Man critical in 'encounter'

Sambalpur, Oct 10: A few days after DGP YB Khurania ordered a CID probe into the mysterious death of a 'ganja smuggler' allegedly after being thrashed by two policemen and three home guards in Kandhamal, cops in the district here fired at a man - who had allegedly hacked three fingers of a constable October 4 during a fight - leaving him critically injured, Thursday.

Legal experts, meanwhile, said the back-to-back incidents of brutal police action, which are a crude reminder of last month's alleged assault of an Army officer and his female friend at Bharatpur police station in Bhubaneswar, have raised serious questions over the highhandedness of civilian police force.

Sources said Burla police officials had visited Jhairpali village October 4 to investigate a comhospital for treatment.

plaint filed by a woman against her husband Kamlu Pradhan. On spotting the cops, Pradhan attacked one of them - constable Saroj Bhoi - with a cleaver, severing three fingers of his right arm.

Bhoi was taken to VIMSAR and later to SCBMCH in Cuttack, as police launched a hunt for Pradhan, who remained elusive since then. Cops received a tipoff Thursday

that Pradhan was hiding in Katapali forest, and accordingly, a police team went to nab him.

An officer in the search team

said Pradhan attacked the cops injuring a sub-inspector. "Police retaliated in self-defence and opened 'controlled fire' at Pradhan who sustained a bullet wound on his right leg," the officer said, adding he was admitted to Burla

Legal experts said police should use their weapons more responsibly, only as a last resort, to contain and control criminals. "As per the Constitution, no person can be deprived of his or her life without the due process of law. I don't believe in 'encounters'. It must be last step by the police," said advocate Soura Mohapatra.

Advocate Byomkesh Tripathy said the Bharatpur police brutality instance showed the cops in poor light. "That definitely impacted the cops' morale," he said. An inquiry should be conducted to find out if the Kandhamal and Sambalpur incidents were a retaliation for the Bharatpur shame, he said.

Kerala resolution opposes 'one poll'

Thiruvananthapuram: The Kerala Assembly Thursday unanimously passed a resolution urging the Centre to roll back its decision to approve the proposal for 'One Nation. One Flection' recommended by the Ramnath Kovind panel, saying that it was 'undemocratic and unconstitutional'. The resolution was moved on behalf of CM Pinaravi Vijayan by state Parliamentarv Affairs Minister MB Raiesh who said that the proposal would weaken the country's federal system and sabotage the diverse nature of India's parliamentary democracy

'Milton' wreaks havoc

Tampa: Hurricane Milton barrelled into the Atlantic Ocean Thursday after plowing across Florida, where it knocked out power to more than 3 million people and whipped up a barrage of tornadoes. The storm caused at least five deaths and compounded the misery wrought by Helene while sparing Tampa a direct hit. The system tracked to the south in the final hours and made landfall late Wednesday as a Category 3 storm in Siesta Key,

Literature Nobel for S Korea's Han Kang

Stockholm, Oct 10: South Korean author Han Kang was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature Thursday for what the Nobel committee called 'her intense poetic prose that confronts historical traumas and exposes the fragility of human life.'

Nobel committee chairman Anders Olsson praised Han's physical empathy for the vulnera-

ble, often female lives of her characters. "She has a unique awareness of the connections between body and soul, the living and the dead, and in a oetic and experimental style, has become an innovator in contemporary prose," Olsson said.

Nobel Literature committee member Anna-Karin Palm said Han writes intense lyrical prose that is both tender and brual. and sometimes slightly surrealistic as well.

Han, 53, becomes the first Asian woman and the first South Korean writer to win the Literature Nobel. She also becomes the second South Korean national to win a Nobel Prize, after late former President Kim Dae-jung won the Peace prize in 2000.

Han wins the Nobel at a time of growing global influence of South Korean culture, which in recent years has included the success of films like 'Parasite,' Netflix survival drama 'Squid Game' and the worldwide fame of K-pop groups.


The Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde paid homage to the industry icon, who died at a hospital here Wednesday night.


























State gets ₹8,068cr tax devolution from Centre

Bhubaneswar, Oct 10: The Union government Thursday said it has released tax devolution of ₹1.78.173 crore to state governments, including ₹8.068 crore to Odisha, as against the normal monthly devolution of ₹89,086.50 crore.

The advance instalment was released in view of upcoming festive season and to enable states to accelerate capital spending and finance their development/welfare related expenditures, said sources

Reacting to the development, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi said, "On behalf of the people of Odisha, we would like to express our gratitude to the Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Finance Minister Niramala Sitharaman for arranging the payment of ₹8,068



crore. This amount will play a significant role in the social and economic development of the state as well as give impetus to the various developmental projects going on in the state.' The Centre has released tax

devolution of ₹1,78,173 crore to state governments October 10, 2024, as against the normal monthly devolution of ₹89,086.50 crore.

Of all the states, Uttar Pradesh has received the highest ₹31,962 crore followed by Bihair 17,921 crore, Madhya Pradesh ₹13,987 crore and West Bengal ₹13,404 crore.

Likewise, Maharashtra (₹11,255 crore), Rajasthan (₹10,737 crore), Andhra Pradesh (₹7,211 crore) and Telangana (₹3,745 crore) are among the top receivers.

The Centre will transfer ₹23,48,980 crore to states and Union territories in FY 2024-25, an increase of 11.9 per cent over the actuals of 2023-24

Devolution to states from the Centre's tax revenue is estimated to be ₹12,47,211 crore in 2024-25, an increase of 10.4 per cent over the actuals of 2023-24

Prakash Behera quits BJD

Bhubaneswar, Oct 10: Former Salipur MLA Prakash Chandra Behera has resigned from the primary membership of Biju Janata Dal (BJD).

Behera, who had joined BJD just before the simultaneous Lok Sabha and Assembly polls, has sent his resignation letter to party supremo Naveen Patnaik.

He had unsuccessfully contested the 2024 Assembly polls from Barabati-Cuttack Assembly constituency on a BJD ticket.

In his letter to Patnaik, Behera wrote, "After serious thoughts, I'm resigning from the primary membership of BJD. I am grateful to you for making me a candidate from the prestigious Barabati-Cuttack Assembly seat and I have high regards for your leadership. I took the decision as I believe in nationalistic ideologies and am involved in people's issues, development and

organisation." Behera had been elected to the Assembly from Salipur seat in Cuttack district on a Congress

ticket in 2014. He had resigned from the ageold party and jumped to the saffron camp ahead of the 2019 Lok Sabha and Assembly polls.

High Court goes on Puja vacation

After wrapping up their work in the division bench, the two judges will also preside over the single benches on that day.

The single-judge bench of Justice Sangam Kumar Sahu will handle criminal matters while that of judge Murahari Sri Raman will conduct hearing on writ and civil matters, the notification added.

