion, a stark reflection of the digital age. Recognising the need to adapt, India Post has embraced digital banking, e-commerce partnerships, and online service platforms. Its India Post Payments Bank (IPPB) offers digital financial services, reaching even the remotest parts of the country. With introduction of Core Banking Solution having eBanking, Mobile Banking, ATM, ePass Book, ECS facility

and Inter-operability through NEFT, India Post has digitised the Post Office Small Savings Scheme. India Post has also launched parcel tracking systems and online platforms like Dak Mitra, enabling customers to book parcels, track shipments, and access postal services from their mobile devices. Facilities like Real Time Delivery Updation, electronic clearance of letter boxes, Automated Mail Processing Centres, Radio Frequency Identification, Click N Book etc. have accelerated the digital movement of mail services of India Post. In India, the growth of platforms like Flipkart and Amazon has been a boon for India Post, which has become a vital partner in last-mile delivery, particularly in rural and semi-urban areas. As a result, parcel volumes at India Post have surged, increasing by 33% in 2021 as more people shop online. The same story is playing out

across the world. The United States Postal Service (USPS), which once relied heavily on traditional mail, has seen mail volumes decline by 28% between 2007 and 2020. However, parcel volumes have skyrocketed, increasing by 110% in the same period. This shift, driven by the rapid expansion of e-commerce, presents an opportunity for USPS to reinvent itself as a logistics powerhouse. Innovations such as the "Informed Delivery

service, which allows customers to digitally preview their incoming mail, have helped USPS remain relevant in the digital age. The rise of online shopping has caused parcel volumes of Royal Mail to increase by 31% in 2021, while letter volumes declined by 20%. To cope with this shift, Royal Mail has heavily invested in automation and digital services. Japan Post has also felt the pressure of declining traditional services with decrease by 10% annually since 2016, leading the postal service to focus on the growing e-commerce sector. Japan Post has partnered with major e-commerce platforms like Rakuten to streamline logistics and expand its parcel delivery services. Cutting-edge robotic sorting systems and digital platforms have been introduced to increase efficiency, signalling a strong commitment to modernisation. Similar efforts are being made by postal networks like La Poste in France and Swiss Post, both of which have expanded their digital banking services to keep pace with the demand for online financial services. This move aligns with the UPU's vision of postal networks serving as key drivers of digital inclusion.

The global boom in online retail, expected to generate \$6.3 trillion in sales by 2024, has created immense demand for parcel delivery services. As a result, parcels now account for over

60% of postal revenue world wide, a dramatic shift from just 20% two decades ago. This transformation reflects the evolving role of postal networks, from communication enablers to logistics giants.

Despite these encouraging developments, postal networks face significant challenges in adapting to the digital age. The shift from physical to digital communication has eroded the core revenue of many postal services, forcing them to invest heavily in new technologies. automation, and workforce train ing. The competition from private logistics companies and tech giants further complicates the situation, as they often have more resources and flexibility to adapt quickly. Nevertheless, the opportunities for postal networks in the digital age are immense. As e-commerce continues to grow, the demand for efficient and reliable logistics services will only increase. Postal systems, with their established infrastructure and trusted brands, are well-positioned to seize this opportunity. By embracing digital innovation, focusing on customer-centric solutions, and expanding their service offerings, postal networks can continue to play a vital role in global trade and communication.

Reflecting on the UPU's 150year journey, Director General Masahiko Metoki highlighted the resilience and adaptability of postal systems worldwide. The challenges facing postal services today are significant, but the potential for transformation is equally great. Postal networks are no longer just about delivering letters; they are evolving into comprehensive service providers, offering everything from financial services to digital solutions. As the UPU marks this milestone anniversary, the future of the postal network lies in its ability to continue connecting people, not just through physical mail but through digital platforms that meet the needs of a rapidly changing world.

eing sick and having to call off work is never fun, even when you're sick during the World Cup. It's better to be healthy, show up for work and watch the matches on your phone.

But what happens when you've called off sick and you hear a knock on your door? Do you answer it?

I never do. If I'm lying in bed, trying to get some rest, the last thing I need is to have a conversation with a stranger at my door. But what if it's my boss checking up on me?

Well, he would never do that. And if he did, I'd be pretty upset. If my boss showed up at my doorstep, he'd be crossing the work-home boundary, and I'd have no choice but to ask him to

GTFO (go to fancy office). Thankfully, this is not a scenario I'll have to encounter because I do not work for Elon Musk, the richest man in the world, Musk, CEO of Tesla and SpaceX and owner of X, does not believe in workers' rights, so it shouldn't be surprising to hear what's happening at Tesla's gigafactory in Germany. According to German media, bosses have visited the homes of at least 30 employees to make sure they were really sick.

