Swetashree tops OCSE-2022

Cuttack, Oct 19: Swetashree Mohapatra topped the Odisha Civil Services Examination (OCSE) 2022, the results of which were announced by the Odisha **Public Service Commission** (OPSC) here, Saturday.

Of the top 10 candidates, five including Mohapatra were women. As per the selection list published by the commission Prinkil Parbin Parida secured Rank 2 while Dipti Ranjan Pati



was third in the list.

The topper, in her reaction, said, "I am very happy after knowing the result. It was my first attempt. I would like to give the credit of my success to my parents, siblings, friends and everyone around me.'

A total of 683 candidates have cleared the examination of which 258 were women. The OCSE is conducted in three phases - preliminary examination, main examination and personality test.

A total of 92,914 candidates including 34,712 women aspirants had applied for OCSE-2022, out of which 40,586 candidates appeared at the preliminary examination

GST Council to rejig tax rates

New Delhi, Oct 19: Term life insurance policies, and senior citizens' health insurance premium are likely to be exempted from GST as most members of a state ministerial panel favoured cutting taxes to benefit the common man, an official said Saturday.

The Group of Ministers (GoM) to decide on GST on health and life insurance premiums in its meeting Saturday decided to exempt GST on premiums paid by individuals, other than senior citizens, for health insurance with coverage of up to ₹5 lakh. However, 18 per cent GST will continue to be levied for health insurance cover of over ₹5 lakh. Separately, the GoM on GST rate ra-

tionalisation, too, met Saturday and suggested that the GST Council rejig tax rates on a host of goods, including packaged drinking water, bicycles, exercise notebooks, luxury wrist watches, and

A final decision on GST on health and life insurance premiums, as well as rate rationalisation, is likely to the taken by the GST Council, chaired by Union Finance Minister and comprising state counterparts, in its meeting scheduled to take place next month. "The rate rejig exercise will help the

states and Centre to realise revenue gain of ₹22,000 crore, which will help cover the revenue loss from reduction in GST rates for insurance premiums," the official

Over 30 flights receive bomb threats

New Delhi/ Mumbai, Oct 19: More than 30 flights of various Indian airlines, including Vistara, Air India and IndiGo, received bomb threats Saturday, according to sources. Flights of Air India, IndiGo, Akasa Air, Vistara, SpiceJet, Star Air and Alliance Air have received the threats, the sources said. So far this week, at least 70 flights of Indian carriers have received bomb threats and most of them turned out to be hoaxes.

The sources added that more than 30 flights, including domestic and international ones, operated by domestic airlines have received bomb threats through social media since morning. In at least one of the flights, a note was found in the lavatory saving there was a bomb in the flight.

Vistara said five of its flights on international routes Saturday received security threats through social media while IndiGo said at least four of its flights got security-related alerts.

"Following the protocol, all relevant authorities were promptly alerted and all security procedures are being adhered to, as per the guidance from the authorities and security agencies," an airline spokesperson said in a statement. Meanwhile, the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security held a meeting with CEOs and representatives of airlines here over the issue.



Sirens wailed in Israel warning of incoming fire from Lebanon. The military said dozens of projectiles were launched. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said the drone targeted his house in the Mediterranean coastal town of Caesarea, though neither he nor his wife was at home.





Bhubaneswar, Oct 19: A cy clonic circulation, which has formed over Andaman Sea, is likely to intensify into a low pressure by October 21 and further into a depression around October 23, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said Saturday.

The low pressure may have an impact on coastal areas of north Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal and Bangladesh next week, it said

"A cyclonic circulation is formed over central Andaman Sea. Under its influence, a lowpressure area is likely to form over Bay of Bengal and adjoining north Andaman Sea around October 21. Thereafter, it is likely to move northwestwards and intensify further into a depres-

sion around October 23," IMD, in its evening bulletin, said.

Amid speculation of formation of a cyclone in October this year as forecast by certain international models, IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said a clearer picture will emerge only after formation of a lowpressure area around October 21.

'The IMD has made no prediction on whether the system will develop into a cyclonic storm. October is known as the month of cyclones and some weather models are indicating probability of cyclogenesis. We provide a forecast on the path and intensification of a system after assessing over 10 weather models. However, right now, there is no consensus among them as a lowpressure area is yet to be formed," Mohapatra said.

Though it is too early to make

a cyclone prediction, Mohapatra said, "The system is likely to have an impact on coastal areas of north Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal and Bangladesh.'

Mohapatra said that the sea condition will remain rough along and off the coast from October 22 to 25. The coastal region of Odisha is likely to receive heavy rainfall from October 23-25. He suggested the fishermen to return to shore by October 21

He confirmed that the low pressure area is likely to be formed over Bay of Bengal and adjoining north Andaman Sea October 21, it is likely to move northwestwards and intensify further into a depression around October 23.

Mohapatra, in a video message, said that the squally weather with wind speed 35 kmph to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail over eastcentral and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal October 21 and 22.

The IMD said that light to moderate rain/thundershower is very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of south Odisha, north coastal Odisha and dry weather is very likely to prevail over the districts of north interior Odisha The IMD also forecast thun-

derstorm with lightning very likely to occur at isolated places in Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati districts

Govt to change name of 'Ama Odisha, Nabin Odisha'

Bhubaneswar, Oct 19: Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabinarayan Naik Saturday said that the state government has decided to change the name of 'Ama Odisha, Nabin Odisha' to 'Bikasit Gaan,

The 'Ama Odisha, Nabin Odisha', a flagship rural welfare scheme, was launched by the previous BJD government before the general elections.

A new guideline related to the scheme will be released by the government in two days, Naik said.

The minister said according to the revised guidelines, the opinion of the 'palli sabha' (community meeting) or 'gram sabha' will be given utmost importance, and the panchayat representatives will have the power to implement various projects under the scheme for the development of the villages. The villages will be developed as per proposals from the locals, the minister said. It aims to develop villages with various facilities such as internet, sports infrastructure, training hubs for self-help groups (SHGs), banking, and digital connectivity.

Accused 'helps' City cops in tricky Raj ops

Bhubaneswar, Oct 19: After drawing a blank in a hot pursuit for a criminal in the dusty plains of Haryana last month, lit tle did an investigation team from Odisha Police expect that an alleged partner in the crime would turn out to be a helping hand in apprehending two wanted cyber offenders in a desert town of Rajasthan in a protracted and tricky operation.

On September 23, a three-member team from the Cyber Crime and Economic Offences Police Station of the Commissionerate Police, led by Sub-Inspector Pratap Das who was assisted by constables-Subham Mohapatra and Rashmiranjan Jali, set out on a mission to Delhi to bring to book the main suspect in a ₹2 crore digital fraud registered a week back. The sleuths had already succeeded in nabbing one of the accused in the case and based on the information ferreted out from him, went after his associate who was holed up in the national capital.

Das said they took the arrested accused with them purposefully as the former would help identify the wanted accused.

Working on the information that the wanted accused lived in Chandni Chowk area of Delhi, the cops laid a trap in the vicinity. "As per our plans, his associate would call him for a rendezvous. And as soon as he was spotted at the place, we'd nab him," Das said, adding that the plan went havwire as the wanted accused has got a whiff of the police plans and fled to Narnaul in Haryana, at least 130-km from Gurgaon.

the police team left for Narnaul in the late hours of September 24 and sought cooperation of the local police (Sadar police station). Das said the Station House Officer (SHO) was uncooperative and refused any assistance during a raid at a suspected hideout of the wanted accused.