For listing of emergency matters for hearing by the vacation bench, applicants should put the petitions in the drop box installed at Deputy Registrar (Judicial) office, between 11am and 00:00 hrs of October 17.

This apart, the High Court office will remain open October 14, 15, 17 and 18 between 11am and 3pm during the vacation.

Applications pertaining to urgent matters during these four days will be received at the computer filing counter between 11am and 00:00 hrs.

The urgent writ, civil and criminal matters applied October 9 will be listed for hearing by the vacation bench.

According to the notification, matters which were not listed under IPC Sections 482 and 483 or fresh bail applications will be listed as per the registration dates.

Bogus realtor who splurged on women & films in City police net

Bhubaneswar, Oct 10: Niranjan Rana, 53, splurged on filmmaking and women in Mumbai with the ill-gotten millions he made from duping hundreds of unsuspecting people in Odisha who gave him their life-long savings to buy a dream home, or own a piece of land, in the twin city. On Thursday, the Balianta police ended the bogus property broker-cum-realtor's year-long run from law by arresting him in a swift operation.

DCP Pinak Mishra said Rana had swindled crores of rupees from home buyers by promising them with apartments and landed properties at subsidised rates.

Mishra said Rana, a native of Balipatna, ran a bogus realty



firm- Maa Tarini Estcon - in Bhubaneswar where he projected himself as the managing

director in order to give shape to his devious plans. "Rana channelised the money he raised from his 'customers' in producing a few high-budget Odia films. He did so in order to cover up the black money," Mishra said adding that a hunt is on for few of his associates who are still at large.

Mishra said the Balianta police had booked Rana more than 21 times in the past in similar fraud cases. Besides, seven non-bailable warrants (NBWs) against him are yet to be executed.

The DCP said Rana fled to Mumbai last year soon after obtaining bail from a court on medical grounds. "He went incommunicado thereafter and didn't comply with the court's direction to produce himself before the Balianta police for investigation," Mishra said.

Recently, Mishra said, the Balianta police received a tipoff from an informer stating that Rana had plans to visit his home during Dusshera. Accordingly, the cops laid a trap in the vicinity and took him into custody Thursday when he showed up. He was booked under Sections 318 (4) and 3 (5) of the BNS, and produced in a court for remand.

Judges should decide questions shunning popular morality: CJI

CHIEF JUSTICE OF INDIA DY CHANDRACHUD STRESSED ON THE **CREDIBILITY OF JUDICIARY AND THE 'INSTITUTIONAL** TRUST' BESTOWED **IN COURTS**

New Delhi, Oct 10: Judges are supposed to act in a manner that is "unencumbered" by popular morality while deciding constitutional and legal questions, Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud said.

The CJI was recently speaking at an event here on the subject of 'Judicial legitimacy through accessibility, transparency and technology: the Indian experience

Rayagada, Oct 10: Children of primitive Dongria Kondh community are likely to be deprived of nutritious food after the state government allegedly closed down the maternal and child nutrition centre in Niyamgiri region under Bissam Cuttack block of Rayagada district. The centre was functioning under the Odisha **PVTG Nutrition Improvement** Programme (OPNIP)

The state Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Scheduled Caste (SC) Development department was operating the maternal and child nutrition centres (Matru Sishu Poshan Kendra) in underdeveloped and tribal dominated areas of the state. However, with the scheme being discontinued, pregnant and lactating women besides children of primitive Dongria Kondh community living in the foothills of Niyamgiri will be deprived of nutritious food.

The then state government had launched the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG) scheme in Niyamgiri region of

The role of maternal nutrition centres established in the villages inhabited by the Dongria Kondh tribals was quite important. Many pregnant and expectant tribal women do not visit the hospital and prefer to deliver at home due to lack of

They do not eat nutritious food during their pregnancy period. However, the maternal nutrition centre was playing an important role by supplying them nutritious food.

Jamuna Kadraka of Khajuri village under Bissam Cuttack block said that the scheme was of great help to the pregnant women and expectant mothers.

Kurli sarpanch Subardini Badka lamented that the children have failed to get nutritious food following the closure of the crèches and maternal nutrition centres.

The children were looked after properly in the crèche. However, its closure will impact primary education in the area. The schools will also witness dropouts as the children will accompany their parents to work. She urged the state government to intervene and re-implement the project in their areas.

When contacted, Jagabandhu Meher, special officer of micro project agency of Dongria Kondh Development Ageency (DKDA) at Chatikana in the district said the project was valid till September 30 and had to be discontinued following expiry of the period. He said that he has no information if the state government plans to implement any

he French leftist Pierre Goldman was a revolutionary fantasist and a criminal. Charged with killing two women during a holdup in a Paris pharmacy and robbing various other stores, he admitted to the thefts but denied the murders, and received a life sentence in 1974. Goldman was acquitted in a 1976 retrial, which is the subject of The

Goldman Case (2023), a fine film directed by Cédric Kahn. By then, Goldman had become a hero to the French left, and many supporters, including luminaries of the Parisian literary and cultural worlds, attended the court sessions. When he was gunned down in murky circumstances in 1979, Jean-Paul Sartre was among the mourners.

This unlikely hero was born in Lyon to Polish-Jewish immigrants, who fought in the communist resistance against the Nazi occupation of France. The genocide of the Jews was a permanent stain marring Goldman's life. Obsessed with anti-Semitism, he wanted to be a resister, too, like his father, and traveled to Cuba and Venezuela in the hopes of seeing revolutionary action before returning to France, where he became a thief. During his trial, Goldman declared that he had always wished to be a "Jewish warrior," for this was, in his view, the only way to eradicate "Jewish shame."

The desire to project toughness to overcome the humiliation of centuries of persecution, culminating in the Holocaust, is not unique to Goldman. It is also useful in understanding the history of Israel and the belligerence of Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu. Of course, there are many reasons why Netanyahu has continued to escalate the war against Hamas and Hezbollah. If he relented, the hardliners in his government would abandon him, and once out of power, Netanyahu could end up in prison

But there is more than a little of Goldman in Netanyahu's rhetoric. He frequently invokes the Holocaust, when the Jews were forced to suffer their fate alone, to justify fighting the Palestinians. Pressed to stop the war in Gaza, Netanyahu said: "We will defeat our genocidal enemies. Never again is now.

Military prowess has been part of the Israeli ethos since the state's creation in 1948. A new type of Jew – a warrior – would populate the new country. But in the 1940s and 1950s, invoking the Nazi genocide was never done. David Ben-Gurion, Israel's

first prime minister, wanted to move on from this European past. Holocaust survivors were an embarrassing reminder of an historic humiliation.

Ben-Gurion changed his mind only after the 1961 trial of Adolf Eichmann, the Holocaust's chief engineer, in Jerusalem. The Holocaust was no longer treated as a symbol of shame, but rather as proof of Israel's destiny to ensure that Jews would never again be the victims of mass murder. Israeli schoolchildren, on visits to the death camps in Poland, are told that if the Jewish nation-state had existed when Hitler came to power, six million lives would have been saved.

