#### DANA: EVACUATION BEGINS

A s the state braces for severe cyclonic storm Dana, the government Tuesday started evacuating people and decided to close educational institutions in vulnerable areas. According to plans, over 10 lakh people from 3,000 villages in 14 districts will be shifted to relief camps. A depression over the Bay of Bengal intensified into a deep depression Tuesday evening and is likely to become a severe cyclonic storm and cross the Odisha-West Bengal coasts in the early hours of October 25 with a wind speed of 100-110 kmph gusting to 120 kmph. IMD DG Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said that the entire eastern coast from Puri to Sagar Island in West Bengal is likely to be impacted. CM Mohan Charan Majhi urged all MLAs to coordinate with the administration in rescue and relief operations. "Fifty-one ODRAF and 178 Fire Services teams have so far been deployed in the vulnerable districts, while 20 NDRF teams have been mobilised," an official said. All educational institutions including schools, colleges and universities will remain closed in 14 districts from October 23 to 25. MORE P3

On Tuesday alone, around 50 flights, including 13 each of IndiGo and Air India received bomb threats. Akasa Air got the threats for over 12 flights and as many as 11 flights of Vistara also received the threats, the sources in the know said.

Around 30 flights of IndiGo, Air India and Vistara got bomb threats Monday night, they added.

In nine days, more than 170 flights operated by Indian carriers have received bomb threats, mostly through social media, that also forced the diversion of some of the international flights.

On average, disruption to a domestic flight would cost around ₹1.5 crore while the expenses would be around ₹5-5.5 crore for an international flight, an official, who has worked in the finance department of a domestic airline, told PTI.

## Fake court busted in Gujarat; 'judge' arrested

#### AGENCIES

Ahmedabad, Oct 22: After fake toll plaza, government offices and hospitals, the police in Gujarat have uncovered a nefarious scheme orchestrated by a man masquerading as a judge in his own fake tribunal and passing 'judgements' since 2019 especially in land deals in Gandhinagar area. Morris Samuel Christian, since arrested, is accused of orchestrating a deception that fooled many into believing they were in a legitimate court.

Police said Christian, the mastermind behind this elaborate ruse, wielded his gavel to pass judgments in favour of his clients, all within the fabricated walls of his office. The bogus tribunal, reminiscent of a real courtroom, worked undetected for years, with its roots tracing back to as early as 2019.

Initial probe suggested that Christian preyed on unsuspecting individuals entangled in land disputes, promising swift resolutions in exchange for hefty fees. By assuming the role of a judge, he exploited the vulnerable, manipulating the course of justice for personal gain.

The elaborate charade involved Christian's associates posing as court personnel, creating a façade of authenticity to dupe his clients. The elaborate theatrics, complete with a mock courtroom setting in Gandhinagar, lent an air of legitimacy to his



#### deceitful proceedings.

In 2019, Christian passed an order in favour of his client using the same modus operandi. The case was pertaining to a

government land under the district Collector while his client had staked claim on it and wanted to add his name in revenue records related to the plot in question lo-

cated in Paldi area, a police release said Monday.

Without an authority or order issued by any court under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, Christian told his client he has been appointed as the "official arbitrator" by the government.

The conman then initiated fake proceedings at his 'court' and passed an order in favour of his client, directing the Collector to add his client's name in the revenue records of that land, the release said. To implement the order, Christian, through another lawyer, filed an appeal in the City Civil Court and attached the fraudulent order

passed by him. The court registrar, Hardik Desai, recently found out that Christian is neither an arbitrator nor is the order of the tribunal genuine.

Following his complaint, the Karanj police here lodged an FIR under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 170 (pretending to hold any office as a public servant) and 419 (cheating by personation).

The conman was arrested for allegedly cheating people by posing as a judge of an arbitral tribunal and passing favourable 🛁 orders claiming he has been appointed as an arbitrator by a competent court to adjudicate legal disputes, the release said. The accused is already facing

a cheating complaint filed at thecity's Maninagar police station in 2015, it added.

#### TWIN CITY COPS PUT ON ALERT AS 'DANA' NEARS COAST

Ahead of the impending cyclone, twin city Police Commissioner Sunil Dev Datta Singh Tuesday chaired a preparatory meeting attended by the inspectors under Bhubaneswar and Cuttack UPD, and directed them to ensure the stock of necessary equipment to tackle exigencies, if any, arising out of the impact of 'Dana'. Singh asked the cops to ensure stock of equipment like ropes, tree-cutters, fire extinguishers and torches in order to handle mishaps. He asked police officers to not avail any holiday until the cyclone is over. The police commissioner, through a videoconferencing, said inspectors have been instructed to keep ready alternative plans to rescue stranded citizens. The police stations under which there are many low-lying areas and potholes have been kept on alert, and IICs have been asked to prepare rescue plans before the cyclone strikes.



### **800 RELIEF SHELTERS READY TO HOUSE EVACUATED PEOPLE ECoR** cancels

#### PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: As the well-marked low-pressure area over Bay of Bengal intensified into a depression Tuesday and moved towards the eastern coast with the likelihood of turning into a severe cyclonic storm, the state government has kept ready around 800 cyclone shelters for people who will be evacuated from vulnerable areas.

Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari Tuesday said officials have so far visited 250 cyclone relief centres where people will be housed after evacuation.

Food, water, medicine, elec tricity and other essentials have been kept in readiness for the people to be evacuated due to the impending cyclone, he said.

Apart from 800 cyclone shell ters, the minister said an additional 500 temporary shelters have been made ready including schools and colleges. The officials at the ground level have been instructed to make arrange ments for women in cyclone shel ters where women police will be deployed, he said

He said Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has stressed on 100 per cent evacuation of people from vulnerable areas to ensure "zero casualty" in the impend ing cyclone. The minister said the government has also prepared a list of pregnant women who are expected to deliver in a fortnight. All those women are being shifted to the nearby hospitals in order to avoid any difficulty during the calamity.