This made the task of the police team impossible in the unknown territory. "We finally gave up as long hours of journey had already taken a toll on us," Das

While the policemen were planning to return, they were

On receipt of the information,

back in Bhubaneswar, who were tracking the operation, about a couple of cyber criminals in another case whose mobile phone GPS location was traced to a place in Churu district of neighbouring Rajasthan. "Since Churu was only 145-kilometre from Narnaul, we decided to pursue the case," Das said.

Meanwhile, the arrested accused accompanying the police team all the while had struck a

rapport of sorts with the memalerted by some senior officers bers of the team. "We decided to take his help further in pursuing the fresh lead as he was more familiar with the north Indian terrains and language which we were lacking," Das added.

Moreover, the accused earlier worked in mills in Delhi and textile markets in various north-Indian cities which gave him familiarity of the topography and local mannerism. "We convinced him to travel with us till Churu

district to help us in the detection of the case. He agreed,' Das said.

Das' hunch proved correct. They were faced with hostility from Ratan Nagar police station as the SHO there belonged to the same community as the two wanted criminals. "Here the accompanying criminal played his trick. He coaxed the SHO to agree to our demands and soon, we were allotted the required number of police constables who helped us in nabbing the two accused," Das said while identifying them as Naveen Kumar Jangir, 22, and Mukesh Kumar Sheela, 26.

The City police team finally returned triumphant with the arrested accused. As a reward to the "helper's" unconditional support, the cyber police did not oppose his bail when he was produced in the court September 27.

'During the course of investigation, we found his involvement in the case was mostly peripheral, and also he was cooperative all through. That's why we decided not to press for his custody," Das chuckled.

A few days into her joining, the couple allegedly forced her to solicit male customers. When the girl protested, the accused duo took away her mobile phone and locked her up in a room. Later,

Starch-digesting gene likely evolved before farming did

New Delhi, Oct 19: Genes that help humans digest carbohydrates could have started evolving more than 800,000 years ago, long before the advent of farming, a new study has found.

Analysing the genomes of 68 ancient humans, including a 45,000-year-old sample from Siberia, researchers at the University at Buffalo, US, found that pre-agricultural huntergatherers already had about four to eight copies of the amylase, or 'AMY1', gene -- known to help break down starchy foods such as bread and pasta.

Gene duplication, whereby a gene copies itself and grows in number, is considered a major driver of evolution.

The results showed that the early duplication of the gene helped human adapt to starchy



foods and set the stage for the wide genetic variation that still exists today, influencing how humans digest starchy foods effectively, the team said.

"The idea is that the more amylase genes you have, the more amylase you can produce and the more starch you can digest effectively," Omer Gokcumen, a professor in the department of biological sciences, University of Buffalo, and corresponding author of the study published in the jour-

nal Science, said. The initial copies of the amylase gene was like "the first ripple in a pond, creating a genetic opportunity that later shaped our species," the researchers explained.

As humans spread across different environments, the gene's copies provided an advantage for adapting to new diets, particularly those rich in starch, they said.

The team also found that the amylase gene duplications occurred in Neanderthals and Denisovans -- both close and extinct relatives of the modern humankind

'This suggests that the (amylase) gene may have first duplicated more than 800,000 years ago, well before humans split from Neanderthals and much further back than previously thought," lead author Kwondo Kim, The Jackson Laboratory for Genomic Medicine, US, said.

ASHA misappropriates women's money, absconds with daughter

Purushottampur, Oct 19: In a shocking incident, an Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) and her daughter at Rishipur village under this police limits in Ganjam district, under the pretense of providing healthcare services to women, obtained their signatures and availed loans worth lakhs of rupees in their names from various finance companies before fleeing.

The matter came to light after the women staged a protest in front of Purushottampur police station Saturday demanding immediate arrest of the culprit. Notably, the affected women had filed a complaint in this regard five days back. Following the complaint, police had registered a case (667/24) against the ASHA and her daughter. However, they have not taken significant action prompting the women to

On the other hand, due to the absence of the ASHA in the village, newborns, mothers and pregnant women have been deprived of vaccinations and other services for the past two months.

Subhasini Pattnaik of Rishipur village lodged the complaint stating that 60 women in the village had formed a selfhelp group, with the ASHA identified as Kuni Pattnaik serving as the group leader. They had been facilitating loans from various finance companies.

However, in recent months Pinki withdrew money from the women's accounts without their knowledge and transferred funds, after which they absconded. The women became aware of the fraud when finance company employees started visiting their homes to collect the monthly installments, which had not been repaid.

The protesting women alleged that since Kuni was an ASHA in the village, she used to ask for signatures under the pretext of healthcare services and collected bank passbooks, telling women that they would receive financial aid through government schemes. The women have accused her of misappropriating money this way. An investigation is ongoing and action will be taken, said the investigating officer Kshetramohan Sahu.

Unsafe ghat roads endanger lives of local tribals, tourists

Keonihar, Oct 19: Travelling in the forested hilly areas of Keonihar district has become a risky proposition due to lack of proper maintenance of the ghat roads. Hazards such as frequent landslides continue to endanger the life of the commuters on the routes in the absence of repair and upkeep.

Moreover, mindless felling of trees for road construction and the landslides also lead to widespread deforestation in the dis-

Hills are being cut into size and roads are being built to facilitate communication and smooth transportation of cargo. However, after the construction gets over the roads in the forested areas are not properly managed causing mud and stones to come crumbling down the hills.

Landslides damage the roads and result in traffic snarls apart from endangering the lives of the commuters if they happen to pass by the route during the

Similarly, remnants of the felled roadside trees get uprooted and fall on the roads due to lack of proper barricading of the hill sides. As people continue to travel perilously on the ghat roads, they often meet with accidents resulting in loss of lives and properties.

Meanwhile, forest dwellers are demanding that such risky stretches of the ghat roads be identified and properly managed. They claimed that the administration has no fund constraints for the purpose due to the presence of District Mineral Foundation and mining houses.

Locals said that these problems can be addressed by marking and barricading such sensitive stretches and packing the roadsides properly with

The Bayapandadhar-Gonasika road under Bansapal block in this district connecting Gonasika tourist site, the origin of the Baitarani river, is a case in this point. This road was built long ago by cutting the hills. Local forest dwellers and tourists travel on this road in large numbers.

However, in some places, the hills have been cut and the roadsides are in an unsafe condition. They alleged that huge boulders and soil chunks fall on the road when it rains continuously. Similarly, due to rampant soil erosion, big trees along the road are in unsafe condition and could get uprooted at any moment.

In case of excess rain, there is every possibility of the trees collapsing on the road increasing the possibility of severe accidents and road blockades. There have been

many such incidents in the past, but the administration is yet to address the issue, they lamented.

Banspal Block Development Officer (BDO) Bikrani Kispat said that the road is a major link of communication as it is used by a lot of people and tourists. However, since this road belongs to the Rural Development department, the authorities will be informed to take steps to address the problems.

Environmentalists alleged that due to departmental apathy, landslides occur on many roads in the hilly areas such as Judia Ghat and Kanjipani Ghat in regular intervals.