Netanyahu prided himself on carrying that burden. He was "Mr. Security." Under his tough leadership, Israeli Jews would be safe. The brutal attack on 7 October, 2023, when Hamas murdered, raped, and kidnapped Jews, was thus a moment of deep humiliation – for the Israel Defense Forces, which were unprepared; for the intelligence agencies. which had largely ignored the warning signs; and, above all, for Mr.

Netanyahu had to lash out, and keep on lashing out, first and foremost to stay in office and out of jail, but also to expunge the shame and to show that Jews would fight back, even on their own if need be. The enemy is real: Hamas and Hezbollah are terrorist organisations ded icated to wiping Israel off the map. But with 7 October resurfacing old Jewish traumas, Israel is also fighting phantoms of the past, hence the repeated claims that the Islamist groups are today's Nazis

The continuing cycles of violence can easily spiral out of control, precipitating a wider war involving nuclear powers. Moreover, Netanyahu's goal of "total victory" against an ideological movement cannot be achieved by military means alone. But, most importantly, war and oppression generate more shame. However justified and necessary the founding of Israel may have been, Palestinians have been humiliated over and over as a result.

Demeaned men and women will only become more militant when barred from their ancestral homes, constantly bullied at roadblocks and border crossings, intimidated by violent Jewish settlers while Israeli soldiers watch, and forced to live under permanent occupation or face oppression by their own extremist leaders. Like Goldman, Palestinians will likely want to be warriors to rid themselves of their shame.

So long as both sides seek to inflict maximum damage on the other to right past wrongs, the violence will not end. Netanyahu may think that total victory is in sight, now that Hezbollah is badly damaged and Gaza reduced to rubble, but that is an illusion. All he has done is create more enemies who will want to restore their honour by killing in a war without end.

BLATANT CASTE BIAS

ukanya Santha, an intrepid journalist, visited several Indian prisons and wrote an article "From Segregation to Labor: The Indian Prison System," recounting the blatant discrimination in work performed by prison inmates, based on caste, sanctified by Prison Manuals. Her writ for repealing the offending provisions in State Prison Manuals has been upheld by the Supreme Court in a historic judgment. The Supreme Court referring to Prison Manuals of several states has brought out how they sanction blatantly unconstitutional practices, violating Articles 14, 15, 17, 21, and 23 which is considered the equality code. The division of manual labour based on caste, segregation of barracks, and discrimination against prisoners belonging to 'denotified tribes' and habitual offenders is prevalent in every state prison.

The Court noted how the prison system has been out of sync with the core philosophy of the Constitution; ushering in an equal society (Art 14), ending all forms of discrimination (Art 15(1)), prohibition untouchability of any form (Art 17), and the abolition of forced labour & exploitation (Art 23). The colonial administration linked castes with prison administration of labour, food, and treatment of prisoners. The Court observed that "not providing dignity to prisoners is a relic of colonizers, where oppressive systems were designed to dehumanize and degrade those under control of the state.'

By assigning cleaning and sweeping work to the marginalised castes, while allowing the higher castes to do the cooking, the Manuals directly discriminate under Article 15(1). Phrases such as 'menial jobs to be performed by castes accustomed to performing such duties' are targeted at marginal communities. Such indirect usage of phrases, which target the lower

castes cannot be permitted in our constitutional framework, the Court observed. The Court also observed that such Manuals reinforce stereotypes against the marginalised castes. These stereotypes not only demean and stigmatise marginal communities but also serve to legitimise a social hierarchy that goes against the constitutional values of equality

The persistence of such an approach in official documents like the Prison Manuals normalises the idea that they are incapable of dignified or intellectual work. For instance, the WB Manual says the sweeper should be chosen from the Meri or Hari caste. Art 21 is a constitutional guarantee that individuals from marginalised communities should have the freedom to break free from traditional social restrictions. When caste prejudices manifest in institutional settings like prisons, they create further restrictions on the personal development of individuals from marginal communities. Such restrictions deprive them of a sense of dignity and the expectation that they should be treated equally. The Court asserts that the right to life in Article 21 is not to live an animal-like existence but a life of dignity, which the Prison Manuals deprive the marginalised communities

The Court refers to Article 23 (1) which provides an enforceable fundamental right against social and economic exploitation. It aims to prohibit human trafficking and other forms of forced labour. The broad scope can be invoked to challenge practices where no wages are paid, and social security measures are not adopted. Article 23 can be applied inside the prisons if prisoners are subjected to degrading labour or similar oppressive practices. The prison rules by exploiting the labour of the oppressed castes perpetuate the same injustices to guard against Article 23. Thus, the Prison Manuals are violating the equality code ensconced in Articles 14, 15, 17, 21 & 23. The Court has accordingly asked the state governments to revise the Manuals in three months. It has also asked to delete the caste column and any other reference in convict/undertrial prisoner's

The Court refers to Ambedkar's seminal book 'Annihilation of Caste' to underlie how the caste system operated as a mechanism that thrived on the labour of the Bahujan communities, ultimately eroding their identity. CJI DY Chandrachud writes: "The body of caste is made of steel. But not so strong that they cannot be broken with the power of the Constitution.'

Sukanya Shantha must be complimented for her wonderful research work to unravel the colonial system of caste discrimination that still stalks our Prison Manuals & flagrantly violates the equality jurisprudence which is a basic structure of our Constitution. Memory goes back to another journalist and activist Sheela Barse who was instrumental in bringing out to light the plight of women undertrial prisoners, physically and mentally retarded children who are kept in jail in inhuman condition. The Sheela Barse Vs UOI (1986) case has now made it mandatory for district judges to visit jails once in two months to see the condition of prisoners and undertrials. It was Justice Krishna Iyer in Sunil Batra Vs Delhi Administration Case (1978) whose judgment has ensured that Articles 14, 19, and 21 of the Constitution apply to prisoners also. To quote Justice Iyer: When a prisoner is traumatized, the Constitution suffers and whether inside the prison or outside, a person shall not be deprived of his guaranteed freedom." The present judgment echoes a similar sentiment; for eschewing the repugnant discriminatory practice of the caste inside Indian jails. Everyone is born equal; there cannot be any stigma attached to caste, whether inside a jail or outside.

One of the British negotiators commented: "The fingers are already touching, only a few inches to go for the handshake. Participating in the conference, I stated that, it is a matter of months for the FTA to be signed and sealed. My assertion was based on the realisation that geopolitical and geostrategic considerations backed by progressive realism on both sides would lead them to sign the FTA.