'We wanted to appeal to the work ethic of the workforce,' André Thierig, manager of the gigafactory, told DPA, the German press agency.

The factory employs 12,000 people, but this past August, the rate of people calling off sick was 17 per cent, much higher than the 5 per cent average in Germany's auto industry. Thierig and other bosses were concerned that workers were exploiting the German social system, which gives workers up to six weeks of paid sick leave. (No wonder so many people are immigrating

to Germany.) So what happened when Tesla managers visited the houses of absent employees? According to the German newspaper Handelsblatt, some employees slammed doors on them and threatened to call the police. I don't know what the nolice could have done.

Employee: "Officer, I'd like to report my boss for visiting me while I'm sick.'

Officer: "You have a boss who cares enough to visit you while you're sick? That's not a crime.'

Employee: "But he didn't bring flowers and a 'get well' card. He brought a thermometer to take my temperature!

It's not just Tesla that subjects its sick employees to extra surveillance. On a Reddit forum, employees in India responded to the Tesla news by sharing stories of skeptical bosses. "I just remember when I fell down stairs and sprained my ankles badly," one person wrote. "I was advised (to wear) a cast for two weeks and took leave for the same time. I was forced to submit photos of my cast, although I had submitted the doctor's note." (At least the boss how a friend who worked for a Hyderabad firm was once admitted to the hospital for heat stroke and hooked to an IV for fluids. "The guy couldn't even open his eyes properly," the user wrote. "His manager and another senior from the office visited him in the hospital and they had the

# 75 quick response vehicles to tackle fires

Prayagraj (UP), Oct 8: Seventy five quick response vehicles, with fire-extinguishing capacities 20 times more effective than normal vehicles, will be used for the first time to tackle fire incidents during the Maha Kumbh Mela in January 2025.

Director General of Police (DGP) (Fire) Avinash Chandra said these small-sized vehicles, with a capacity of one ton, can easily access narrow areas.

Though equipped with a 100 litre tank, it can extinguish a raging fire that would normally require 2,000 litres of water, Chandra said.

Additionally, the vehicles will be equipped with tools for breaking, cutting, lifting, drilling and

first aid, he said. The DGP said that fire fighting boats, stationed in the Sangam area, will also be deployed for the first time.

These boats can extinguish fires up to 300 to 400 metres using river water, especially if there is a fire in the tents located along the river bank, Candra said.

'The department is purchasing six such boats. Along with this, all-terrain fire fighting vehicles capable of moving on sand



will also be used," he added. He said that this time 135 fire fighting motorcycles have been

purchased for the Maha Kumbh Mela which will also be deployed of 2 to 3 minutes. That is, the work of extinguishing the fire should start within two to three minutes of the fire breaking out," Chandra said.

He said that preventive measures are also being taken to avoid fire incidents, for which the Fire department will coordinate with the Electricity department from the very beginning.

Personnel from the Fire department will be involved during the electrification of the tents and an inspection team will ensure that the electrical work has been done properly, he

Fifty fire stations and 20 temporary fire posts are being set up for the event, along with 50 watch towers, from which any smoke sightings will be immediately reported to the control room, he said.

### **UP GOVT LAUNCHES 'KUMBH SUMMIT'**

In the run-up to the Maha Kumbh scheduled to be held in Prayagraj next year, the Uttar Pradesh government Tuesday launched a 'Kumbh Summit' to be held across all 18 divisions of the state. The event commenced in Lucknow and will conclude in Prayagrai December 14. Held every 12 years, the Maha Kumbh is scheduled to take place from January 14 to February 26, 2025. Speaking to reporters here, Tourism and Culture Minister Jaiveer Singh said the summit will feature a wide array of events, including 'Bal-Yuva' Kumbh, 'Kala-Sanskriti Kumbh, 'Kavi' Kumbh, and 'Bhakti' Kumbh, Local artists and schoolchildren from across the state will participate in the summit which will provide them a platform to showcase their talents and engage in the cultural celebrations. Singh said the Secondary and Higher Education departments are coordinating to make the schoolchildren aware of the traditions of Kumbh. As part of the summit, a roadshow titled 'Kumbh Abhinandan' started from the GPO Park in Lucknow and would culminate at Marine Drive in the evening after travelling through Gomti Ghat via Sikandar Bagh Marg. While the Lalit Kala Akademi will oversee the painting and photography competitions to be held during the summit, the Uttar Pradesh Sangeet Natak Akademi will handle the music and dance competitions. Cultural and spiritual heritage exhibitions will be organised by the state Archaeology Department, UP State Archives, and UP Museum Directorate as part of the summit. Similarly, the Bharatendu Natya Academy will host drama competitions, while the Tribal and Folk Art Culture Institute will hold folk art and rangoli competitions. A quiz will also be held on the cultural and spiritual significance of Maha Kumbh. In Varanasi, the summit will be held at the Banaras Hindu University October 14-15, while it will conclude at the North Central Zone Cultural Centre in Prayagraj December 14.