It is also alleged that forests and local environment get destroved due to lack of coordination between the road construction agencies and the Forest

Blast in fire cracker making unit; four minors critical

As the blaze engulfed him, Maihi ran from one house to the other, screaming and shouting in pain. As no one came forward to help him, he finally jumped into a pond.

He was rescued from the pond by his family who admitted him to the Sinapali government hospital. As his condition was critical, he was transferred to the district headquarters hospital, police said.

'The villagers had called a meeting and threatened my father with dire consequences for performing black magic

As he denied the charges, they first beat him up and then set him on fire," alleged Majhi's son Hemlal.

SDPO of Khariar Arup Behera said a case was registered at the Sinapali police station, a search was underway for the accused persons

Most of the people have fled their houses when police reached the village, he said.

SNAKEBITE KILLS MAN, DAUGHTER

Harabhanga, Oct 19: In a tragic incident, a man and his minor daughter died after being bitten by a poisonous snake at Thidikajora village near Charichhak Bazaar under Harabhanga block in Boudh district late Friday night.

The deceased were identified as Sushanta Kanhara, 46, and his daughter Subhasmita Kanhara, 16, natives of Gumagada village in Kandhamal district. Sushanta had been serving as a teacher for over 20 years in Harabhanga block of Boudh district and was living with his family in a rented house in Thidikajora village near Charichhak

Sushanta along with his daughter and wife went to sleep after finishing dinner Friday night. Around 11pm, a venomous snake crawled onto the cot where Sushanta was sleeping and bit him on the left foot. At the same time, his daughter Subhasmita, who was sleeping nearby, was also bitten on her left foot by the snake. However, his wife was unharmed.

After the snakebite, both Sushanta and his daughter did not realise they had been bitten. An hour later, Subhasmita woke up complaining of chest pain, and Sushanta too started feeling dizzy.

They were immediately rushed to the Phulbani district headquarters hospital by the neighbours. However, upon arrival at the hospital, Subhasmita was declared brought dead by the doctors. Shortly, Sushanta too succumbed to the snakebite while undergoing treatment.

Subhasmita was a Plus II second-year student at a private college and had come home for the Dussehra holidays.

After post-mortem, the bodies were handed over to the family, and their last rites were performed in their native village at Gumagada.

The death of the teacher and his daughter has cast a shadow of grief on the teaching community and students in Harabhanga block.

Unwritten Strategy

The international rules-based order is a euphemism for the jungle rule that defines global power politics. "The strong do what they can and the weak suffer what they must" is a line from a famous history text written some 2400 years ago that is the foundation of international relations theory. This is true even today despite our myriad institutions including the United Nations and its security council. For instance try telling Palestinians or Lebanese that there is an international order, while their children are being murdered in onesided war. Or for that matter, Ukrainians, Iranians, Cubans, Vietnamese and Afghans. Given this reality, it is natural that states will operate only or mostly in self-interest when it comes to international affairs. This is how it is and that is understandable.

India is accused of violating the order by ordering attacks on individuals in foreign nations that it is supposedly friendly with. The reality is that if India feels a threat emanating from across its borders, and it senses it is strong enough to get away with an action, it will act. This is also understandable.

Several questions arise but let us examine one in particular. What is the nature of the threat that we are alleged to have acted against and how grave a threat is it?

The data on fatalities will tell us something meaningful. The South Asia Terrorism Portal says that violence in Punjab seriously began in 1984 when 456 people were killed. This was of course the year of Operation Blue Star and the assassination of a prime minister. Fatalities peaked three decades ago, in 1991. In that year over 5000 people were killed. The next year it dropped but was still almost 4000. After that it collapsed. From 1998 to 2014, the number of annual fatalities has most often been zero (in 12 years). In the past six years it has not gone above single digits and no security official has been killed.

If the government and the security establishment think it is still a serious enough threat to national security to merit the sort of actions that it has been accused of taking, this thinking must surely be reflected somewhere. Disliking what someone says is not the same thing as feeling a national security threat from them. So where can we find what our government says regarding threats to our national security? The answer appears to be: Nowhere.

In January 2021, a think-tank put out a paper by a retired general. He wrote that the changes introduced in the military gave an opportunity for the pioneering in-

what they can and the weak suffer cumbent (it was then Gen Bipin Rawat) to display his strategic and military acumen. what they must Unfortunately, the report concluded that the Chief of Defence Staff was "yet to articulate a defence strategy. One reason for this likely was that the government is yet to determine what the nature of the problem is. Six years ago had come the creation in 2018 of the Defence Planning Committee. This was to be chaired by National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and include the foreign secretary, defence secretary, chief of defence staff, three service chiefs and secretaries of the Ministry of Finance. It had the enormous tasks, according to a piece in the Manohar Parrikar Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses, of looking after "national defence and

security priorities, foreign policy imperatives, operational directives and associated requirements, relevant strategic and security-related doctrines, defence acquisition and infrastructure development plans, national security strategy, strategic defence review and doctrines, international defence engagement strategy," and so on. It met once, on 3 May 2018, and does not appear to have met after that. This is surprising for a government and a party that puts, or at least says it puts, a grea deal of priority on national security.

In May this year, a newspaper published a report on this aspect under the headline: "Absence of written National Security Strategy doesn't mean India doesn't have one: CDS.'


Former general Prakash Menon has noted that, for several decades, India's political guidance to the military had been oriented towards Pakistan as the immediate threat. But now that the Chinese threat was at the doorstep, this would have to change. The political objectives expected to be achieved by the military resided in a document called the "Raksha Mantri's Operational Directive," which was written by the then defence minister AK Antony in 2009. All it says is that the armed forces "should be prepared to fight on both fronts simultaneously a war at 30 days (intense) and 60 days (normal) rates." This is a reference to ammunition and spares and not really a doctrine.

Even this directive, Gen Menon said, "continues to lack parentage for the lack of a coherent National Security Strategy. The Defence Planning Committee, headed by the NSA, was assigned this task two years ago. Nothing has emerged so far." This is what happens to complex enterprises that are run from the top but with no interest in detail. The national security strategy of an aspiring great power is unwritten because there is no ownership of the intellectual aspects of the work, little application, little enthusiasm for the hard but boring tasks and too much focus and emphasis on meaningless and marginal spectacle.

Our contrasting responses to the United States and to Canada on the same issue have been highlighted. However, that is the nature of the international order and the strong do what they can and the weak suffer what they must.

What must also be highlighted is the issue of rationale. Have we thought through the nature of our national security problems before we begin working on solutions? The answer to that is no.

new age of international relations is dawning. With the West accounting for a declining share of global GDP. and the world becoming increasingly multipolar, countries are jostling to establish their positions in the emerging order. This includes both the emerging economies - represented by the recently expanded BRICS grouping – that seek a leading role in writing the rules of the new order, and the smaller countries attempting to cultivate relationships that can safeguard their interests.

With the BRICS, what began as an asset class has become a symbol of the yearning for a more broadly representative global order, a hedge against Western-led institutions, and a means of navigating growing geopolitical uncertainty. All this has proved highly attractive. Earlier this year, the BRICS expanded from five countries (Brazil, China, India, Russia, and South Africa) to nine (adding Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates). And almost three dozen more countries – including NATO member Turkey, close US partners Thailand and Mexico, and Indonesia, the world's largest Muslim country - have applied

While the diversity of the grouping's members (and applicants) highlights the broad appeal of the BRICS+, it also creates challenges. These are countries with very different political systems, economies, and national goals. Some are even at odds with each other: China and India have been locked in a military standoff in the Himalayas for over four years, following China's stealth encroachments on Indian territory.