Replying to a question on willingness of the people to shift to cyclone shelters, the minister said that some people are reluctant to vacate their houses for the reasons of theft. Police have been directed to intensify patrolling in villages where people will be evacuated to cyclone shelters, he said

Asked about the situation if the cyclone changes its track as forecast by the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the minister said the state government has also studied that aspect. "In the past it has



been noticed that cyclones change their anticipated tracks. Therefore, keeping in view the possibilities of re-curve, the state government has already identified certain places and made equal arrangements at vulnerable places. A red alert has been issued for nine districts and orange warning for heavy rain in some districts. Therefore, there

should be no fear in this regard," the minister said. The state government has already ordered closure of schools in Ganjam, Puri, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Bhadrak, Balasore,

of the impending cyclone 'Dana', East Coast Railway (ECoR) is proactively preparing to mitigate potential impacts on train services and to ensure safety and security of passengers. The ECoR has cancelled at least 198 trains for safety reasons.

ECoR has activated a roundthe-clock disaster management cell at Rail Sadan and divisional headquarters in Khurda Road. Visakhapatnam and Sambalpur. These teams would work for early restoration of train services and railway infrastructure that are likely to be affected by the impending storm.

ECoR General Manager Parmeshwar Funkwal chaired a preparatory meeting and advised all the principal heads of the departments of ECoR and Divisional Railway managers to take necessary steps for ensuring zero risk to passengers. He emphasised on deployment of special teams for early restoration of tracks, signal ing system and electrification etc., to ensure quick restoration of the train services after the cyclone.

ECoR has positioned specialised teams for swift restoration of tracks, signaling systems, and electrification processes. In the event of power outage, diesel locomotives will be on standby mode to ensure continued train operations.

Emergency control rooms are operational around the clock, equipped with satellite phones to maintain communication during the crisis. With a red alert issued for coastal areas. ECoR is closely monitoring conditions the stations all at between Bhubaneswar and



Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: Former IPS officer Lalit Das has been appointed as chairman of the Odisha Subordinate Staff Selection Commission (OSSSC), an official statement said, Tuesday.

The commission was formed to regulate the method of recruitment in all Group C civil posts and services under different district offices of the state government, officials said.

Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: The state government Tuesday announced the closure of two of its ecological hotspots - Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhanj district and Bhitarkanika National Park (BNP) in Kendrapara district - in view of an impending severe cyclonic storm 'Dana'.

Both the Mayurbhanj and Kendrapara districts have been identified as 'Red Zone' as the IMD forecast a severe cyclonic storm will cross the east coast between October 24 night and 25 morning. These two districts could bear the brunt of the calamity, officials said.

The Forest department has announced that the BNP and STR will remain closed to visitors and tourists from October 23 to October 25.

According to BNP authorities, the date of reopening will be decided keeping in view the prevailing situ-

ation in the areas.

The cyclonic storm is likely to hit the coast during the night of October 24 or morning of October 25.

According to the forecast, the cyclone is likely to trigger heavy to extremely heavy rain accompanied by high-velocity wind of 100 to 110 kilometres per hour.

"This is to inform all the visitors or tourists that Similipal Tiger Reserve will remain closed for them from October 23 to 25 due to a possible cyclone storm likely to hit Odisha," an official notification said, adding that there will be no entry or exit from the Tiger Reserve for visitors or tourist vehicles during this period. "The Tiger Reserve will be reopened after assessment of the situation," the notification said.

As per the forecast made by the IMD, the cyclone is likely to cross between Puri in Odisha and Sagar Island in West Bengal.

tive among Indian states and Union Territories due to its vibrant and diverse tribal population, offering a broad socioeconomic landscape. Approximately 45 per cent of the state is covered under Scheduled area. These areas are predominantly inhabited by tribal communities.

Out of 30, 13 districts, 119 blocks and 1926 Gram Panchayats are under the designated PESA area.

Naik said, "Customary modes of dispute resolution are traditional mechanisms used by indigenous and tribal communities to resolve conflicts based on their customs, norms, and so-

cial structures. These systems emphasise consensus, community harmony, and restorative justice rather than punitive measures.

Naik, further stressed, "Customary modes of dispute are resolved within the village through community-led processes, emphasising participation, cultural values, consensus, and reconciliation, ensuring quick, accessible, and harmonious solutions. It provides quicker solutions, prioritising not only conflict resolution but also preserving social harmony, fostering fraternity, and strengthening brotherhood within the community."

## WINGED GUESTS ARRIVE AT CHILIKA LAGOON BEFORE ONSET OF WINTER

#### PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Berhampur, Oct 22: Even though winter is vet to set in. winged guests have started to arrive at Chilika lake, the biggest waterfowl habitat in the country, an official said Tuesday.

The migratory birds have already started to arrive at the lake from the first week of the current month, which is the usual time of their arrival, Divisional Forest Officer (DFO), Chilika Wildlife Division, Amlan Nayak said Tuesday. Their arrival was continuing daily, he said.

Migratory birds of different species like northern pintail, Eurasian wigeon, gadwall, blacktailed gadwall, northern shoveller, greater flamingo, common sandpiper, common coot, mongolian plover, common snipe, black winged stilt, etc have already swooped down in the lake, Nayak said.

The DFO said the arrival of migratory birds at the lake is as usual, even though the day temperature in and around the blue la-



goon was hovering at 32 to 35 degrees Celsius at present.

The onset of winter and some other causes in their native places might have forced the birds to fly to Chilika, he added.

Several birds are also seen flying in the sky near Chilika without settling on the lake. They might land once the water level recedes in the lake, Nayak said, adding, "We expected their number might be in large by the end of the current month."