# Rescued mountaineers endure 72 hours of hunger, cold

A French mountaineering team on a separate expedition to the same peak helped locate Dvoark and Manners by providing coordinates to the rescue team

New Delhi, Oct 8: Just a few hundred meters from realising their dream of conquering the formidable Chaukhamba III peak in Uttarakhand's Chamoli, mountaineers Michelle Theresa Dvorak from the USA and Fay Jane Manners from the UK found themselves stranded at 6,015 metres after their climbing gear plunged into a gorge.

With almost no food or water, the duo endured two nights and three days in harsh conditions before being rescued. "We ate our only energy bar on the first day. After that, there was nothing," a visibly dehydrated Dvorak recalled.

The rescue mission, which began with the efforts of the



Indian Air Force (IAF) and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) of Uttarakhand, was a race against time. Dense fog and adverse weather conditions only intensified the challenge.

A French mountaineering team on a separate expedition to the same peak helped locate Dvoark and Manners by providing coordinates to the rescue team. Their input proved crucial to the

success of the operation. On the second day of their ordeal, Dvoark and Manners managed to scrape together dehydrated food and mixed it with ice. "Without a stove and water: it was challenging to survive," Manners said. "Immediately after we lost the bag, we realised that going further up or down was not possible. We had to wait for help."

"It has been our dream to set a record by climbing the Chaukhamba peak which is known for its steep terrain. Unfortunately, we were stranded and had to return from just a few hundred metres from our

destination," Dvorak said. Pinning hopes on rescue to come sooner or later, they waited in the freezing conditions of the mountain, believed to be one of the steepest climbs.

"Twice, we saw helicopters passing overhead, searching for

us. We shouted and jumped, hoping they would see us, but they passed by. It made us feel like the rescue was slipping away,'

Manners recalled. At night, they shared a single sleeping bag to keep warm and survive the unforgiving cold. The temperature would drop to minus 15 degrees Celsius. "We fought hypothermia," they said.

"As experienced mountaineers, we were not scared at first. We knew our skills would help us fight to survive, but as time passed,

tension gripped us." Dvorak added. The joint rescue operation, carried out by trained mountaineers from the Nehru Institute of Mountaineering and supported by IAF helicopters, culminated in their safe evacuation on the morning of October 6.

When help finally arrived, Dvorak described the moment as surreal. "It felt overwhelming. I rarely cry, but I had tears in my eyes," she said.

At night, as they lay down against the vast white mountains under an endless starry sky, Dvorak thought of her family. "It pained my heart to think of the worst," she recalled.

Despite the ordeal, both women remained optimistic after the rescue. With smiles on their faces, they shared their first wish - to enjoy their favourite Indian dishes before heading home. "As women mountaineers,

we do not want our experience to discourage people from trying this sport, especially women travellers. This kind of situation can happen anywhere to anyone, but it should not stop you from experiencing the beauty of the mountains," Dvorak said.

Hyderabad, Oct 8: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) Tuesday questioned former Indian cricket team captain and Congress leader Mohammed Azharuddin in a money laundering case linked to alleged financial irregularities in the Hyderabad Cricket Association,

official sources said. The federal agency recorded his statement under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said. The 61year-old former Member of Parliament was first asked to depose before the agency October 3 but he sought deferment of the notice and asked for a fresh date



The agency subsequently issued him fresh summons to appear October 8. Dressed in a white kurta-pyjama, Azharuddin reached the ED office on Fateh Maidan Road around 11 am. He was accompanied by his legal team.

The ED had conducted searches in connection with the irregularities in November last vear. Azharuddin's role during his tenure as the HCA president is under the scanner of the agency, the sources had said.

There was no immediate response from the former Indian skipper. who unsuccessfully contested the Telangana Assembly polls held last year.