In support of my prediction, Largue that Britain is rediscovering its historic footprint in the world, albeit in a modern cooperative framework, having exited from the European bloc. Likewise, India is exploring its future in the world, as an acknowledged power from the Global South, having shed off its anti-colonial mindset. FTA is the most preferred agreement to conduct business between two or more countries. It has potentially both upsides and downsides. The plus points comprise increased trade flows by cutting and eliminating tariff and non-tariff barriers; increased

The negatives consist of job losses due to competition, unequal distribution of benefits, harmful environmental impacts, lower regulatory standards in either country and so on. But these negative consequences of FTA are not inevitable. They can be tackled by collaborative

transparent efforts. In India-UK FTA, there are 26 chapters. Many of these have been concluded except a few, about four chapters which seem to be the sticking points. According to the Global Trade and Research Initiative (GTRI). the deal is almost finalised with a few adjustments to be made. The so-called road blocks, from Indian side, are the leadership instability in Britain which is over as a new party has come to power with a comfortable majority; the visa provision for Indian skilled professionals mainly in IT and healthcare; market access for services and goods, mainly for labour-intensive products: firm stand on data inclusivity, protection, and localisation; the UK demand on Indian government

the roadblocks are Indian tariffs, mainly on export of cars and their components and Scotch whiskies which are now at 125% and 150% respectively; the issue of data protection and that of intellectual property rights. Britain is concerned about investment and market environment with regard to labour, gen-

der, corruption, and red-tapism. India is clearly wary of giving too many concessions without reciprocal measures and least they should be replicated in other fu-

ture agreements. Despite the above differences to be sorted out, I firmly asserted that FTA will surely be signed. It has the bipartisan consensus as both the major parties -Conservative and Labour - have made it a manifesto commitment. To be sure, FTA will deepen the ties between India and UK. Also, it should offer a model to the world, as to how a former colony does business with the former coloniser on equal terms as a partner.

Unexpected victory

As the BJP did not fight all seats in this election and its influence in the Kashmir valley was minor in comparison to the Jammu division, it had little possibility of becoming a major challenger for power. Even after this, it is worth noting that, in addition to defeating its opponents in the Jammu division, it laid the groundwork for its massive base in the Kashmir valley.

THE QUESTION REMAINS WHETHER THE COMMUNAL DISCORD WILL SHAPE VOTER BEHAVIOUR IN BYPOLLS

New Delhi, Oct 10: While Uttar Pradesh is gearing up for bypolls in ten Assembly seats, a communally charged atmosphere is brewing, which could significantly impact voter behaviour and the electoral outcome.

The communal tension has escalated, particularly following controversial remarks by Yati Narsinghanand against Prophet Muhammad, the head priest of the Dasna Devi temple in Ghaziabad.

In reaction to his statements, various Muslim outfits have mobilised protests across the state, while Hindu groups are planning a large gathering in Ghaziabad to support Narsinghanand.

On October 13, various Hindu outfits, including the Hindu Raksha Dal, Shiv Sena (UBT) Gau Raksha Dal, Bajrang Dal and Hindu Yuva Vahini, will convene a Mahapanchayat at the Ghaziabad collectorate. Tensions reached a peak when a mob allegedly attacked the Dasna temple, prompting police action and the establishment of a security camp around the site.

Hindu groups are demanding the swift arrest of those responsible for the temple attack warning that failure to meet their demands could lead to larger protests. In response, the

FIR against 42 for 'unauthorised' stir

An FIR was registered against 42 peo-ple, including two named individuals, Wednesday for allegedly burning an effigy of controversial priest Yati Narsinghanand and blocking a road in Bareilly city, police said. Police said they are scanning CCTV footage from the area to identify the unknown accused and have arrested two of those allegedly involved in the protests. "An FIR has been lodged under BNS sections 223 (disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant) and 285 (Danger or obstruction in public way or line of navigation) against Samir. Firdous, and 40 unidentified individuals over the incident." Bareilly SP (City) Manush Parik said, "Two of the accused have been arrested. Strict action will be taken against all those involved," he added. Later, a crowd from a specific community gathered outside the police station to demand the release of the detained individuals

New Delhi, Oct 10: Indian capital's finances may fall into deficit for the first time by the end of 2024-25, with its expenditure likely to exceed its receipts, the finance department has informed

Delhi's earnings — through tax revenue, non-tax revenue, receipts under centrally sponsored schemes and grants from the Centre — are projected to drop from the budgetary estimate of ₹64,142 crore to ₹62,415 crore by the end of FY25.

Revenue expenditure is expected to rise from ₹60,911 crore to ₹63,911 crore. Additionally, the city govt would require ₹7,000 crore to complete various capital projects, which were not provisioned in the Budget.

The Budget division of Delhi's finance department made these projections while preparing the

revised estimates for the 2024-25 fiscal year. Sources indicate that the finance department recently shared a note on the city's financial situation with chief minister Atishi, who also holds the finance portfolio, detailing tax, non-tax revenues, and expenditures under various categories.

According to sources, the finance department has identified an additional requirement of ₹3,000 crore for various revenue expenditures in the current financial year.

These were not accounted for in the 2024-25 of FY25 budget estimates and include funds for enhanced pensions and allowances as per the National Judicial Pay Commission, power subsidies, viability funding for electric buses, desilting of drains, repair of

These plans are part of the varsity's $% \left(\frac{1}{2}\right) =\left(\frac{1}{2}\right) ^{2}$ long-term goals mapped in its Institutional Development Plan (IDP) 2024 -- a perspective plan document which charts out the broad goals and objective the Delhi University (DU) wishes to achieve over a period of time

According to the set goals, the university aims to establish a DU satellite system that could play a major role in scientific research, telecom-



munications, GPS navigation as well as remote education.

However, if financial limitations arise, the DU may consider hiring services from organizations like the ISRO to make this plan a reality, the document states.

Cutting emissions

In addition, the DU is eyeing environmental sustainability with plans to introduce a zero-emission target by restricting fossil fuel vehicles on the campus. The university hopes to phase in electric vehicles. starting with areas like Chhatra Marg, to create a cleaner and greener environment for the students and

The modalities of these projects and feasibility of their implementation will be decided as and when they are considered for rolling out.

Meals for work

Another major initiative the DU plans to introduce is a working lunch scheme for underprivileged students. offering free meals in the university cafeteria in exchange for work. The canteens will follow strict food safety standards and could collaborate with self-help groups for food procurement to support local communities, the IDP envisions.

Alongside these plans, the DU is looking at creating a "University Haat", on lines of the universities abroad, to set up a commercial shopping area where products developed by the university's student-led startups can be showcased and put up for sale. The university's massive population of nearly six lakh people presents a unique market opportunity, the document states.

The Institutional Development Plan was approved by the Academic Council members Thursday.

Surajpal records statement before judicial panel

Lucknow, Oct 10: Self-styled godman Surajpal alias "Bhole Baba" appeared before a judicial commission here Thursday in connection with the July 2 stampede at his congregation in Hathras that had claimed 121

The panel recorded Surajpal's statement over the incident, his lawyer AP Singh told PTI, adding that the questioning continued for two hours and a half. He also said the judicial panel has been given a three-month time extension to complete its probe into the stampede.