The winged guests mostly from beyond the Himalayas in Northern Eurasia, Caspian region, Siberia,

Kazakh, Lake Baikal and remote areas of Russia and neighbouring countries visit the Chilika lake every winter and start their homeward journey before the onset of summer in the second week of March.

In the last winter, a total of 11,37,759 birds of 187 species visited Chilika and the majority of them settled in the Nalabana sanctuary area inside the lake.

## **Putin's BRICS Show**

n paper the BRICS summit being held in Kazan, Russia, from 22 October to 24 October aims at strengthening multilateralism for "just" global development and security. But, in reality it is a great opportunity for Russian President Vladimir Putin, locked in a prolonged war with Ukraine, to showcase that he is not as isolated in the international community as the West wants the world to believe. His objective may run counter to the ostensible efforts of China, India, Brazil and the Arab world to find a way to end the war in Ukraine. Putin seems to be too eager to use the rising clout of the BRICS group, which now accounts for 45 per cent of the world's population and 35 per cent of its economy, for his own security. The fact that China accounts for over half of BRICS' economic strength bolsters Putin's hope to achieve his goal in Ukraine because of his bonhomie with Chinese President Xi Jinping

The West has called Putin a pariah since he invaded Ukraine and imposed tough sanctions on Russia intended to isolate the country's economy from global markets. Hosting the BRICS summit in this backdrop helps Putin fend off the pressure being put by the West. He is greeting 20 heads of state, including Xi, Narendra Modi and Iranian President Masoud Pezesh. This is one of the large-scale foreign policy events ever in Russia

The loud and clear message that Putin is sending out to the world, especially the West, is that attempts to isolate Russia and severely cripple its economy through sanctions have failed since he has so many friends across the globe forming the BRICS bloc. This grouping is often described as a counterweight to the Western-led world and the G7 countries as it has expanded to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran and the United Arab Emirates. Saudi Arabia, too, has been invited to join. Russian officials have even indicated that another 30 countries want to join BRICS or seek closer ties with the bloc. Some of these nations will take part in the summit.

But, the real aim of Putin is to convince BRICS members to find an alternative to the dollar for global payments. The Russian economy is facing multitude of problems primarily due to the payment crisis in its cross-border trade and payment made in the US dollar which is the main currency in the global market. Russia's main interest lies in breaking the dominance of the US dollar. It wants BRICS countries to create an alternative trade mechanism and cross-border settlement system that does not involve the dollar, the euro or any of the G7 currencies. If it succeeds in the endeavour; the sanctions imposed by the US-led West could be greatly neutralised.

However, it is easier said than done. The roadblock to this ambitious project of Putin is that many members of the BRICS grouping are keen on maintaining good and stable political and economic relations with the West. As such they are unlikely to take any decisive step in evolving an alternative system of payment curbing the control of dollars.

China too can ill afford to antagonize or even ignore the affluent West since most of its high end products are consumed there, not in Africa, South America or even Asia. India too is a low end product market for China. Also, unlike Russia which has got embroiled in a seemingly unending war with Ukraine in which it has failed to make much headway, China can be seen as a clever nation interested in exploiting global markets and winning economic battles, rather than fighting actual wars using guns and bullets. This focus of China might, eventually, manifest to make it discreetly distance itself from the current Russian aim. If that happens sooner than later, Putin could very well be dethroned from his position of power.

There are other problems afflicting the BRICS bloc that prevent it from becoming a really effective global grouping. There are internal conflicts among the member countries that defy solutions. For example, the relations between China and India often get strained over border disputes and encroachment of territories, this notwithstanding the latest understanding between the two countries which has now stipulated India to withdraw beyond the pre-Galwan conflict LAC. There is also tension between two of the newest members, Egypt and Ethiopia, while Shi'ite Iran and Sunni Saudi Arabia have long been regional rivals despite recent thaw in their relations.

However, the importance of BRICS is slowly, but steadily rising because of super-power rivalry. If developed countries stick together for their mutual interests under US leadership, third world countries could possibly want Russia to be on their side to safeguard their interests. How

tion. Between August 2023 and July 2024, tropical forest loss in the Brazilian Amazon was cut by 46%, compared to the previous 12 months. And at the global level, Brazil, which holds the G20 presidency this year, has emphasized nature-based solutions to climate challenges as part of its agenda, paving the way for further progress at COP30 in Belém in 2025

For its part, the World Bank Group is supporting similar public and private efforts across developing economies. The goal is to design strong policies, build credible institutions, and mobilize investments in the infrastructure that is needed to conserve and manage forests sustainably. Making forest finance more widely available and more affordable is key.

The World Bank Group is also working to turn the vast potential of carbon markets into an income stream for developing countries that are committed to reducing emissions and conserving their forests. Already, 15 countries are benefiting from a pipeline that could produce more than 24 million carbon credits by the end of 2024 – a win for both the climate and development. But those engaged in these efforts have long been dogged by the question of how to support

the conservation of standing forests over the long term. While forest carbon markets have created new revenue streams, they usually reward only those countries, communities, or project developers that are focused on reducing their emissions from deforestation. Thus, forests that are not under immediate threat offer no financial reward.

One solution is the proposed Tropical Forest Forever Facility, a large-scale, performancebased mechanism that would use blended finance to generate financial returns and reward countries for protecting their standing forests. Instead of carbon credits, the TFFF would provide predictable longterm financial support linked to a country's hectares of standing forests, thus aligning economic incentives with environmental outcomes.

Led by the Brazilian Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, and in partnership with other tropical-forest countries, developed economies, and non-traditional sponsors. the TFFF aims to leverage sovereign and philanthropic funding to mobilize more private capital, thus expanding forest finance beyond purely publicsector tools. Crucially, it would

allow private investors to sup port a global public good by quantifying and verifying the underlying asset on terms aligned with their business models.