# Men, women need different foods for breakfast: Study

New Delhi, Oct 8: For losing weight, breakfasts should be high-carb for men and high-fat for women, suggested researchers, who created mathematical models depicting men's and women's metabolisms.

They showed that metabolic processes in men responded better to a meal high on carbohydrates like oats and grains, while those in women responded better to a meal high on fat such as omelettes and avocados.

While men are known to derive energy from metabolism of carbohydrates, women are known to obtain energy from metabolism of fat, resulting in significant sex-specific differences across metabolic states such as fasting and feeding.



"Since women have more body fat on average than men, you would think that they would burn less fat for energy, but they don't," said Anita Layton, a professor of applied mathematics,

University of Waterloo, Canada and co-author of the study published in the journal Computers in Biology and Medicine.

"The results of the model suggest that women store more fat immediately after a meal but also burn more fat during a fast,' Layton said. For their analysis, the researchers used techniques of computational biology -- it makes use of computers and statistics to understand biological systems.

The team created a model depicting human food intake and comprising varied parts of one's body -- adipose tissue (body tissue containing stored fat) and organs such as liver, heart and brain.

They also modelled the metabolic response to consuming meals containing both carbohydrates and fat immediately after eating and during shortterm fasting. The model was tailored to represent the metabolic state of a healthy young adult man or woman.

C-Voter-India Today exit polls had pegged the Congress at 50-58 seats and the BJP at 20-28, the Republic Bharat-Matrize had predicted 55-62 seats for the Congress and 18-24 for the BJP. As the results trickled in, the BJP had won 48 seats in the 90member Assembly, while the Congress was restricted

The C-Voter-India Today exit poll had given 40-48 seats to the National Conference-Congress alliance, with the regional outfit getting 33 seats, and the BJP was forecast to win 27-32 seats. The Republic-Gulistan poll had given 28-30 seats to the National Conference, 3-6 seats to the Congress, and 28-30 seats to the BJP. The Peoples' Pulse had predicted 33-35 seats to the National Conference, 13-15 seats to the BJP. The actual results had the National Conference winning 42 seats, while the Congress managed to win six seats. The CPI (M), also a part of the alliance, emerged victorious in one seat.

Alleging a conspiracy, the Opposition party said that in Harvana "democracy had lost and establishment had won". Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said the result of Haryana was unexpected and the party is assessing the public mandate.

"We thank the people of rvana for voting for the Congress party. Our hardworking workers need not feel disappointed. Our fight against dictatorship is a long one," he added.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here along with AICC media and publicity department head Pawan Khera, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said, "Serious questions have been raised by our candidates. We will bring it to the notice of the Election Commission.'

Ramesh said the results in Haryana are "totally unexpected, counter-intuitive". They go against ground reality, against what the people of Haryana had made their mind up for which was for change and transformation, he added.

Khera alleged that complaints had been received from Hisar. Mahendragarh and Panipat that there were electronic voting machines (EVMs) with 99 per cent battery on which the BJP won while units with 60-70 per cent battery saw the Congress win.

"There are serious questions about the instruments of the system, namely the EVMs and also the extraordinary pressure on local administration officials. It is a double engine pressure of the state government and the Centre.

"There was an environment in which people have lost by 200 votes, 300 votes, 50 votes, people who had healthy lead ing margins have ended up losing by 100-200 votes. This can be explained only by manipulation and pressure," Ramesh said.

But the pint-sized dynamo from Charkhi Dadri won the day, no small feat and a victory she will savour for a long time.

The former grappler is living a life so engrossing it wouldn't be a surprise if she soon becomes an inspiration for a mega-budget Bollywood biopic. A little over a month ago, she did what many had been expecting for months, embraced politics



as a Congress candidate from Julana for the Haryana Assembly polls. The party was tipped to uproot the rul-

ing BJP, which was facing 10 years of anti-incumbency. That hasn't happened of course with the BJP winning or ahead

in 48 of the 90 seats and the Congress trailing at 37. None of it has been easy. But Phogat hasn't known it any other way ever since she was a child. How could she, when life just wouldn't give

She endured the pain of losing her father as a nine-year-old, and found solace in wrestling, a sport that almost broke her physically and mentally before she finally gave up, conceding that she couldn't fight it anymore. By withdrawing from the mat, she saved the fight for a different turf and this time, Phogat managed to turn the corner.

From disqualification for being 100gm over ahead of her 50kg Olympic final, she is now a winning heavyweight in the political arena.

The tears she shed mourning the heartbreak in Paris long made way for a radiant smile as she campaigned through the length and breadth of Julana, assuring people that she was going to be their steady companion.