Translating shared interests into a common plan of action, and becoming a unified force on the global stage, was difficult even when the BRICS had just five members. With nine and possibly more - member countries, establishing a common identity and agenda will require sustained effort. But other

multilateral groupings that are not formal, charter-based institutions with permanent secretariats – such as the Shanghai Cooperation Organization, the G20, and even the G7 – also struggle with internal divisions.

Moreover, the BRICS has demonstrated considerable resilience. Western analysts have been predicting from the start that the grouping would unravel or drift into irrelevance. Yet this month's BRICS+ summit in Kazan, Russia - the first since the expansion - may well bring movement toward further enlargement, as it underscores the West's failure to isolate Russia following its 2022 invasion of Ukraine.

This is not to underestimate the challenge of cohesion. The grouping's founding members do not even agree about its fundamental objectives: whereas China and Russia want to spearhead a direct challenge to the United States-led world order, Brazil and India seek reforms of existing international institutions and appear uneasy about any anti-Western orientation.

In this disagreement, however, the enlargement might tip the scales. Six of the group's nine members, including all four of the new additions, are formally part of the nonaligned movement, and two (Brazil and China) are observers. This suggests that there will be considerable internal pressure for the BRICS+ to chart a middle ground, focusing on democratising the global order, rather than challenging the West.

That said, when it comes to fostering mutual trust with developing countries, the West has not been doing itself any favours lately. On the contrary, its weaponisation of finance and seizure of the interest earned on frozen Russian central-bank assets have caused deepening disquiet in the non-Western world. As a result. a growing number of countries seem interested in exploring alternative arrangements, including new cross-border payment mechanisms, with some also reassessing their reliance on the US dollar in international transactions and reserve

All of this could aid the larger designs of Russia and China, two natural competitors that have become close strategic partners partly in response to US policy. China, in particular, stands to gain, such as from in-

creased international use of the renminbi. Russia now generates much of its international export earnings in renminbi and stores them mostly in Chinese banks, thereby effectively giving China a share of the returns. China's ultimate goal – which Western financial warfare is inadvertently aiding - is to establish an alternative renminbibased financial system.

The BRICS is already engaged in institution-building, having established the New Development Bank – conceived by India and headquartered in Shanghai-in 2015. The NDB is not only the world's first multilateral devel opment bank created and led by emerging economies; it is also the only one whose founding members remain equal shareholders with equal voice, even as more countries join. By contrast, the US is the dominant shareholder and holds veto power in the World Bank.

The grouping dwarfs the G7, both demographically (with nearly 46% of the world's population, compared to the G7's 8.8%) and economically (accounting for 35% of global GDP, compared to the G7's 30%). Its economies are also likely to be the most important source of future global growth. Furthermore, with Iran and the UAE having joined their oil-producing counterparts Brazil and Russia as members, the BRICS+ now accounts for about 40% of crude-oil production and exports.

Yes, the group faces significant challenges, not least uniting to become a meaningful global force with defined (and realistic) political and economic objectives. But it also has the potential to serve as a catalyst for a long-overdue re vamping of global governance so that it better reflects twenty-firstcentury realities.

AM S. Jaishankar was in Pakistan early this week. Observers both in India and abroad are interpreting this visit as the beginning of a thaw between India and Pakistan. The deliberations and informal interactions of Jaishankar with Pakistani leadership including his counterpart may indicate to such a possibility. At the same time, it may be noted that the EAM was attending the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit. There was no bilateral component in his visit. However, it is worth our while to examine both these interpretations.

The SCO is important for India as New Delhi would not like to isolate from friendly-countries like Russia, Central Asian States and Iran. The deliberations in SCO were guarded perhaps in view of the sensitivity between India and Pakistan. Any controversy involving both countries was avoided. Pakistani PM Shahbaz Sharif significantly made no reference to the Kashmir dispute in his speech, a departure from their tradition.

New Delhi had stayed away from multilateral meetings held or scheduled to be held in Islamabad. That includes the SAARC Summit. Second, PM Narendra Modi, abstaining from attending the meeting suggests that New Delhi has diluted its participation. SCO summit calls upon Heads of government to attend. Third Jaishankar was quite

sharp in his articulation on India's position and perspectives. He urged the members to have an "honest conversation." He added, "If trust is lacking, if friendship has fallen short and good neighbourliness is missing somewhere, there are surely reasons to introspect and causes to address." He alluded to China's BRI and said that cooperation on trade, investment, connectivity, and energy flows must respect territorial integrity and sovereignty of countries. He picked three evils of SCO Charter which are: terrorism, separatism, extremism. He underlined that if activities across borders are reflecting these three evils, they are hardly likely to enhance bilateral relations.

Pakistan's Information Minister Ataullah Tarar said to one of the leading Indian newspapers, "there has been a lot in the past between India and Pakistan. Any new ini-

tiative in future would be dictated purely by the principle of reciprocity." From such statements, it appears that Jaishankar's presence in Pakistan may not lead towards reconciliation. Jaishankar himself had stated in Delhi before his departure that, "I am going to Pakistan to be a good member of SCO." So, we are back to square one. Remember that India suspended any dialogue with Pakistan citing a principle that "talks and terror cannot go hand in hand. This happened after the Pulwama attack in 2019 which claimed the lives of 40 Indian soldiers.

Let us accept the obvious premise that India-Pakistan relations will not improve unless Pakistan becomes a genuine democracy by freeing itself of the stranglehold of its army. The Pakistani army is corrupt, selfish and selfserving unlike Indian Army which is known for its valour, apolitical approach and sacrifice. Pakistani population is well-disposed to India. In my visits to Pakistan, I have always felt at home. Many Indian visitors have similar experience. Pakistanis look up to India for sustaining democracy, diversity, the spirit of accommodation and tolerance. They have hardly anything in common with Chinese.

Given a free choice, Pakistani people and their leadership will veer towards India for the said and other reasons. Likewise, the leadership in New Delhi should stop using Pakistan as an election plank to consolidate the Hindu electorate. That is not in the longterm interest of India. One can win elections but lose friends in neighhourhood and endanger its own security. Former PM Atal Behari Vajpayee used to say, "You can change your friends, but not your neighbours."

Therefore, it is in India's national interest to use this opportunity and rebuild bridges with Pakistan. India's main adversary is China. Weaning away Pakistan from China would be a strategic move. Russia may give a hand to India to normalise relations with Pakistan. A normalisation of India-Pakistan relations is in the interest of both countries as well as the South Asian region.

been kept on alert, he announced that the Anti Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) would be further strengthened and the ANTF would be headed by a senior retired IPS officer.

The Minister said that he would soon visit Delhi to apprise the concerned Central ministry about the seriousness and growing drug threat in Meghalaya.