This is the kind of bold, innovative solution that we need if we want to make a real difference in the fight against climate change. One of the biggest advantages of the TFFF is that it is not expected to depend on scarce donor grants and recurrent replenishments. Instead, it would require a onetime, fully repayable investment from potential sponsors, who therefore would be presented with a conceptually novel development-aid model.

Those designing the TFFF are also studying how to simplify disbursement models (without any loss of rigor) through digital monitoring, reporting, and verification systems, and how to disburse enough annually to tip the scales away from deforestation. Finally, another important question that is coming into focus is how to improve access to such mechanisms for indigenous peoples, local communities, and other forest owners and stewards. The countries working on the TFFF intend to address these issues by COP30.

Forests are vital not just for the carbon they store, but also for their role in maintaining ecological balance, supporting environmental health, and promoting economic growth and human development. The period between COP16 in Cali and next year's COP30 in Brazil could be the perfect time to launch the TFFF and set the stage for a new era in forest-conservation finance. We must start properly rewarding countries that have controlled deforestation and redouble our efforts to conserve existing forests

tary "Sweet Bobby: My Catfish Nightmare" made me realise how easy it is to be come a victim of catfishing and how vulnerable many people are. Catfishing, as you probably know, is what happens when you have an online romance with someone who looks dropdead gorgeous, but when you meet them in person, they look like a dead catfish.

No, that's not exactly what it means. Catfishing is when someone creates a fictitious online persona or fake identity to lure another person into a relationship. Romance scams often involve catfishing. These schemes are based on an adage that humans have known for centuries: one of the easiest ways to steal someone's money is to first steal their heart.

But financial gain is not always the motive for catfishing, as "Sweet Bobby" illustrates. The documentary portrays the decade-long scheme that lured

It began as an online friendship, then progressed into a romance and eventually an engagement. The perpetrator (no spoilers here) created dozens of fake online profiles to carry out the catfishing scheme and even convinced Assi that the man of her dreams couldn't meet her in person or communicate with her fully because he was in a witness protection program in the US. (Many an American man has been invited to the wedding of a former girlfriend and written in response: "Wish I could be there, but the Justice Department has put me in a witness protection program.")

In Assi's case, the perpetrator's motive isn't clear, but it appears to be manipulation or control. Indeed, some people engage in catfishing to harass other people, bully them or take revenge. Some suffer from low self-esteem or loneliness and enjoy

being a totally different person online who can attract other people. A person with low self-esteem can portray themselves online as attractive and confident. taking advantage of another per-

son with low self-esteem. But you don't have to suffer from low self-esteem to be a victim of catfishing, especially when the scheme is as elaborate as the one that entrapped Assi. That's why it's important to know some of the warning signs. Here are just a few of them:

1. The photos look perfect. If the person trying to develop an online relationship with you looks like an actor or model, be suspicious. Ask yourself if someone so attractive would be looking for love online. If so, wouldn't they pursue all the other people using fake photos?

2. The photos remain unchanged. If the person is not sharing new photos of themselves in various environments. it might mean that they don't

have complete access to that beautiful face.

3. The person refuses to video chat with you. They make excuses for not appearing in video, such as being in a witness protection program, suffering from video-phobia, or not being quite ready to take such a big step in the relationship. (Going from texting to a video chat is like going from a heart emoji to a blowing-a-kiss emoji.)

4. The relationship progresses too fast. If you became online friends a week ago and they're already proposing marriage, you may want to unfriend them immediately.

5. They ask for money. Most catfishing schemes are conceived for financial gain. But before they can swindle you, they need to win your trust. This can be done in many ways, including turning down your offers to help when they're in trouble. Eventually, of course, you'll discover that what they truly love is not you but your money.

#### A welcome first step

Sir, This refers to "Pact with China on LAC patrolling," Orissa Post, Oct 22. The clarity on contours of the patrolling agreement between New Delhi and Beijing would be known in weeks ahead. It is expected to set the ball rolling towards 'disengagement' and 'resolution of issues' along LAC and border areas. Relations between the two nations have remained on thin ice, in a state of heightened military preparedness since the 2020 deadly conflict in eastern Ladakh. Bilateral talks between the two have been limited to talking disengagement since 2020, even as India has engaged with China consistently on multilateral fora. The step forward has taken over 20 rounds of military negotiations over the last 53 months and many numbers of multi-level meetings between foreign affairs officials. The slackening stance of Beijing as an aggressive unbending adversary is no doubt influenced by its own domestic challenges, especially a slowing economy and costs of maintaining a highly militarised border. Beijing also no doubt has in its focus New Delhi's deepening strategic and military ties with Washington and steadily growing defence trade. The word 'stable' finds more frequent mention now than the phrase 'status quo ante'. But as things stand, and regardless of both Beijing's commitment, and the restraint that surrounded Monday's announcement, it's a very welcome first step.

Shimla, Oct 22: The Himachal Pradesh Cabinet Tuesday decided to do away with the 10mark personal interview criteria in the recruitment of Van Mitra in the Forest department .

It also decided to set up a Cabinet sub-committee to review the operations of parking facilities run under the publicprivate partnership (PPP) model in Shimla City.

The Cabinet meeting presided over by Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu decided to go ahead with the recruitment of 2061 Van Mitra in the Forest department by eliminating the 10-mark criteria for personal interview, a statement issued here said.