Surajpal, also known as Narayan Sakar Hari, is not mentioned as an accused in the FIR that was lodged after the stampede at Fulrai village in the Sikandra Rao area of Hathras district. The Uttar Pradesh government formed the three-member judicial commission, headed by a retired high court judge, July 3 to probe the Hathras stampede and look into the possibility of a conspiracy behind the tragedy. This was separate from a police investigation launched in the matter.

"The judicial commission's office is here (Lucknow) and today, Narayan Sakar Hari (Surajpal) was called for (recording) his statement here. We reached the commission's office around 10:30 am and left at 1 pm," Singh told PTI.

He said Surajpal's name is not mentioned as an accused in the FIR or in the police



India bids tearful adieu to icon Ratan Tata

BATTLING WITH AGE-RELATED HEALTH ISSUES AT THE BREACH CANDY HOSPITAL SINCE MONDAY, TATA (86) BREATHED HIS LAST SHORTLY BEFORE MIDNIGHT WEDNESDAY

Mumbai, Oct 10: Many thousands including top political leaders, captains of industry, celebs and commoners bid a tearful farewell to the legendary business giant and a genteel Parsi, Ratan Naval Tata at his final journey Thursday.

Battling with age-related health issues at the Breach Candy Hospital since Monday, Tata (86) breathed his last shortly before midnight Wednesday, plunging the world of industry and corporates into gloom.

His mortal remains were taken to the NCPA Lawns this morning to enable the people to pay their last respects before the funeral at the Worli Crematorium in the evening.

Since morning, thousands of people and dignitaries, including Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Ajit Pawar, Speaker Rahul Narwekar, Central and state ministers, MPs, legislators and leaders of all political parties turned up to pay their respects.

India's top industrialist tvcoons including Mukesh Ambani, his wife Nita Ambani and their family members, representatives or heads of leading business families like the Piramals. Godrejs, Hindujas, Mahindras, Bajajs, Birlas and more attended and paid homage to the departed star of the country's business galaxy.

Other notables included Nationalist Congress Party (SP) President Sharad Pawar, Working President Supriya Sule, Jayant Patil, Jitendra Awhad, Shiv Sena (UBT) President Uddhav Thackeray, wife Rashmi, son Aditya, Arvind Sawant, MP, Congress' former Chief Ministers Sushilkumar Shinde, Prithviraj Chavan, Leader of Opposition Vijav Wadettiwar, state chief Nana Patole, Balasaheb Thorat, Satej Bunty Patil.

Maharashtra Navnirman Sena President Raj Thackeray and his family, Vanchit Bahujan

Aghadi President Prakash Ambedkar and others also visited or paid glowing tributes to Tata's memory and his contributions to the country.

After the teeming crowds at Nariman Point, this afternoon Tata's glass-topped coffin draped in the Tricolour was mounted in a closed flower-bedecked van which sped off to the Prayer Hall and Crematorium at Worli, some 12 km away.

His head, covered in a typical red Parsi prayer cap and body in a traditional community attire, was visible from the coffin at the NCPA Lawns and the Prayer Hall in Worli, as Hindu. Muslim, Sikh, Christian, Parsi religious men chanted prayers and reverently stood beside.

En route, on both sides, there

were many thousands of Mumbaikars, many with moist eyes, raising their hands in a symbolic 'Goodbye, Tata', some carrying small posters or placards with his photos as the mo-

torcade zipped away. Before Worli, there were many more thousands of locals who had trooped out on the roads and stood on both sides, hoping to catch a glimpse of the legendary tycoon who had touched the lives of many millions during his lifetime through his industries, social, educational, health and philanthropic activities. Later, it was taken to the cremation spot by a police team, a police band played the Last Post, accorded him a gun salute, and removed and folded the Tricolour which was handed over to a relative.

New Delhi, Oct 10: Wrinkles on an elephant's trunk could reveal if it is right- or left-trunked -- indicating its preference for wrapping objects towards its right or left side, a study has found.

While the mammals are known to use the farthest portion of their trunks for wrapping food and other objects, researchers from the Humboldt-University of Berlin, Germany, observed that whiskers or hairs

on the trunk are longer on the side towards which the elephants prefers wrapping objects.

This preference gives an elephant its "trunkedness" -- something that a baby elephant is not born with and develops with age and how it bends its trunk, the researchers said.

The repeated motion leads to wrinkle formation on the farthest portion of the trunk, they said.

"A 'left-trunker' would preferably wrap their trunk towards the left of their body and perform leftoriented behaviours with the

trunk, thereby frequently compressing the left side of their distal trunk and stretching the right side at the same time," the authors wrote in the study published in the journal Royal Society Open Science.

The team studied dead specimens of 10 Asian and five African elephants, along with photographs of foetuses, and found that the side bearing longer whiskers or hairs also bore more wrinkles.

The opposite side was seen to have fewer whiskers as it was more in contact with the ground, they added.

The authors also found about 1.5 times more wrinkles on the trunks of Asian elephants, compared to African elephants, with the trend beginning early in the womb

They added that while behavioural preferences shape how the trunk develops physically, including its wrinkles, there could be partial genetic influences as well.

"The high density of wrinkles in the Asian elephants' 'trunk wrapping zone' shows how trunk wrinkles and their unique form in African and Asian elephants could contribute to the phenomenally flexible actuation of trunks," the authors wrote.

New Delhi, Oct 10: The Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) Wednesday approved procurement of 31 Predator long-endurance drones from the US and indigenous construction of two nuclear-powered conventional submarines with an aim to significantly enhance India's military prowess, people familiar with the matter said.

As India scrambles to modernise its military in the face of China's growing presence in the Indian Ocean region, it is focusing on boosting naval capabilities, and improving domestic weapons-making capacity.

The MQ-9B 'hunter killer' drones are being procured from US defence major General Atomics under the foreign military sales route at a total cost of around USD 3.1 billion.

The two submarines will be built at a cost of around ₹40,000 crore, the people cited above said.

The new submarines will be built at the government's shipbuilding centre in India's southern port of Visakhapatnam.

In the letter they have stated if there is any casualty among the fasting junior doctors they will go on mass cease work with immediate effect and they will not

budge under any circumstances. FEMA is a body of 69 associations of doctors from all the academic medical streams. In the letter to Banerjee, FEMA said, "If any casualty happens amongst the 'Fasting unto Death' of any of the junior doctors, it will be the last spark to light the flame. Once this happens, all doctors and medical community of West Bengal will go on complete cease work. No amount of vote bank or police force will be able stop that movement."

The senior doctors have urged the West Bengal government to initiate discussions at the earliest to end the present imbroglio. "We hereby request you to pay heed to our junior doctors, whom you have completely neglected and purposefully caused harm, till now. We also would like to sit with you by Friday to find any possible solution to save our children,' the letter further states.