Lyngdoh said that earlier only the police department was dealing with drug-related activities and now various departments and wings are very proactive to curb the drug-related challenges. Meghalava Chief Minister

Conrad Sangma personally looked after the matter and it shows the level of seriousness of the government, he said. "We are in the process of con-



Guwahati, Oct 19: The 51.38-km Bhairabi-Sairang new railway line project connecting Aizawl in Mizoram with the rest of the country is at an advanced completion stage, an official statement said Saturday.

Around 17.38 km of the new line was completed and commissioned in July this year with train services operational from August, according to the statement issued by

Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) Saturday. The 51.38 km new railway line

between Bhairabi and Sairang is divided into four sections Bhairabi–Hortoki,

Hortoki-Kawnpui, Kawnpui-Mualkhang and Mualkhang-Sairang, it said.

The whole project once completed will be a game-changer in terms of communication and commerce for the people of Mizoram

The construction work of the Bhairabi-Sairang railway project involves 48 tunnels in tough terrains. The total length of tunnels in this project is 12,853 metres out of which 12,807 metres of tunneling work has already been completed, the statement said. The project will have a total of 55 major bridges and 87 minor

Construction work on the project's tallest pier, 104 metres, at the approach of Sairang station has also been completed.

The project also includes five road overbridges and six road underbridges, and there will be four stations - Hortoki, Kawnpui, Mualkhang, and Sairang.

There are many challenges in executing the project, such as less working time due to very

heavy and prolonged monsoon, very tough and hilly terrain through deep forests, poor accessibility, non-availability of construction materials and skilled labour in Mizoram, it said, adding that NF

Railway is, however, making all efforts to fulfil its commitment towards early completion of the project.

This will provide enhanced connectivity to the people of Mizoram, help grow small-scale industries in the area and boost tourism in the state, the statement said.

It will also ensure substantial cost reduction on transportation of passengers and various materials and commodities to this hilly state to cater to the needs of the local population, the statement added.

Ex-spy wanted by US was held last year

New Delhi, Oct 19: Vikas Yaday, a former Indian government of ficial charged by the US authorities for his alleged role in a foiled plot to assassinate Sikh separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun on American soil, was arrested by Delhi Police in December last year in an unrelated extortion and kidnapping case, police sources said.

According to the sources, the Special Cell of Delhi Police arrested Yadav (39) December 18, 2023, for allegedly kidnapping a businessman living in Rohini and demanding money in the name of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi.

He was granted bail in April this year, the sources said. According to the FIR filed by the Special Cell, Yadav told the businessman to meet him near the office of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in south Delhi December 11, 2023, claiming he might face a 'serious threat".

Accordingly, the victim along with his friend met Yadav who was accompanied by a person



named Abdullah. Yadav and Abdullah allegedly pushed the victim into a car and demanded money in the name of Lawrence Bishnoi, the FIR said.

The accused duo also forced him to sign a blank cheque before dropping him near his car after threatening him with dire consequences if he told anyone about his ordeal, it added.

After returning home, the victim came to know that Yadav and his associate also took ₹50.000 kept in his cafe and deleted all the CCTV recordings, the FIR said

The police booked Yadav and Abdullah under sections 364A (kidnapping for ransom), 307 (attempt to murder), 328 (causing

harm to another person using poison), 506 (criminal intimidation), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 341 (wrong restraint), 392 (robbery), 411 (dishonestly receiving stolen property) and 120B (criminal conspiracy) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The police filed a charge sheet naming Yadav March 13 this year before he was granted interim bail for six days March 22 on grounds of "illness" of his one-year-old daughter. The court April 22 granted regular bail to Yadav.

Notably, the interim bail order referred to Yadav as "an ex-government employee having clean antecedents"

The federal prosecutors Thursday claimed in an indictment filed in a US court that Yadav was employed by the Cabinet Secretariat, which houses the Research and Analysis Wing (RAW), India's foreign intelligence service.

Yadav, who is at large, faces murder-for-hire and money laundering charges in connection with his alleged role in the foiled plot to kill Pannun, the US Department of Justice said.

'Unnecessary': SC on Madras HC order

New Delhi, Oct 19: The Supreme Court has termed "unnecessary" the Madras High Court's order to police in Tamil Nadu's Coimbatore to probe the Isha Foundation by expanding the ambit of the habeas corpus petition of a father who had alleged that his two daughters were kept under captivity in ashram.

After interaction with the two individuals in respect of whom the petition was filed, a bench headed by CJI DY Chandrachud said that both the sisters had attained the age of majority and were majors even when they joined the Ashram.

They have expressed their clear inclination to continue at Isha Foundation at Coimbatore. In this view, the purpose of the Habeas Corpus petition is duly fulfilled," the bench, also comprising Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, said.

Disposing of the matter, the apex court said that it would be unnecessary to expand the ambit of proceedings which arose from the habeas corpus petition filed before the Madras High Court.

Further, it said that the ju-

risdiction of the High Court under Article 226 of the Constitution, while dealing with a habeas corpus petition, is welldefined and no further directions were necessary by the Madras High Court after it interacted with both the daugh ters of the petitioner. "The closure of these proceedings, it is clarified, will not affect any other regulatory compliances which are required to be achieved by Isha Foundation," the SC said, recording the statement of senior advocate Mukul Rohtagi, who appeared on behalf of Isha Foundation, that any such requirementswould be duly complied with in accordance with the law.

government to address the pollution levels in the river, especially as major festivals like Chhath Puja are approaching.

The pungent foam contains high levels of ammonia and phosphates, posing serious health risks, including respiratory and skin problems, according to environmental experts.

This kind of foam formation is common when fats from decaying plants and pollutants mix with the water, but its presence during monsoon is surprising, said another expert, attributing the frothing to the absence of flood spells that typically wash away pollutants.



Ch'garh: 2 jawans killed in IED blast PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Narayanpur, Oct 19: Two personnel of Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) were killed and two policemen injured Saturday when Naxalites carried out an improvised explosive device (IED) blast in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district, police said.

The incident occurred around 12 noon in Kodliyar forest in the Abujhmaad area when joint teams of security personnel were out on an anti-Naxal operation. Inspector General of Police (Bastar Range) Sundarraj said.

Personnel from the ITBP, Border Security Force (BSF), and the state police's District Reserve Guard, Bastar Fighters and District Force were involved in the operation launched from Orchha, Irakbhatti and Mohandi areas, he said.

The blast took place when patrolling teams were returning after the operation.

Four security personnel suffered injuries in the attack, the official said.



Those killed were identified as Amar Pawar (36) of Satara in Maharashtra and K Rajesh (36) of Kadappa in Andhra Pardesh, he said, adding that the duo belonged to ITBP's 53rd battalion.

After post-mortem and wreath laying, their mortal remains will be sent to their native places, IG Sundarraj said.

The injured personnel were airlifted and admitted to a private hospital in Raipur.

Mamata urges junior doctors to end strike

Kolkata, Oct 19: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Saturday urged the junior doctors protesting the rape and murder of their colleague at RG Kar Hospital to end their fast-unto-death stir, stating that most of their demands have been addressed while rejecting their insistence on removing the state health secretary.

Taking forward the proposal for talks, Chief Secretary Manoj Pant later in the evening invited the medics for talks with Baneriee for "45 minutes" Monday at the state secretariat, conditional upon the "withdrawal" of the hunger strike.

However, the protesting doctors refused to end their hunger strike until all their demands were met but agreed to join the talks Monday.