The goal of the Van Mitra scheme is to strengthen local communities' involvement in the protection, conservation, and development of forest areas. Van Mitras (friends of forest) receive incentives for maintaining and protecting plantations

Men and women in the age group of 18 to 25 with matriculation and 10 plus as minimum gualification who are residents of Gram Panchayat/urban Local Body within the jurisdiction of the forest beat and have good

The Cabinet decided to create and fill up 150 posts of nursing personnel posts and create and fill six posts of Associate Professor posts, 10 posts of Assistant Professors in different departments Dr Radhakrishnan Government Medical College and Hospital Medical College Hamirpur

In order to promote the use of electric vehicles and reduce reliance on fossil fuel vehicles, the Cabinet approved involving private players to expand the EV charging station network along the state's six green corridors where 77 EV charging stations are already operational



It also decided to amend the Eco-tourism Policy 2017 to align with the recent amendments in the Forest Conservation Act (FCA) 2023, aimed at promoting and developing eco-tourism activities in the state.

## 'Crop residue management machinery unviable for small farmers'

FARMERS DEMANDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD ENSURE THE CROP RESIDUE **MACHINERY IS AVAILABLE IN SUFFICIENT** NUMBERS AT THE VILLAGE LEVEL SO AS TO **CHECK STUBBLE BURNING INCIDENTS**

#### Chandigarh, Oct 22: Amid concern over the rise in stubbleburning incidents in Punjab, a demand for financial incentives to manage paddy stubble is

emerging from farmers who assert that it is not financially viable for small cultivators to buy crop residue management machinery to clear their fields.

They also said as the window for Rabi crops like wheat is very short after paddy harvest, many farmers are forced to set their fields on fire to quickly clear the straw for sowing the next crop.

Many farmers were of the view that the minimum support price on alternative crops like maize, pulses etc should be guaranteed so as to wean away growers from the water-guzzling paddy

crop Stubble burning in Punjab and Haryana is often blamed for

the rise in air pollution in Delhi after the harvesting of the paddy crop in October and November. As the paddy harvesting is

progressing in the state, the incidents of stubble burning are picking up in the two foodgrain growing states, prompting the state authorities to register FIRs and impose fines on erring

farmers. With over 31 lakh hectares of paddy area, Punjab produces around 180-200 lakh tonnes of paddy straw every year.

Crop residue management machinery like super seeder, smart seeder, happy seeder, paddy straw chopper, shredder. mulcher. hvdraulic reversible mould board plough and zero till drill under



the in-situ (mixing crop residue in fields) management method and baler and rake under the ex-situ (using stubble as fuel) management method are made available on subsidy.

The rate of subsidy on these machines for individual farmers is 50 per cent of the cost of the equipment and 80 per cent for cooperative societies and panchavats.

Bharti Kisan Union (Lakhowal) **General Secretary Harinder** Singh Lakhowal said farmers want financial incentives for the management of paddy stubble.

"We are de manding ₹3,000 per acre for managing paddy straw,' said

Lakhowal. He pointed out that it was not economically feasible for

small farmers to buy crop residue machinery for the management of straw.

"A tractor having 60 HP capacity is required to run crop residue management machinery and it costs over ₹10 lakh. A small farmer cannot afford to buy machinery at such a cost. And that is why we are saying farmers should be given financial incentives for managing the stubble." said Lakhowal.

According to Punjab farmer unions, more than 60 per cent in the state own less than 5 acres of land.

Farmers also said they have very little time after paddy harvesting to sow the next crop and therefore they resort to burning the residue in order to clear their fields

They demanded that the government should ensure the crop residue machinery is available in sufficient numbers at the village level so as to check stubble burning incidents.

"At least a baler per two villages should be made available so that small farmers can give their straw," said Mohali-based farmer Bhupinder Singh.

Many farmers also stressed that the government should ensure guaranteed MSP on crops other than paddy so they can switch over to other crops.

Punjab had witnessed a reduction of 30 per cent in the number of fire incidents at 71,159 in 2022-23 as compared to 76,929 in 2021-22 and a reduction of 26 per cent in such incidents at-49,922 in 2023-24 as compared to 71,159 in 2022-23.

New Delhi, Oct 22: India will look at disengagement and de-escalation of the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh after restoration of the status quo of April 2020, Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi said Tuesday, a day after New Delhi announced striking an agreement with Beijing to end the over four-year border row in the region.

In his first comment on the pact on patrolling along the contested frontier, Gen Dwivedi said the Indian military is trying to restore "trust" and both sides will have to "reassure each other" to achieve this objective. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri Monday announced India and China reached an agreement on patrolling along the

LAC in eastern Ladakh, in a major breakthrough in ending the over four-year military standoff. The announcement came ahead of a likely meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi



Kazan Wednesday on the sidelines of the BRICS summit. "As far as we are concerned, we want to go back to the status quo of April 2020. Thereafter, we will be looking at disengagement, de-escalation and normal management of the LAC,"he said at an interactive session. "And, this normal management of the LAC will not just

stop there. There are phases in that also," he added. In almost all the negotiations with China on

the border row. India has been insisting on restoration of the status quo ante of that existed before the border standoff erupted in early May of 2020.

'This is what I am saying. This has been our stance since then and even today (it) remains the same. So, as of now, we are trying to restore the trust,' the Army Chief said.

"How trust will be restored. It will get restored once we are able to see each other, and we are able to convince each other, look at the buffer zones which are there, which have been created, we are not creeping," he said. "And, both will have to

reassure each other," he said. The Army chief said resumption of patrolling would

give some kind advantage. "Patrolling gives you that kind of advantage and that is what is commencing. And, as we restore the trust, the other stages will follow through soon," he said. Meanwhile, China Tuesday confirmed that it has reached

an agreement with India to end the standoff between the two armies in eastern Ladakh.

"Over a recent period of time, China and India have kept close communication through diplomatic and military channels on issues related to the China-India border," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Lin Jian said in Beijing. The ties between the two Asian giants nosedived significantly following the fierce clash in the Galwan Valley in June 2020 that marked the most serious military conflict between the two sides in decades.