Meanwhile, concerned over their deteriorating health conditions due to fasting over the past five days, West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose has urged the junior medics to end their hunger strike and advised them to continue their protest without affecting their health, a source in the Raj Bhavan said Thursday.



NCPCR identifies over 11L children vulnerable, takes preventive steps

New Delhi, Oct 10: The apex child rights body NCPCR Thursday said it identified over 11 lakh children vulnerable to child marriage in 2023-24 and intervened through steps such as family counselling, school reintegration efforts, and coordination with law enforcement.

In a comprehensive report, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) underscored the efforts it took under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act (PCMA), 2006, through collaboration with child marriage prohibition officers (CMPOs), district authorities, and other stakeholders.

More than 1.2 crore people

were reached through the aware-

ness campaigns, with Uttar

Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and



Andhra Pradesh emerging as leaders in the fight against child marriage, the commission said.

The report, which was prepared after virtual review meetings with district officials and key stakeholders, presents data on children at risk of dropping out of schools, a major factor contributing to child marriages.

Uttar Pradesh, with over 500,000 such children, showed a strong response in addressing this issue, followed by states like Madhya Pradesh and Odisha.

Across India, more than 11.4 lakh vulnerable children were identified, with steps taken to prevent child marriages through family counselling, school reintegration efforts, and coordination with law enforcement, according to the NCPCR. The preventive measures also

included mapping schools to identify children absent for 30 consecutive days without notice and coordinating with school authorities to monitor dropouts.

In states such as Karnataka and Assam, officials conducted over 40,000 meetings with key local figures such as religious leaders, service providers involved in marriage ceremonies, and Anganwadi workers to raise awareness and prevent marriages involving minors, said the report released Thursday.

'SL economy stabilised'

Colombo: Aided by critical structural and policy reforms, the Sri Lankan economy has stabilised after the deep crisis it suffered in 2022 with growth in 2024 expected to be 4.4 per cent up from the previous projections, the World Bank said Thursday. "The good news is that it grew faster than most expected but the not so good news is that it is not out of the woods yet," World Bank country director Gevorg Sargsyan told reporters. The 2024 growth is expected to be 4.4 per cent up from the previous projection of a 2.2 per cent, yet the poverty could increase. Sri Lanka declared its first-ever sovereign default in mid-April 2022, the first since gaining independence from Britain in 1948.

Ship targeted by suspected Houthis

Dubai: A series of suspected attacks by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeted a ship Thursday in the Red Sea. authorities said. The attack comes as the rebels continue to threaten ships moving through the Red Sea, a waterway that once saw \$1 trillion in goods move through it a year, over the ongoing conflicts in the Mideast stemming from the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip. A shin in the Red Sea skirting the coast of the East Africa found itself struck first by a projectile that damaged the vessel, but sparked no fire and caused no injuries, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center said. At least two more projectiles later fell in the waters around the vessel.

B'desh begins Durga **Puja celebrations**

Dhaka: Bangladesh Thursday began an extended official holiday as Hindu community's Durga Puja celebration got underway amid tight security at temples and makeshift mandaps across the country. Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus is expected to visit Sunday the centuries-old Dhakeswari national temple, one of the prominent shaktee peeths. "We are celebrating the puja for the second day today (Saptami) amid festivity. No untoward incident from anywhere has been reported so far," Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council leader Kajol Debnath told PTI. Dubai, Oct 10: Gulf states are lobbying Washington to stop Israel from attacking Iran's oil sites because they are concerned their own oil facilities could come under fire from Tehran's proxies if the conflict escalates, three Gulf sources told Reuters.

As part of their attempts to avoid being caught in the crossfire, Gulf states including Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and Qatar are also refusing to let Israel fly over their airspace for any attack on Iran and have conveyed this to Washington, the three sources close to government circles said

Israel has promised Iran will pay for its missile attack last week while Tehran has said any retaliation would be met with vast destruction, raising fears of a wider war in the region that could suck in the United States.

The moves by the Gulf states come after a diplomatic push by non-Arab Shi'ite Iran to persuade its Sunni Gulf neighbours to use their influence with Washington amid rising concerns Israel could target Iran's oil production facilities.

During meetings this week,



Iran warned Saudi Arabia it could not guarantee the safety of the Gulf kingdom's oil facilities if Israel were given any assistance in carrying out an attack, a senior Iranian official and an Iranian diplomat told

Ali Shihabi, a Saudi analyst close to the Saudi royal court, said: "The Iranians have stated: 'If the Gulf states open up their airspace to Israel, that would be an act of war'.'

A potential Israeli strike was the focus of talks Wednesday between Saudi de facto ruler. Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, and Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi, who was on a Gulf tour to rally support, Gulf and Iranian sources said.

A person in Washington familiar with the discussions confirmed that Gulf officials had been in touch with US counterparts to express concern about

the potential scope of Israel's expected retaliation. The White House declined comment.

The three Gulf sources stated that Saudi Arabia, as a leading oil exporter along with oil-producing neighbours, the UAE Qatar, Kuwait, Oman and Bahrain, had keen a interest in de-escalating the situation.

"We will be in the middle of a missile war. There is serious concern, especially if the Israeli strike targets Iran's oil installations," a second Gulf source said. According to two senior Israeli officials, Israel is going to calibrate its response and, as of Wednesday, it had not yet decided whether it would strike Iran's oilfields.

The option was one of a number presented by the defence establishment to Israeli leaders, according to the officials.

Pak thwart suicide attack in Balochistan; one soldier killed

Karachi, Oct 10: A Frontier Corp soldier was killed and 13 others injured in a gunfight when Pakistani security forces thwarted a suicide attack in the restive Balochistan province, the military said Thursday.

Assistant Commissioner Naveed Alam said terrorists attempted to enter the Joint Response Centre in Zhob's Sabakzai area Wednesday from three fronts. A suicide bomber also attempted to enter the building but was shot dead by the security forces, he said.

Another terrorist was also killed in the operation to repel the attackers, the military's media wing said in a statement, adding that one Frontier Corp soldier was killed, while 11 soldiers and two civilians were injured.

"At the time of the attack, there were around 45 FC (Frontier Corp) officials, 10 Levies personnel, and five soldiers in the building," Alam said.

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) statement said that the terrorists were "sent to hell" before they could cause the intended damage, adding that one of the slain terrorists was involved in "numerous terrorist activities against security forces as well as innocent civilians, including a recent attack on a convoy of a government official."

The ISPR added that a sanitisation operation was underway to eliminate any other terrorists in the area. Separatist groups operating in Balochistan have stepped up attacks, last week, they carried out a suicide bomb attack in Karachi near the airport in which two Chinese engineers were killed.

Zelenskyy promotes 'victory plan' to allies

Paris, Oct 10: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was city-hopping across Europe Thursday to promote a "victory plan" that he said "aims to create the right conditions for a just end to the war" against Russia, detailing the proposals to European leaders after a scheduled summit involving US President Joe Biden was derailed by Hurricane Milton.