Speaking to the doctors over the phone during a visit by Pant and Home Secretary Nandini Chakraborty to the protest site in Esplanade this afternoon, Banerjee said, "Everybody has the right to protest, but it shouldn't affect healthcare services. I would request you all to withdraw vour fast.

Banerjee rejected the junior doctors' demand for the removal of state Health Secretary Narayan Swaroop Nigam, explaining that "it is not possible to remove everyone in a de-

The junior doctors have been on fast-unto-death for the last 15 days, demanding justice for their deceased colleague and calling for systemic changes in the state's healthcare infrastructure. So far, six doctors on hunger strike have been hospitalised due to deteriorating health, while eight others remain on an indefinite fast, demanding that the state government take constructive action by October 21 to resolve the deadlock.

The CM stressed that the doctors should withdraw their strike and meet her at state secretariat Nabanna Monday to further discuss their demands. "I have removed the Commissioner of Police (CP), the Director of Medical Education (DME), and the Director of Health Services (DHS), but I cannot remove everyone in the department,'

New Delhi, Oct 19: Breast cancer, a disease long associated with older age groups, has surged enormously in women aged below 50 in the last three decades, according to experts.

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer affecting women worldwide, as well as in India. The recent data from the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) showed that breast cancer accounted for 28.2 per cent of cancers in women

Celebrities like Sonali Bendre, Tahira Kashyap, and Mahima Chaudhry who battled breast cancer under 50 and overcame the deadly disease with treatments

Dr Ashish Gupta, Chief of Medical Oncology at Unique Hospital Cancer Centre, who is spearheading the Cancer Mukt Bharat Campaign in India, said "Cancer is no longer the disease of older adults. It is increasingly seen among women in the younger age group, majorly under 50.3

The early onset of breast cancer is majorly due to genes, lifestyle factors such as poor nutrition, consumption of highly ultra-processed foods and a completely sedentary lifestyle coupled with environment pollutants, he said.

According to a recent study by Cancer Mukt Bharat Foundation, cancer is affecting about 20 per cent of young people below the age of 40 in India

NIA moves SC _ challenging 17 PFI members' bail

New Delhi, Oct 19: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has moved the Supreme Court challenging a Kerala High Court order which granted bail to 17 Popular Front of India (PFI) members in the 2022 murder case of RSS leader Srinivasan

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih was told by Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhatti, appearing for the NIA, that the agency has filed 17 separate appeals in the matter. She informed the bench that the Kerala High Court, in its impugned order dated June 25, granted bail to the 17 accused and rejected the bail pleas of nine accused.

"We have filed 17 separate Special Leave Petitions. This court may take up all the SLPs together," she urged the bench Friday. The bench, which was hearing a plea of one of the accused, Saddam Hussain MK, whose bail plea was rejected by the high court, directed the registry to seek permission from Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud to list all matters together.

All the accused, who were granted bail are also facing trial for allegedly instigating communal violence in Kerala as well as various other parts of the country. The high court had passed the judgement on the pleas filed by the 26 accused against a special court's orders denying them bail.

While granting bail to 17 of the 26 accused, the high court had imposed stringent conditions on them. They were asked to share their mobile numbers and real-time GPS locations with the investigating officer. Besides, the court asked the accused not to leave Kerala, surrender their passports andkeep their mobile phones charged and active round the clock.



UN expands arms embargo on Haiti

United Nations: The UN Security Council voted unanimously Friday to expand the arms embargo in Haiti to all types of weapons and ammunition, expressing grave concern at the extremely high levels of gang violence and criminal activities in the impoverished Caribbean nation. The resolution authorizes the 193 UN member nations to take "appropriate steps to prevent the illicit trafficking and diversion of arms and related materiel in Haiti." UN experts have said increasingly sophisticated weapons that end up in the hands of gang members and criminals are being trafficked from the US, especially from Florida. The resolution also extends a travel ban and asset freeze on individuals on the UN sanctions blacklist for a vear. In late September, the sanctions on Haiti added two people to the list, which included five gang leaders.

17 Indian fishermen repatriated from SL

Colombo: Seventeen Indian fishermen arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy for allegedly poaching in the island nation's waters have been repatriated. according to the Indian mission here. Fishermen from both countries are arrested frequently for inadvertently trespassing into each other's waters. "Homecoming! 17 Indian fishermen have been successfully repatriated and are on their way to Tamil Nadu India." the High Commission of India here said in a post on X Friday. The fishermen issue is a contentious topic in the bilateral ties, with Lankan Navy personnel even firing at Indian fishermen in the Palk Strait and seizing their boats in several alleged incidents of illegally entering Sri Lankan territorial waters. Sri Lanka claims a similar attitude by Indian authorities

Biggest drugs bust: Mexico arrests 23

Mexico City: Mexico's navy said Friday it had arrested 23 people in its largest-ever drugs bust, seizing some 8.4 thousand kilograms of illicit cargo in an operation off the country's southwestern Pacific coast. "This represents the largest quantity of drugs seized in a maritime operation without precedent in the history of the institution," the navy said in a statement. The navy also seized 8.7 thousand liters of fuel and six boats of the coast near Lazaro Cardenas, in Michoacan state, and further south off the coast of Guerrero state.

Indian diplomats 'clearly on notice': Canada

Toronto, Oct 19: Canada's Minister of Foreign Affairs Mélanie Joly Friday said the remaining Indian diplomats in the country are "clearly on notice" after Canada named the Indian High Commissioner in Ottawa as a person of interest in the assassination of a Sikh separatist leader.

Joly said the government would not tolerate any diplomats who contravene the Vienna Convention or put the lives of Canadians at risk.

India expelled six Canadian diplomats Monday and announced that it was withdrawing its High Commissioner in Canada after dismissing Ottawa's allegations linking the envoy to the probe into the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

Canada, however, said it had expelled six Indian diplomats. Joly, comparing India to Russia, said Canada's national

CUBA'S ELECTRICAL GRID COLLAPSES. ENTIRE COUNTRY WITHOUT POWER

Havana, Oct 19: Cuba's electrical grid collapsed again early Saturday morning, state-run media reported, plunging the entire country into blackout for a second time just hours after authorities announced they had begun reestablishing service.

CubaDebate, one of the islands state-run media outlets, said Cuba's grid operator, UNE, had reported at 6:15AM the "total disconnection of the national electro-energetic system."

"The Electric Union is working on its reestablishment," the brief message said. Cuba's electrical grid first col-

lapsed around midday Friday after one of the island's largest power plants failed, suddenly leaving more than 10 million without power.

Even before the grid's collapse, an electricity shortfall Friday had forced Cuba's communist-run government to send non-essential state workers home and cancel school classes for children as it sought to conserve fuel for generation.

But lights began to flicker on in scattered pockets across the island early in the evening Friday, offering some hope that power would be restored.

The grid operator has not yet provided any details on what caused the grid to collapse again Saturday, or how long it will take to reestablish service.

The govt has announced

emergency measures to slash electricity demand, including suspending classes, shutting down some state-owned work places and canceling nonessential services

Cuba's government has blamed weeks of worsening blackouts often 10 to 20 hours a day across_ much of the island - on deteriorating infrastructure, fuel shortages and rising demand.

Strong winds that began with Hurricane Milton last week had also complicated the island's ability to deliver scarce fuel from boats offshore to feed its power plants, officials have said.