That smile widened into a grin as results came out. She had rallied, not for the first time in her life, to beat competition.

It was a far cry from the broken and battered woman who saw her sporting dreams perish in Paris. But she would always be counted among India's finest athletes never to have medalled at an Olympics.

# Hezbollah leader's successors killed: Israel

Hashem Safieddine, Nasrallah's successor, has not been heard from publicly since another airstrike last week

Jerusalem, Oct 8: Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Tuesday Israeli airstrikes had killed two successors to Hezbollah's slain leader, as Israel expanded its offensive against the Iran-backed group with a fourth army division deployed into south Lebanon.

"We've degraded Hezbollah's capabilities. We took out thousands of terrorists, including (Hassan) Nasrallah himself and Nasrallah's replacement, and the replacement of the replacement," Netanyahu said, without naming the latter two.

Earlier Tuesday, Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant said Hashem Safieddine, the man expected to succeed Nasrallah, had probably been "eliminated". It was not immediately clear whom Netanyahu meant by the "replacement of the replacement".

Safieddine has not been heard from publicly since another airstrike late last week, part of an escalating Israeli offensive after a year of border clashes with a major foe that has been clashing with Israel along the border in support of Palestinian militants fighting Israel in Gaza.

London, Oct 8: Britain is facing a "staggering rise" in attempts at assassination, sabotage and other crimes on UK soil by Russia and Iran, as the two states recruit criminals to "do their dirty work," the head of the UK's domestic intelligence agency said Tuesday.

Director MI5General McCallum said his agents and police have tackled 20 "potentially lethal" plots backed by Iran since 2022 and warned that it could expand its targets in the UK if conflicts in the Middle East deepen.

The spy chief said if the crisis escalates with Israel launching a major attack in response to Iran's re-

cent missile barrage, there is the risk "of an increase in, or broadening of, Iranian state aggression in the UK"

In a rare public speech setting out the major threats to the UK from both states and militant groups, McCallum argued that hostile states, radicalized individuals and a revived Islamic State group have combined to create "the most complex and interconnected threat environment we've ever seen.

McCallum said there also is a risk that Israel's conflicts with Iran-backed militant groups, Hamas in Gaza, Hezbollah in

Lebanon and the Houthis in Yemen, could trigger attacks in the UK, though so far the crisis has not translated "at scale into

terrorist violence" in Britain. The number of state-threat investigations undertaken by MI5 has risen by 48% in the past year, with Iran, Russia and China the main perpetrators, McCallum told journalists at the UK's counterterrorism command

In May, Sweden's domestic security agency accused Iran of using criminal networks to target Israeli or Jewish interests in the Scandinavian country.

# Philippines, China trade blame in latest SCS spat

Beijing, Oct 8: The Philippines accused China's coast guard Tuesday of firing water cannon at government ships taking supplies to fishermen at a disputed shoal in the South China Sea, but Beijing said its "control measures" followed the boats intrusions in its waters.

The incident was the two countries' latest run-in regarding the Scarborough shoal, a fishing ground within the Philippines' exclusive economic zone that China claims as its territory. "We urge the Philippines to im-

mediately cease its violations,' Liu Dejun, a spokesperson for China's coast guard, said in a statement. Two Philippine ships "invaded the waters" near Scarborough Shoal, it added, prompting what the Chinese side called "control measures". The Philippine fisheries bu-

reau said its vessels were on a routine mission to resupply fishermen when three Chinese coast guard (CCG) ships and a People's Liberation Army-Navy vessel approached at close distance and shadowed their movement.

"The CCG vessels attempted to impede the mission but were unsuccessful," it said in a statement. "The CCG vessels also opened and directed their water cannons, but this failed to reach the Philippine civilian boats."

The Philippine vessels were the Datu Cabaylo and the Datu Sunday, it added.

### **UK sanctions Russia for** using chemical weapons

LONDON: The UK government has said new sanctions have been imposed against Russian troops involved in the use of "inhumane" chemical weapons on the battlefield in Ukraine, in flagrant disregard for the Chemical Weapons Convention and serious violation of international law. The UK government imposed the sanctions Tuesday. Among those sanctioned include the Radiological, Chemical and Biological Defence (CBR) Troops of the Russian Armed Forces and its leader Igor Kirillov, responsible for helping deploy the "barbaric weapons". The UK's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) said Kirillov has also been a significant mouthpiece for Kremlin disinformation, spreading lies to mask Russia's shameful and dangerous behaviour. "The UK will not sit idly by whilst (Russian President) Putin and his mafia state ride roughshod over international law, including the Chemical Weapons Convention. I have made it my personal missior to challenge this malign activity, and I will not back down," said UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy

## SL min defends govt's move to allow Chinese military ship

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka's newly-appointed Foreign Minister Vijitha Herath Tuesday defended the government's move to allow a Chinese military training ship to arrive in Colombo, saying the decision falls within the framework of the country's diplomatic engagements and such visits "pose no threat". He was responding to a question on the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) Navy training warship "Po Lang" which arrived at the port of Colombo Tuesday "as part of an ocean-going voyage aimed at enhancing the professional capabilities of midshipmen and conducting naval exchanges with other countries," said a statement. Herath, also the Cabinet Spokesman, said Sri Lanka maintains balanced diplomatic relations with all countries. He said the government's decision to allow the Chinese military training vessel to visit Sri Lanka falls within the framework of the country's diplomatic engagements. "We are happy to allow military training ships. They pose no threat," Herath said. "We have seen military ships arriving from Germany and the US".

# Osama bin Laden's son ordered to leave France

Paris, Oct 8: French authorities have ordered Omar bin Laden, a son of dead Al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden, to leave the country over posts on social media. France's interior minister announced Tuesday.

Born in Saudi Arabia, where he spent his early years, Omar bin Laden, 43, has also lived in Sudan and Afghanistan. He left his father at the age of 19 and eventually settled in Normandy in northern France in 2016, taking up painting.

France's new interior minister, Bruno Retailleau, said on X (former Twitter) that Omar bin Laden had lived in the depart-



ment of Orne in Normandy as a spouse of a British national. The minister said that the ji-

hadist's son "posted comments on his social networks in 2023 that advocated terrorism.'

"As a result, the prefect of Orne issued an order to leave French territory," Retailleau said. "The courts have confirmed the legality of this decision taken in the interests of national security," he added.

Paris, Oct 8: Deforestation continued last year at a rate far beyond pledges to end the practice by 2030, according to a major study published Tuesday. Forests nearly the size of

Ireland were lost in 2023, according to two dozen research organisations, NGOs and advocacy groups, with 15.7 million acres of trees felled and burned.

This "significantly exceeded" level that would have kept the world on track to eliminate deforestation by the end of the decade, a commitment made in 2021 by more than 140 leaders.

Forests are home to 80 percent of the world's terrestrial plant and animal species and crucial for regulating water cycles and sequestering CO2, the main greenhouse gas responsi-

ble for global warming. "Globally, deforestation has gotten worse, not better, since

the beginning of the decade," said Ivan Palmegiani, a biodiversity and land use consultant at Climate Focus and lead author of the "Forest Declaration Assessment" report. "We're only six years away





# AMCs look to launch higher risk products



Mumbai, Oct 8: Top Indian and global asset managers are firming up plans to launch higher risk investment products, after the country's markets regulator allowed fund houses to offer investors such options.

Last month, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) allowed asset management firms to offer riskier strategies, such as long-short equity and derivativebased plans. These options will require a minimum investment of 1 million rupees (\$11,939.59) and will be offered to investors who can take on higher risk.

Five asset managers, which hold a combined 25% of assets under management (AUM) in India's mutual fund industry, said they expect to launch such investment options in the next six-eight months, according to executives at these firms.

"We have three-four strategies in the works and will figure out which is best suited basis market feedback. Strategies such as long-short equity are in discussion," said Swarup Mohanty, CEO of Mirae Asset Investment Managers, a unit of South Korea's Mirae Asset Financial Group.

Presently, alternate invest-

ment funds (AIF) offer such higher risk investment plans but the minimum investment size is 10 million rupees. These funds are subject to fewer regulatory requirements.

The new investment options offered by mutual funds will be similar to those offered by hedge funds, but will still need to follow strict risk disclosure requirements and investment limits.

Derivatives exposure has to be limited to 25% of the fund's assets, SEBI said last month. The regulator is yet to an-

nounce final guidelines for investment caps and risk disclo-The global hedge fund mar-

ket was estimated at \$5 trillion in 2023, according to Global Markets Insights. As of April 2024, portfolio

managers in India managed 33.65 trillion rupees in assets and AIFs managed 11.3 trillion rupees.

# Hyundai to launch \$3bln IPO next week

New Delhi/Hong Kong, Oct 8: Hyundai Motor India's IPO will open next week for subscriptions and will likely be priced in the range of 1,865 to 1,960 rupees (\$22 to \$23) per share, sources said Tuesday, valuing the automaker at up to \$19 billion in the country's biggest stock offering this year.