Zelenskyy's talks in London with British Prime Minister

Keir Starmer and NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte were quickly followed by another meeting in Paris with French President Emmanuel Macron, who just the previous day sent a strong signal of support for Ukraine by visiting Ukrainian troops being trained in France.

Zelenskyy posted on X that he "outlined the details" of the Ukrainian victory plan to Starmer and added: "We have agreed to work on it together

He also met Rutte with Starmer. Zelenskyy posted afterward that they discussed trans-Atlantic cooperation and further reinforcing Ukraine militarily. He gave no details but posted that "these are the steps that will create the best conditions for restoring a just peace. Zelenskyy has yet to publicly

resent the proposals for victory 'Nuclear Five' states to meet soon:

A group of five nuclear weapons states will hold a meeting in New York in the next two weeks, Russian state media quoted Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov as saying Thursday.

The group brings together Russia, the United States, China, France and Britain, all of which are nuclear-armed states and permanent members of the United Nations Security Council.

Ryabkov did not announce a specific date or say what level of officials would attend.

The meeting is potentially significant because of a significant escalation in nuclear tensions between Russia and the West since the start of the Ukraine war.

Vientiane, Oct 10: Southeast Asian leaders stepped up pressure on China to respect international law following clashes in the disputed South China Sea during annual summit talks Thursday, but Chinese Premier Li Qiang was defiant as he blamed "external forces" for interfering in regional affairs.

The 10-member Association of Southeast Asian Nations' meeting with Li followed recent violent confrontations at sea this year between China and ASEAN members Philippines and Vietnam that heightened unease over China's increasingly assertive actions in the contested waters.

Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim, who will take over the rotating ASEAN chair next year, said the bloc has called for an early conclusion to a code of conduct to govern the South China Sea. Talks on the code of

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, who arrived in Vientiane Thursday for the meetings, is expected to raise the issue of China's aggression in the sea, officials said. The US has no claims but it has deployed Navy ships and fighter jets to patrol the waterway and promote freedom of navigation and overflight.

ASEAN members Vietnam, the Philippines, Malaysia and Brunei along with Taiwan have overlapping claims with China, which claims sovereignty over virtually all of the South China Sea. Chinese and Philippine vessels have clashed repeatedly this year, and Vietnam said last week that Chinese forces assaulted its fishermen in the disputed sea. China has also sent patrol vessels to areas that Indonesia and Malaysia claim as exclusive economic zones.

NATO to start annual nuclear exercise

Brussels: NATO will hold a long-planned major nuclear exercise next week, the alliance's chief said Thursday, a few weeks after President Vladimir Putin announced changes to Russia's nuclear doctrine to discourage Ukraine's Western

The exercise has been held at roughly the same time each year for over a decade. Bomber aircraft and fighter jets that can carry nuclear warheads are taking part. No live munitions are used. The bulk of the exercise is being held around 900 kilometres from Russia in the North Sea. Moscow has been informed about the drills, NATO officials say.

TCS net profit up

Mumbai: Country's largest IT services firm TCS Thursday reported a 4.99 per cent increase in September quarter net profit at ₹11,909 crore, held back by a narrowing of profit margin. The Tata Group company had reported a net profit of ₹11.342 crore in the year-ago period, while in the preceding June quarter, it had a post tax net profit of ₹12,040 crore. Tata Consultancy Services' revenues rose 7.06 per cent to ₹64,988 crore from ₹60,698 crore in the year-ago period, and were marginally higher compared to ₹63,575 crore in the June quarter. Its operating profit margin narrowed to 24.1 per cent, down 0.2 per cent over the year-ago period and 0.6 per cent from the April-June quarter. The company's overall employee base increased by 5,726 to 6,12,724 staffers, and the overall addition in the first half of the current fiscal on a net basis came at over 11.000.

Ireda profit soars

New Delhi: State-owned Ireda Thursday reported a 36 per cent rise in its profit after tax to ₹387.75 crore in the September quarter on higher revenues. The company had posted a profit after tax (PAT) of ₹284.73 crore in the July-September period of the preceding 2023-24 fiscal, it said in an exchange filing. Its total revenue from operations rose 38.52 per cent year-on-year to ₹1,630.38 crore from ₹1,176.96 crore. Ireda's loan book increased by 35.88 per cent to ₹64,564.36 crore from ₹47,514.48 crore in the same quarter a year. Loan sanctions jumped around four-fold to ₹8,723.78 crore against ₹2,852.05 crore in the second quarter last fiscal.

BoM sees loan rise

New Delhi: State-owned Bank of Maharashtra (BoM) Thursday said it has posted a credit growth of 18.7 per cent at ₹2.17 lakh crore in the second quarter of FY24. Total advances were ₹1.83 lakh crore at the end of September 30, 2023, BoM said in a regulatory filing. The lender reported a 15.4 per cent increase in total deposits to ₹2.76 lakh crore against ₹2.39 lakh crore at the end of the second quarter of the previous financial year. Ola has also been in the spotlight this week following a public spat between its founder and a comedian which revived questions over its service and prompted another wave of complaints online.

Sebi extends deadline to implement direct pay-out of securities to clients' demat a/c

New Delhi, Oct 10: Markets regulator Sebi Thursday extended the deadline to implement guidelines mandating the direct pay-out of securities to clients' demat accounts to November 11.

This rule was originally set to take effect October 14.

On June 5, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) came out with a circular requiring Clearing Corporations (CCs) to credit pay-out securities directly to the client's demat account to improve operational efficiency and reduce risk.

Currently, the clearing corporation credits the pay-out of securities in the pool account of the broker, who then credits the same to the respective client's demat accounts.

The final operational guidelines were to be issued by CCs to the market by August 5. However, the guidelines were issued by CCs at the end of August on account of extensive consultation in Brokers' Industry Standards Forum (Brokers' ISF).

After a review meeting and representations from the Brokers' Forum, Sebi has extended the implementation date to November 11 to ensure a smooth transition without market disruptions, according to the circular issued on Thursday.

In a separate circular, the reg-

New Delhi, Oct 10: Equity mutual funds attracted ₹34,419 crore in September, marking a decline of 10 per cent from the preceding month, on a sharp slump in inflow in thematic and largecap funds.

This was also the lowest level of inflow since April when equity schemes saw investments of ₹18.917 crore.

Despite the drop in net inflows, this was still the 43rd consecutive month of net inflow in the equity-oriented funds highlighting the ever-increasing appeal of mutual funds among investors, data with the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) showed Thursday.

Moreover, monthly contributions from the Systematic Investment Plan (SIP) rose to an all-time high of ₹24,509 crore in September, as against ₹23,547 in August

Overall, the mutual fund industry witnessed an outflow of ₹71.114 crore in the month under review after an investment of ₹1.08 lakh crore in August, largely due to withdrawal to the tune of ₹1.14 lakh crore from debt schemes.