Fuel deliveries to the island have dropped off significantly this year, as Venezuela, Russia and Mexico, once key suppliers, have reduced their exports to

Key ally Venezuela slashed by half its deliveries of subsidized fuel to Cuba this year, forcing the island to search elsewhere for far more pricey oil on the spot market.

China to understand 'fear of having kids'

BEIJING IS TRYING TO ENCOURAGE YOUNG COUPLES TO HAVE CHILDREN AFTER CHINA POSTED A SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR OF POPULATION **DECLINE IN 2023**

Hong Kong, Oct 19: China's National Health Commission (NHC) is surveying 30,000 people to understand factors influencing their attitudes towards childbearing and the "fear surrounding having children", as authorities struggle to boost a flagging birthrate.

The survey will include people from 150 counties in China and 1.500 different communities, the state-backed Global Times said late Friday, citing the China Population and Development Research Center, which falls under the NHC.

Beijing is trying to encourage young couples to have children after China posted a second



consecutive year of population decline in 2023.

The survey aims to analyse "reluctance and fear surrounding having children" and ultimately provide fertility support and incentive measures, the

newspaper said. The last time a countrywide family and fertility survey was carried out was in 2021. It comes after China's National Bureau of Statistics said it will conduct a nationwide sample survey from October 10-November 30 to monitor population changes.

Population development has often been linked to a strong and rejuvenated China in state media.

Chinese health officials said in September they would focus more efforts on advocating marriage and childbirth at "appropriate ages" and called for shared

The infrastructure firm's Rs 5,430crore IPO is a combination of a fresh issue of shares worth Rs 1,250 crore and an offer for sale (OFS) of up to Rs 4,180 crore by promoter Goswami Infratech Private Limited. The offer size has been reduced following a pre-IPO fundraising.

PFC, BEML sign agreement

New Delhi: State-owned BEML and PFC have signed an agreement to finance and execute critical infrastructure projects, particularly in the areas of defence, rail transportation and infrastructure development. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between BEML CMD Shantanu Roy and Parminder Chopra, CMD of PFC in the national capital on Friday, BEML said in a statement. BEML and PFC entered into a strategic MoU which aims at intensifying cooperation in financing and executing critical infrastructure projects narticularly in the areas of defence, rail transportation and infrastructure development, it said.

India seeks critical minerals pact with US Rural demand drives

New Delhi, Oct 19: Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal Saturday said India has proposed a critical minerals partnership agreement (CMPA) with the US, that will help domestic firms in the sector such as electric vehicles to get certain benefits in the American mar-

The issue was raised by India during a recent visit of the minister to the US earlier this month.

During the visit, the two countries signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to enhance cooperation in critical mineral supply chain.

Critical minerals, such as cobalt, copper, lithium, nickel and rare earths, play a crucial role in the production of clean energy technologies, from wind turbines to electric cars. Such minerals are in demand for the production of batteries for elec-

"I have suggested that our critical minerals MoU should be converted to a critical minerals partnership agreement and become a beginning point to go towards a free trade agreement. But as we are all aware, the US Congress is not very enthusiastic about FTA with any country," Goyal told reporters

Last year, the US and Japan signed a critical minerals agreement. A critical minerals partnership agreement between India and the US will help Indian firms in the sector to enjoy duty concessions and other benefits



to sell products from the sector in the American market.

These benefits are provided by the US under its Inflation Reduction Act, which is aimed at boosting manufacturing capabilities. The benefits are extended to American firms or a firm in the country having FTA with the US.

The CMPA is like an FTA in the critical minerals sector.

An official said the conversion of the MoU into a partnership agreement will give it the status of a trade deal, thereby enabling India to benefit from the electric vehicle tax credit that the US gives under its Inflation Reduction Act (IRA).

Goyal also said during his visit, the US industry showed keen interest to increase investments in India in different

Without disclosing name, he said a firm is looking at investments in the range of USD 10 billion in areas such as data centres and quantum computing

There were also discussions in the area of technology transfer.

"Also there is a great interest in co-development of new innovative ideas, R&D, and there was a talk of increasing collaboration to co-develop new technologies," he said, adding that the 2-3 sectors that came up for discussions included pharma, digital technology, and telecom where India is looking at 6G in a big way.

The US companies are also keen in segments such as biosimilars and bio-sciences

During the visit, Goyal also cochaired the US-India CEO Forum meeting with US Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo

The other areas of delibera tions in the forum meeting include ideas for further reduction in compliances, decriminalising business laws, "what we can do to facilitate easier flow of capitals, how to facilitate regulators to talk to each other more frequently and at some stage look at a mutual recognition agreement," he said.

He added that there were no talks on visa issues, or work permits.

Both sides are also looking to restructure the CEO forum to widen representation, bringing in an element of tourism, getting the right set of people in terms of companies, and age

The tenure of many of the members of the forum will get over in December.

"H1B visas are history now. I have invited companies to set up GCC (Global Capability Centres) in India," he said.

Further, the minister said India is looking to open investment offices in New York and Silicon Valley that will have representatives from Invest India and National Industrial Corridor Development Corporation (NICDC), and would aid investments into India.

On clean energy, the two sides discussed green hydrogen and green ammonia during his visit.

New Delhi, Oct 19: Driven by rural demand ahead of the festive season, the Indian smartphone market grew 9 per cent in the July-September period, shipping 47.1 million units, according to a new report.



Vendors cleared inventory through early monsoon sales across online and offline channels to gear up for the festive season, according to market research firm Canalys.

According to senior analyst Sanyam Chaurasia, top brands in the market are expanding their portfolio in the mid-high range, in anticipation of clearing inventory during festive sales.

"Meanwhile, brands outside the top five experienced another strong quarter. Apple drove significant volumes with the iPhone 15, with stronger demand coming from smaller cities, ahead of its latest launch," he men-

Other brands, such as Motorola, Google and Nothing, continue to drive volumes owing to strong pull factors from the unique design language, clean user interface and channel

expansion strategies. Vivo claimed the pole position for the first time amid an aggressive push across channels, capturing a 19 per cent market share and shipping 9.1 million units. Xiaomi came second, shipping 7.8 million units, driven by its budget 5G lineup, while Samsung came in third with 7.5 million units.

OPPO (excluding OnePlus) and realme completed the top five with 6.3 million and 5.3 million units shipped, respectively, according to the report.