BANGALORE RAINS 1 dead, 17 trapped in building collapse

Bangalore, Oct 22: One worker was killed after an under-construction building collapsed in Babusapalya here Tuesday amid heavy rains, officials said.

Two rescue vans from the fire and emergency department have been pressed into rescue operations. The incident occurred at a time when the city is witnessing heavy downpour, they said.

"Approximately 20 people were trapped. One body has been recovered, 14 workers have been rescued and five are still missing," D Devaraja, Deputy Commissioner of Police (East Bangalore) told media.

It is a seven-storey building he said.

According to preliminary inquiry, the entire building collapsed following which people got trapped underneath, a fire department official said.

#### Man stabs woman for 'avoiding' him

New Delhi: A 30-year-old woman was stabbed a dozen times allegedly by her neighbour in west Delhi's Tilak Nagar area, police said Tuesday. According to the woman's husband, the accused, Ravinder Singh alias Goldy (36), insisted the victim on befriending him after which she started avoiding him. Ravinder had also misbehaved with the woman on two separate occasions before but the couple did not file any complaint against him because of his sister's intervention, the husband claimed.

carried out at 10 locations across Srinagar, Ganderbal, Bandipora, Kulgam, Budgam, Anantnag and Pulwama

During the operation, police busted a recruitment module run by a newly floated terrorist organisation 'Tehreek Labaik Ya Muslim' (TLM), headed by a Pakistani terrorist handler known by his alias 'Baba Hamas', the officials said.

They added that the searches were conducted in pursuance of a search warrant issued by a



special NIA court in a case registered under various sections of the IPC and the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. The case pertains to a larger conspiracy hatched by proscribed terrorist organisations operating within Jammu and Kashmir and across the LoC at the behest of Pakistani agencies.

These outfits, in connivance with their sympathisers in the Kashmir valley, are continuously creating "new terror modules", the officials said.

New Delhi, Oct 22: A thick layer of smog enveloped the national capitalTuesday as the Air Quality Index (AQI) slipped further, even dropping to the "severe" category at 411 in Anand Vihar.

Air quality was recorded in the "very poor" category by 28 out of 36 pollution monitoring stations. The 24-hour average AQI was recorded at 327 at 4 pm Tuesday as against 310 a day earlier even as anti-pollution restrictions under the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP)-II came into force.

An AQI reading between 401-500 is classified as "severe' which affects healthy individuals and seriously impacts those with existing diseases.

PM2.5 was recorded at an alarming 129.3 micrograms per cubic meter, according to the

Central Pollution Control Board. PM2.5 refers to fine inhal-

able particles with diameters generally measuring 2.5 micrometres and smaller, posing the greatest risk to health.

The acceptable annual standard for PM 2.5 is 40 micrograms per cubic meter.

While Air quality in Anand Vihar slipped into the "severe' category, the AQI remained "very poor" in areas like Bawana, Dwarka, Jahangirpuri, Rohini, DTU, IGI Airport (T3), ITO, Mundka, Narela, Patparganj,

Rohini, Shadipur, Sonia Vihar, Wazirpur, Alipur, Ashok Vihar, Aya Nagar, Burari, Mandir Marg and Mundka

Factors that contributed to Delhi's pollution on a high margin Tuesday included transportation, stubble burning, dust pollution and others.

Emissions from transportation accounted for approximately 11.45 per cent of Delhi's air pollution, according to the Centre's Decision Support System for Air Quality Management.

## Muslim man can register more than one marriage: HC

Mumbai, Oct 22: A Muslim man can register more than one marriage as their personal laws permit multiple marriages, the Bombay High Court held in a case of a man seeking to register his union with his third wife.

A division bench of Justices B P Colabawalla and Somasekhar Sundaresan October 15 directed the deputy marriage registration office of the Thane Municipal Corporation to decide the application filed by a Muslim man in February last year seeking to register his third marriage with a woman from Algeria.

sought direction to the authorities to issue them a marriage certificate, claiming that their application was rejected as this was the man's third marriage.

The authorities refused to register the marriage on the ground that under the Maharashtra **Regulation of Marriage Bureaus** and Registration of Marriage Act, the definition of marriage contemplates only a single marriage and not multiple unions. The bench, however, termed

the authority's refusal as "wholly misconceived" and said in the entire scheme of the Act, it does not find anything that would preclude a Muslim man from registering a third marriage.



"Under the personal laws for Muslims, they are entitled to have four wives at a time. Once this is the case, we are unable to

accept the submission of the authorities that under the provisions of the Maharashtra **Regulation of Marriage Bureaus** 

and Registration of Marriages Act, only one marriage can be registered, even in the case of a Muslim male," the court said.

The bench said if it were to accept the authorities' contention, then it would effectively mean that the Maharashtra Regulation of Marriage Bureaus and Registration of Marriages Act overrides and/or has displaced the personal laws of Muslims. 'There is absolutely nothing in this Act to indicate that the personal laws of Muslims have been excluded," the court said.

It further noted that the same authorities had ironically registered the petitioner's marriage with his second wife.

The authority had also claimed that the petitioner couple had not furnished certain documents. The court then directed the petitioners to submit all relevant documents within two weeks. The court ordered that once these documents are submitted, the concerned authority of the Thane civic body shall give the petitioners a personal hearing and pass a reasoned order either granting marriage registration or refusing the same within ten days. The bench directed that until

then, no coercive steps should be taken against the petitioner woman whose passport expired in May this year.

**New Delhi, Oct 22:** TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee was suspended for one day from the parliamentary committee on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill after high drama during its meeting Tuesday where he smashed a glass water bottle and threw it towards the Chair while injuring his fingers in the process.

The committee's chairperson and veteran BJP MP Jagdambika Pal condemned the conduct of Banerjee, a rather vocal parliamentarian who has been strident in his criticism of the Bill. He said such actions were "unprecedented" and crossed all limits.