The India IPO will be Hyundai's first stock market listing outside South Korea. In India, it will also mark the first carmaker to go public in two decades since Maruti Suzuki in 2003, and comes just after Indian stock markets touched record highs and saw many companies making debuts.

The \$3 billion IPO will open for subscriptions for big institutional investors on Oct. 14, and invite bids from retail and other categories during Oct. 15-17, said three sources with direct knowledge, who declined to be named as the discussions are confi-

At the upper end of the price band, the company will roughly be valued at \$19 billion, the sources said, adding the stock is set to start trading in Mumbai

Hyundai did not immediately

respond to Reuters queries. Hvundai is India's second largest automaker after Maruti and is looking to reclaim market share from domestic rivals by expanding its SUV lineup. It also plans to launch its first Indiamade electric vehicle early next vear and introduce at least two gasoline-powered models tailored to the market starting in 2026.

Hyundai will not issue new shares in the IPO which will involve its South Korean parent selling up to 17.5% of its stake in the wholly owned unit to retail and other investors via a so-called "offer for sale" route.

New Delhi, Oct 8: Leading FMCG players expect rising palm oil prices, higher input costs and increased advertising and promotion expenses to impact their margins and profits in the September quarter.

In the latest quarterly business updates. FMCG players such as Godrei Consumer Products Ltd (GCPL), Dabur and Marico have hinted at a flattish growth in their margins on a year-on-year basis as prices of copra and vegetable oil appreciated in the July-September pe-

Godrej Industries Group's FMCG arm GCPL said it expects a 'flattish' earnings growth in the domestic market in the September quarter as higher palm oil prices added to input

"Palm input costs have been rising since March and have risen in the high teens as of date. Management has decided not to pass on the entire cost hike to consumers in one step and decided to continue investments on the long-term growth initiatives like rural van programme, new category development etc," it said.

"As a result, the standalone EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization) growth will be flattish," said GCPL which owns brands such as Good Knight, Cinthol and HIT.

However, in terms of top-line the company expects its standalone business (domestic) "to perform well with high singledigit underlying volume and

value growth", GCPL said. Marico said among key inputs, copra prices rose ahead of internal forecasts and the recent import duty hike led to vegetable oil prices moving higher towards the end of the quarter.

"Crude oil derivatives, however, remained range-bound. We expect gross margin to moderate on a year-on-year basis owing to partial absorption of higher input costs, as the company prioritised expanding its consumer franchise in the current demand environment," said Marico which owns popular brands like Saffola, Parachute, Livon etc.

further "Consequently, we expect a moderate lag in operating profit growth vis-à-vis revenue growth on a year-on-year basis.'

Dabur is working to correct the distributor inventory and on account of this, the company is expected to post a mid-singledigit decline in consolidated revenue for the quarter.

Moreover, the company which owns brands such as Dabur Amla, Dabur Vatika, and juice brand Real, has increased its spending on advertising.

"In line with our commitment to continue to invest behind our brands, the A&P investments continued during the quarter. However, as a result of lower primary sales, our profitability will be impacted during the quarter and the operating margin for the quarter is expected to decline in the range of mid to high teens due to deleveraging and continued investment behind brands," it said.

This temporary corrective action is a necessary step to strengthen the GT channel and enhance our efficiency and growth going forward, Dabur

Besides, FMCG companies have reported a rise in sales from alternate channels.

In the second quarter, edible oil maior Adani Wilmar's revenue from alternate channels increased at a strong doubledigit rate YoY, with revenue over the past 12 months exceeding ₹3,000 crore. "The e-commerce channel has seen even more rapid growth, with its revenue increasing by around four times in the last four years," it said.

Dabur has witnessed "disproportionately higher growth" in organised channels during the last few quarters as MT, ecommerce and quick commerce which has led to an increase in inventory levels in the General Trade (GT) channel impacting the distributor ROI.

"The company has taken an important strategic decision to correct distributor inventory in the GT channel and improve their ROI," it said.

# 'China oversupplying lithium to eliminate rivals'

Lisbon, Oct 8: Chinese lithium producers are flooding the global market with the critical metal and causing a 'predatory' price drop as they seek to eliminate competing projects, a senior US official said on a visit to Portugal

that has ample lithium reserves. Jose Fernandez, under secretary for economic growth, energy and the environment at the US Department of State, told a briefing late Monday that China was producing much more lithium "than the world needs today, by far".