According to the report, both

replacement and upgrade buyers leaned toward higher-priced models due to expanded mid-tohigh-end offerings, competitive trade-in deals, and accessible financing options. "However, entry-level demand

HDFC Bank net up 6%

Mumbai: HDFC Bank Saturday reported a 6 per cent increase in September quarter net profit to Rs 17,825.91 crore on a consolidated basis. On a standalone basis, the largest private sector lender's post-tax net grew to Rs 16,820.97 crore during the reporting period, as against Rs 15,976.11 crore in the year-ago period. Its core net interest income grew 10 per cent to Rs 30,010 crore on the back of a 7 per cent increase in gross advances and the margins being stable at 3.46 per cent. The bank, which had guided towards doubling in size in four years recently, is operating as per market dynamics right now, its Chief Financial Officer S Vaidyanathan told reporters here on a call. Pointing to the 15 per cent deposit growth, he said it is focusing on the liabilities and keep ing the credit growth just at par or lower than the market, and will grow faster than the industry next year and get back to growing at the legacy growth

UCO Bank posts 50% jump in net profit

New Delhi: State-owned UCO Bank Saturday posted a 50 per cent jump in net est income. The lender had recorded a net profit of Rs 402 crore in the same quarter a year ago. Total income increased to Rs 7,071 crore during the quarter under review from Rs 5,866 crore in the same period last year, UCO Bank said in a regulatory filing. The bank earned an interest income of Rs 6,078 crore during the quarter compared to Rs 5,219 crore in the same period a year ago. Net interest income improved to Rs 2,301 crore, from Rs 1,917 crore in the year-ago period, registering a 20 per cent growth. At the same time, Net interest margin rose to 3.10 per cent from 2.84 per cent at the end of the second quarter of the previous financial year. Commenting on quarterly numbers, UCO Bank Managing Director and CEO Ashwani Kumar said the bank expects to continue the momentum.

Kotak Mahindra Bank profit rises 5%

New Delhi: Kotak Mahindra Bank Saturday posted a marginal 5 per cent increase in its standalone profit to Rs 3,344 crore in the second guarter ended in September 2024. The private sector lender had recorded a net profit of Rs 3,191 crore in the same quarter a year ago. Total income increased to Rs 15,900 crore during the quarter under review from Rs 13,507 crore in the same period last year. Kotak Mahindra Bank said in a regulatory filing. The bank earned interest income of Rs 13,216 crore during the guarter compared to Rs 11,193 crore in the same period a year ago. Net Interest Income (NII) improved to Rs 7,020 crore, from Rs 6,297 crore in the second guarter of the previous year, registering an 11 per cent growth. However, Net Interest Margin (NIM) moderated to 4.91 per cent from 5.22 per cent at the end of the second guarter of the last financial year. The bank was able to reduce gross Non-Performing Assets (NPAs) to 1.49 per cent of the gross loans by the end of September 2024 from 1.72 per cent a year ago.

FERTILISER SUPPLY ADEQUATE DESPITE RED SEA CRISIS

New Delhi, Oct 19: The Centre Saturday said it was confident of achieving record foodgrain production in the 2024-25 rabi season despite fertiliser shipment delays, citing favourable soil moisture conditions and adequate water levels in reservoirs.

Speaking at a national conference here, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said there was sufficient availability of key fertilisers such as urea and diammonium phosphate (DAP) despite delay in shipments due to geopolitical tensions.

The shipments are delayed.. However, there is no shortage of fertilisers. We have made arrangements and there is enough supply for the rabi season," Chouhan said.

The ministry has set a foodgrain production target of 164.55 lakh tonne for the 2024-25 rabi season, including 115 lakh tonne of wheat and 18.15 lakh tonne of pulses

Sowing of rabi (winter) crops has started and will pick up pace post-Diwali.

Fertiliser Secretary Rajat Kumar Mishra said India is rerouting DAP shipments from Morocco via South Africa after Red Sea routes were disrupted, adding 21 days to delivery times to western ports.

Earlier, Blackstone, the world's largest private equity fund, had teamed up with Abu Dhabi Investment Authority (ADIA) and Singapore sovereign wealth fund GIC for a bid to acquire up to 76% of the company. "The biggest problem in this transaction is the size and the premium expectation by the Agarwal family," said a PE executive who had evaluated the deal but passed on it.

People familiar with Haldiram's operations said in May that the FY24 revenue of the combined snacks business was estimated to be Rs 14,500 crore with an EBIDTA of Rs 2,300-2,500 crore. The business has seen a compound annual growth rate of 18% in revenue over the past five years. The average EBIDTA margin is 14-15% though last year it improved to 17-18% on account of low commodity

rates and price hikes in FY23. While Haldiram dominates the snacks market, other players include PepsiCo's (Lays, Kurkure), Balaji Snacks, Prataap Snacks (Yellow Diamond), Bikanervala, Bikaji Foods, which recently got listed, and ITC Foods, which sells chips under the Bingo franchise. Indian savoury snacks market can be broadly segmented into western snacks and traditional snacks with the latter contributing around 48% to the total savoury snacks market -- namkeens, bhujia and ethnic snacks such as dry samosa, kachori, chakli, etc.

Despite 43.4% of the packaged savoury snacks market being unorganized, organized players such as Haldiram, Pepsico-Lays, Balaji, Bikaji have a strong foothold across the country and major market share in regional pockets.

The organized savoury snacks market is estimated at Rs 41,000 crore in 2021. Currently, the ethnic namkeen and snacks market is valued at Rs 10,800 crore. This segment has grown immenselysince the last few years and majorly since pandemic.

NZ CLOSE IN ON TEST WIN ON INDIAN SOIL AFTER 36 YEARS

Bangalore, Oct 19: Sarfaraz Khan's maiden century and Rishabh Pant's cavalier 99 is unlikely to prevent New Zealand from earning their first-ever Test match victory on Indian soil in 36 years with only 107 runs to get on the final day of an intriguing start-stop series opener.

Tom Latham (0) and Devon Conway (0) were at crease when bad light and later rain forced early stumps on fourth evening.

The last time New Zealand won a Test match in India was 🎝 way back in 1989 when Sir Richard Hadlee was still an active Test cricketer and got 10 wickets at the Wankhede to ensure a huge 136run win.

Dipa sees lack of passion in current generation

New Delhi, Oct 19: Just-retired Indian gymnastics star Dipa Karmakar believes most of the current generation of gymnasts lack passion and urged them to embrace the sport with fervour to excel on the global stage.

Dipa, who blazed a trail by becoming the first Indian woman gymnast to compete at the Olympics and finish a historic fourth in 2016 Rio Games, retired earlier this month, ending a career in which she inspired awe for routinely performing the highly-difficult Produnova vault.

There was junoon (passion) in Dipa, that is why. Same for Pranati," she said when asked why there is only one Dipa or Pranati Nayak among Indian women gymnasts winning medals on the international stage.

"I can't see this junoon (passion) much in the current gen-

eration (of gymnasts). I feel they look for short term, instant success," she said Friday night during a panel discussion at an event titled 'Beyond the Finish Line'. organised by Vedanta Delhi Half Marathon. The diminutive 31-year-old

from Tripura grabbed headlines with her fourth-place finish in the vault final of the 2016 Rio Games, losing an Olympic medal by just 0.15 points. Tokyo Olympian Pranati has

won a vault bronze medal each in the 2019 and 2022 Asian Championships.

Hailing from Agartala, Dipa is one of only five women in gymnastics history to have successfully executed the Produnova. which involves two somersaults before landing and is called the 'vault of death' owing to the high risk of injury it poses. She felt that the problems plaguing the national federation for some time has also not helped the cause of Indian gymnastics.



While announcing her retirement, Dipa had said that she would give back to the sport by becoming a coach at some point in her life or she might simply remain a "supporter of the next generation of gymnasts following their dreams'

As recently as May, Dipa won vault gold medal at the Asian

Artistic Gymnastics Championships in Tashkent but decided to retire a few months later. Asked why she took the decision to retire, she said, "I had two ACL surgeries, shoulder and ankle injury. I was not being able to do my main event of vault the way I wanted. If the body is

not allowing to push, there is

no point of continuing."