As MPs enjoy privilege, does it mean someone will appear with a revolver tomorrow, Pal told reporters, adding he had a narrow escape. During the meeting, Banerjee was involved in an ugly spat with BJP MP and former Calcutta High Court judge Abhijit Gangopadhyay -- not for the first time -- as expletives were hurled with both members attacking each other in Bengali. Pal said it has become the TMC member's habit to use cuss words while some Opposition mem-

The committee later took up a motion moved by BJP member Nishikant Dubey to suspend Banerjee for one day, whenever the next meeting takes place, for his conduct towards the Chair Votes were divided 10-8, with the ruling alliance and Opposition members polling on partisan lines. Sources said Banerjee expressed regret for smashing the bottle and claimed that he never meant to throw it towards Pal, while still accusing him of "biased" behaviour. Gangopadhyay was visibly upset after only one-day suspension was handed out to Banerjee as penalty and over the fact that the motion made no mention of the verbal attack on him. He is likely to take up the issue at the highest level, a source said.

Asked about the future course of action, Pal said he apprised Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla of the development. "It was in a way criminal act that could have badly hurt me. His conduct is a blow to parliamentary democracy," he added. The committee's meetings have often seen tempers fly with Opposition members accusing the Chair of inviting different organisations, including those working for Hindu causes, having no stake in the Waqf issues and the BJP members charging their political rivals with deliberately disturbing the proceedings.


The committee Tuesday was hearing the views of two Odishabased organisations, Justice in Reality and Panchasakha Bani Prachar, both of which included retired judges and lawyers, when opposition members questioned their stake in the Bill. Both bodies were supportive of the amendments and offered more suggestions.

## MADRASSA CASE Secularism means live and let live: Apex court

New Delhi, Oct 22: Observing secularism means to "live and let live", the Supreme Court Tuesday said regulating madrassas was in the national interest as several hundred years of the nation's composite culture could not be wished away by creating silos for minorities.

The observations came from a bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud and Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra during the daylong hearing on the pleas challenging the Allahabad High Court judgement, which declared the 2004 Uttar Pradesh law on madrassas as unconstitutional saying it was violative of the principle of secularism.

"The judgement is reserved," the bench said at the completion of the arguments. At the outset, the Uttar

Pradesh government, in response to a query of the bench, said it stands by the Uttar Pradesh Board of Madrassa Education Act, 2004 and was of the view that the Allahabad High Court should not have held the entire law as unconstitutional. Agreeing to the submissions of senior lawyer Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for litigants opposed to the HC verdict, the CJI said, "Secularism means - live and let live."

Referring to the composite national culture, the CJI asked the state government, "Is it not in our national interest that you regulate the madrasas?" "You cannot wish away several hundred years of history of this nation like this. Suppose, we uphold

#### Why concerned with only madrassas, SC asks NCPCR

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court Tuesday questioned the National **Commission for Protection of Child** Rights (NCPCR) why was it concerned with madrassas after the child rights body said students of such institutions weren't able to pursue medical and engineering professions. #### Police encounters in Assam: SC terms issue 'very serious'

**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court Tuesday termed "very serious" the issue pertaining to 171 police encounters in Assam from May 2021 to August 2022 and sought details, including about the probe conducted in these matters. A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan was hearing a plea challenging a January 2023 order of the Gauhati High Court which had dismissed a public interest litigation (PIL) raising the issue concerning these encounters by Assam Police. In its order, the high court had referred to an affidavit filed before it by the Assam government which said 171 incidents had taken place from May 2021 till August 2022 in which 56 people died, including four in custody, and 145 were injured. During the hearing Tuesday, the apex court observed, "It is a very, very serious issue. One hundred and seven-one incidents are alarming." When the counsel appearing for Assam said the high court was not inclined to entertain the PIL and termed it premature, the bench observed, "Petitions like this can't be brushed aside as premature."

## SC extends interim protection to actor Siddique for two weeks

**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court Tuesday extended the interim protection from arrest till further orders granted to Malayalam film actor Siddique in an alleged rape case. A bench of Justices Bela M Trivedi and Satish Chandra Sharma allowed Siddique to file his rejoinder affidavit to the status report filed by Kerala police, which alleged lack of cooperation in the investigation on his part. Senior advocate V Giri, appearing for Siddique sought time to file a rejoinder affidavit to the status report but claimed that his client had been cooperating with the police's investigation. Senior advocate Ranjit Kumar, appearing for the Kerala police, said Siddique was hindering the investigation and had destroyed electronic devices besides deleting social media accounts. The bench pointed out the survivor had lodged the complaint eight years after the incident.

#### SC permits Setalvad to travel to Amsterdam

**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court Tuesday permitted activist Teesta Setalvad to travel between November 14 and November 24 to attend the International Documentary Film Festival in Amsterdam. Setalvad had received an invitation from the organisers to attend the festival in her capacity as producer of the documentary film Cycle Mahesh. A bench of Justices B R Gavai and K V Viswanathan allowed the plea filed by Setalvad and directed her to file an undertaking before it that she would return to India as scheduled and face trial. "The applicant is, therefore, permitted to travel to Amsterdam, Netherlands, for a period of 11 days from November 14, 2024 to November 24, 2024. The applicant's passport be returned to her so that she can travel abroad," the bench held.

councillor in Kozhikode, Haridas is confident her background equips her to challenge Vadra, who is keen to extend the Congress' winning streak in this hilly Lok Sabha segment vacated by her brother Rahul Gandhi.

Haridas told PTI in interview Tuesday that although Vadra holds a position in the AICC, she lacks experience as a people's representative. "Priyanka Gandhi is a national figure due to her Nehru family background, but this is her first election. I, on the other hand, have served as a councillor in the Kozhikode Corporation for two consecutive terms and contested the 2021 Assembly elections."