However, the price collapse is also affecting China as it has forced Chinese companies like battery giant CATL to suspend production at certain mines. Europe aims to reduce its de-

pendence on imports from China and other countries of lithium and other materials essential to the green transition.

Fernandez said the low price "constrains our ability to diversify our supply chains on a broad, global scale" and also hurts countries such as Portugal that need investment to develop these industries.

Falling prices have forced many global lithium producers to scale back production and cut

Portugal, with some 60.000 tons of known reserves, is already Europe's biggest producer



of lithium, traditionally mined for ceramics

Along with neighbouring Spain, the country wants to take advantage of local lithium deposits, aiming to cover the entire value chain from mining and refining to cell and battery manufacturing to battery

recycling. Several mining companies in Portugal have been looking for financing, customers and suppliers to crank up projects.

"We want to help them, and we think we can... lithium mining companies, everywhere, have to survive this difficult phase that was created by predatory pricing," Fernandez said.

To make matters worse for India, skipper Harmanpreet Kaur, who scored 15 and 29 retired hurt, is doubtful for the match against Sri Lanka after suffering a neck injury while batting against Pakistan. There was no word from the team management whether she would be fit to play. The likes of Jemimah

Rodrigues, Deepti Sharma and Richa Ghosh too need to step up with the bat and share the burden of responsibility.

While medium pacer Arundhati Reddy sparkled against Pakistan with the ball, returning with figures of 3/19, she would look for more support from the likes of fellow pace colleagues Renuka Singh and Pooja Vastrakar, who didn't play the previous game because of an injury.



Kuala Lumpur: Two-time champions India will open their title defence against Malaysia in the Women's Asian Champions Trophy (ACT) hockey tournament November 11 at Rajgir, Bihar. The tournament will feature six teams hosts and defending champions India, China, three-time winners Korea, two-time champions Japan, be played November 20. India won the tournament in 2016 in Singapore before reclaiming the title in Ranchi last year. 

Shanghai, Oct 8: Pursuing a 100th career title, Novak Djokovic had an easier time in his second match at the Shanghai Masters tennis tournament in ousting Flavio Cobolli 6-1, 6-2 here Tuesday. Djokovic finished the match with his 19th winner, placing a forehand behind the Italian who was racing back across the baseline after being pushed wide by the service.

The fourth-seeded Serb did not allow a breakpoint in the third round, after previously being stretched to two tie-breakers and saving set points against Alex Michelsen of the United States.

Djokovic, who has won four of his 99 titles in Shanghai, next faces 61st-ranked Roman Safiullin who upset 13th-seeded American

Frances Tiafoe 5-7, 7-5, 7-6 (7-5). Stefanos Tsitsipas' rivalry with Daniil Medvedev will add another chapter after the Greek player beat Alexandre Muller 6-3, 7-5. The 12th-ranked Tsitsipas and the Russian former US Open champion will meet for a 14th

time, and first in nearly a year. The fifth-ranked Medvedev has a commanding 9-4 lead in the head-to-head series, which has spilled over into a war of words off the court in the past.

"I consider him someone that I respect on the tour, much more than I did before," Tsitsipas said after the match. "We've had some heated things on the court in the past, but I think those things have resolved themselves over time."

Tsitsipas had to wait out a two-day rain delay to play his third round match against Muller, but looked in complete control until losing his serve at 5-3 in the second set. Unperturbed the Greek broke back to love, to clinch the match and renew his

six-year rivalry with Medvedev. No. 16-ranked Ben Shelton put away Roberto Carballes Baena 6-3, 6-4, firing eight aces and 24

winners to line up top seed Jannik Sinner in the fourth round. Seventh-ranked Taylor Fritz also advanced with ease, beating Japan's Yosuke Watanuki 6-3, 6-4, while Grigor Dimitrov, playing in his 100th Masters event, beat Alexei Popyrin 7-6 (7-5), 6-3.

Gael Monfils upset 15th-ranked Ugo Humbert 7-6 (9-7), 2-6, 6-1 in an all-French match-up. The 38vear-old Monfils, ranked 46th, is the second oldest player to reach the fourth round in Shanghai, behind only Roger Federer (also 38) in 2019.

"It's never easy to play Ugo, he's really aggressive, playing fast off both wings and takes a lot of time from you," said Monfils, who plays second-seeded Carlos Alcaraz next.

In the women's segment Katerina Siniakova had a comfortable 6-3, 6-1 victory over Alexandra Eala of the Philippines to set up a second round match against defending champion Aryna Sabalenka.