Undeterred by the outflow, the industry's net assets under management rose to ₹67 lakh crore last month from ₹66.7 lakh crore in August

Air India buys 85 more planes with Airbus

New Delhi: Air India has placed an order for 85 more aircraft with Airbus, includ ing 10 A350s, as the airline works on expanding operations, according to sources. Of the 85 airplanes, 75 are narrow-body A320 family aircraft and 10 wide-body A350 planes, the sources said in the know said Thursday. In an update Wednesday, Airbus said it has received orders for 667 aircraft this year till September. Among them, there was an order, received on September 5, for 85 planes -- 20 A320 neos, 55 A321 neos, 5 A350-900s and 5 A350-1000s. In February 2023, Air India placed orders for 470 planes with Airbus and Boeing.

UPI transactions volume surges 52% to 78.97bn

Mumbai: The unified payments interface (UPI)-based transactions volume surged 52 per cent to 78.97 billion in the first half this year (H1 2024), from 51.9 billion in the same period last year, a report showed Thursday. Similarly, the value of transactions grew by 40 per cent, increasing from ₹83.16 lakh crore to ₹116.63 lakh crore in the first six months this year. Month-wise, the number of UPI transactions rose significantly from 8.03 billion in January last year to 13.9 billion in June. This growth in volume was matched by an increase in transaction value, which climbed from ₹12.98 lakh crore in January last year to ₹20.07 lakh crore in June.

WTO revises trade growth forecast marginally

RISING GEOPOLITICAL TENSIONS POSE RISKS, SAYS THE ORGANISATION

New Delhi, Oct 10: The World Trade Organisation (WTO) Thursday revised the forecast for global trade growth marginally upwards to 2.7 per cent for 2024 though it said that rising geopolitical tensions continue to pose substantial down-



In April, the WTO projected 2.6 per cent in global trade for this year. However, the Geneva-based 166member multi-lateral body slashed the forecast for 2025 to 3 per cent from 3.3 per cent earlier.

In its Global Trade Outlook, WTO cautioned that rising geopolitical tensions and increased economic policy uncertainty continue to pose substantial downside risks to the forecast.

"Global goods trade is projected to post a 2.7 per cent increase in 2024, up slightly from the previous estimate of 2.6 per cent," it said.

As per the report, Asia saw a strong export rebound in the first half of the year driven by key manufacturing economies such as China, Singapore and Korea.

It added that while China's

growth remains modest, other economies such as Singapore, Malaysia, India and Viet Nam are surging.

"This shift suggests their emerging role as connecting economies, trading across geopolitical blocs, thereby potentially mitigating the risk of fragmentation," it said. Services trade has a more

favourable outlook compared to goods according to leading indicators, it said. Further, the report said that in European imports, the largest contraction was in machinery, with a substantial reduction in imports from China.

India's 100 richest tycoons surpass \$1tn milestone

New Delhi, Oct 10: The collective wealth of India's 100 richest tycoons surpassed the trillion dollar milestone for the first time as more than 80 per cent of the country's richest tycoons are now wealthier than they were a year ago, a Forbes report

showed Thursday. In a record-breaking year, India's wealthiest are now worth \$1.1 trillion, more than twice as rich as they were in 2019, according to the Forbes list of India's top 100 billionaires.

Mukesh Ambani, the chairman and managing director of Reliance Industries, has once again claimed the top position on Forbes' 2024 list of India's 100 richest tycoons. His wealth in-

creased by \$27.5 billion over the past year, bringing his total net worth to \$119.5 billion. This growth makes him the secondlargest gainer in dollar terms this year, while also securing his rank as the 13th richest person in the world. 'The biggest dollar gainer is

infrastructure magnate Gautam Adani, who posted a strong recovery from last year's shortselling attack and recently placed his sons and nephews in key positions," the report noted. With his brother Vinod



Madrid, Oct 10: Rafael Nadal announced his impending retirement from tennis Thursday at age 38 after winning 22 Grand Slam singles titles during an unprecedented era he shared with his rivals in the so-called 'Big Three', Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic. Nadal said he will retire after next month's Davis Cup finals.

"Really, everything I have experienced has been a dream come true," Nadal said in an announcement on social media. "I leave with the absolute peace of mind of having given my best, of having made an effort in every way," the Spanish great added.

The Spaniard, a huge fan of Brazilian football great Ronaldo, indicated his decision was related to persistent injury problems. "The reality is that it has been some difficult years, these last two especially. I don't think I have been able to play without limitations. It is obviously a difficult decision, one that has taken me some time to make. But in this life, everything has a beginning and an end," Nadal said.

Nadal's unrelenting, physical style of play - every point pursued as though it was his last, sprinting and sliding into place for that high-bouncing bullwhip of a lefty forehand - made him one of the greats of the game and the unquestioned 'King of Clay'. the slow, red surface on which he claimed his record 14 French Open championships.

Mumbai, Oct 10: From the time Sir Dorabji Tata sponsored a handful of Indian athletes to the 1920 Antwerp Olympics, the Tata Group has been a constant in India's sporting landscape and the conglomerate's involvement only grew under Ratan Tata, who considered sport a 'way of life'.

The chairman emeritus of Tata Sons died here at the age of 86 Wednesday after being admitted to a hospital Monday for 'age and related medical conditions'. His death triggered an avalanche of tributes from eminent sports personalities.


From being the title sponsor of the glitzy IPL to supporting lesser followed sports like archery to owning a football team in the ISL to sponsoring a high-profile chess tournament, the Tata Group has been deeply involved with the country's sporting ecosystem. Most of these involvements grew during Ratan Tata's tenure.

Five-time World Champion and Indian chess legend Viswanathan Anand was among the first sports icons to pay tributes to the late industrialist. "It is with profound sadness that we bid farewell to a giant of industry and philanthropy. We received our Padma Vibhushan together, and I was truly touched by his humility and genteel nature," Anand wrote on 'X'.

"The chess world and I offer our deepest condolences to @RNTata2000, a human being who touched all our lives and always stood for the good of society. Rest in peace," Anand added.

The legendary Sachin Tendulkar said Ratan Tata's legacy will continue through his foundations. "In his life, and demise, Mr Ratan Tata has moved the nation. I was fortunate to spend time with him, but millions, who have never met him, feel the same grief that I feel today. Such is his impact,' Tendulkar wrote.

Double Olympic medallist Neeraj Chopra also remembered the time he spent with Ratan Tata. "I'm very sorry to hear about the passing of Shri Ratan Tata ji. He was a visionary, and I'll never forget the conversation I had with him. He inspired

"First, I would like to pay my respects to all the students who sacrificed their lives, led the anti-discrimination movement, and were martyred or injured during the people's uprising," Shakib, wrote on his Facebook page. "I sincerely apologise for my silence," he added.