"I have been representing the people for many years, so contesting against Priyanka Gandhi doesn't feel any different to me. I believe I have more experience than she does," the BJP candidate said, a day ahead of the Congress leader's entry into Wayanad, where she is seeking votes with a roadshow in Kalpetta.



The by-election for the Wayanad Lok Sabha constituency was necessitated after Rahul Gandhi vacated it following his

victory in Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh, in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. Eminent CPI leader and former MLA, Sathyan Mokeri, is contesting on the CPIM-led ruling LDF ticket.

"The fight is only between Congress and BJP. See, this election was necessitated due to the irresponsibility of Congress. In many parts of Wayanad, you still see flex boards asking for votes for Rahul Gandhi. However, he chose to keep the Rae Bareli seat and handed Wayanad over to his sister. This is an example of family dominance, and the BJP will highlight this issue before the voters," Haridas said. Navya, who is also the state

general secretary of the Mahila Morcha, BJP's women's wing, believes PM Narendra Modi's development agenda will work in favour of the party in Wayanad. "BJP always puts forward the agenda of development. There has been no intervention from the people's representatives in the issues demanded by the people here for the past several years."

She said Wayanad is not a constituency where the BJP has a strong organisational foothold but pointed out at its electoral gains. "However, the party's vote share doubled compared to the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. Moreover, we saw that people voted for the BJP in Haryana and Jammu and Kashmir, and it showed that people want the BJP in power. We expect that kind of change will happen here also," she said.

In the 2024 elections, the BJP saw its vote share in Wayanad rise to 5.75 per cent, when its state president K Surendran took on Rahul Gandhi.

#### **Hezbollah rules** out negotiations

Beirut: Lebanon's Hezbollah movement said Tuesday there would be no negotiations while fighting continued with Israel and it claimed sole responsibility for a drone attack on Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's holiday home. The group "takes full and sole responsibility" for targeting Netanyahu's house, Mohammad Afif, head of the Iranian-backed militant group's media office, told a press conference in the southern suburbs of Beirut. "If our hands didn't reach you the previous time, then days, nights and the battlefield are still between us," he said. Israel said a drone was launched at Netanyahu's holiday home Saturday. Netanyahu was not there at the time, but he described it as an assassination attempt by "Iran's proxy Hezbollah" and called it a "grave mistake". Hezbollah also for the first time acknowledged that Israel had captured some of its fighters since it launched a ground offensive in south Lebanon, and said that Israel was responsible for their wellbeing. Hezbollah had not captured any Israeli soldiers but had come close, Afif said. "It won't take long before we have captives from the enemy (Israel)."

President Xi Jinping told Russia's Vladimir Putin that the international situation was gripped by chaos but that Beijing's strategic partnership with Moscow was a force for stability amid the most significant changes seen in a century.

Xi and Putin in May pledged a "new era" of partnership between the two most powerful rivals of the United States, which they cast as an aggressive Cold War hegemon sowing chaos across the world.

"At present, the world is going through changes unseen in a hundred years, the international situation is intertwined with chaos." Xi told Putin in the Russian city of Kazan at the opening of the BRICS summit. "But I firmly believe that the

friendship between China and Russia will continue for generations, and great countries' responsibility to their people will not change.'

Russia, waging war against NATO-supplied Ukrainian forces, and China, under pressure from a concerted US effort to counter its growing military and economic strength, increasingly have found common geopolitical cause.

Russia and China, pushing back against perceived humiliations of the 1991 Soviet collapse and centuries of European colonial dominance of China, have sought to portray the West as decadent and in decline.

The United States casts China as its biggest competitor and Russia as its biggest nation-state

#### Lahore declared world's most polluted city; Pak plans artificial rain

Lahore: Pakistan Punjab province Tuesday said it has planned artificial rains to mitigate the impact of the smog after Lahore faced an alarming Air Quality Index (AQI) of 394. It would be the second time



that Lahore, the cultural capital of Pakistan and one of the cities to regularly face worst pollution, would carry out cloud seeding for artificial rain. The first time it was done was in December 2023 that cloud seeding was done for combating hazardous levels of smog and the project had cost an estimated Rs 350 million. Lahore was declared the most polluted city in the world Monday with an alarming AQI of 394. The AQI is a measure of the concentration of various pollutants in the air and an AQI above 100 is considered unhealthy and above 150 "very unhealthy". Early this month, Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz had called for "climate diplomacy" with India to mitigate smog impact in the province.

Washington, Oct 22: US officials have told their Indian counterparts they want a speedy result and more accountability after their investigation into Indian involvement in a foiled murder plot against a Sikh activist in the United States, according to a US official.

An Indian Enquiry Committee visited Washington last week to discuss India's own investiga tions after the Justice Department alleged an Indian intelligence official had directed plans to assassinate dual US-Canada citizen Gurpatwant Singh Pannun. a Sikh separatist, last year.

'We've communicated really clearly that the US government



isn't going to feel fully satisfied until we see that meaningful accountability takes place," said a US official who declined to be named. "We have been emphasizing that we hope that India will move as quickly as possible through their investigative process.

The Indian embassy in Washington did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Washington's message to Indian officials has not been previously reported.

Last week, an unsealed indictment showed that the United States had charged Vikash Yadav,

described as a former officer in India's Research and Analysis Wing spy service, with directing the plot against a Sikh separatist in New York City.

The indictment alleged that beginning in May 2023, Yadav, described as an employee of the Indian government at the time. worked with others in India and abroad to direct a plot against Pannun.

The accusations have tested Washington's relations with India, which the Biden administration sees as a potential counterbalance to China's ambitions in the Indo-Pacific.

Ancient meteorite was 'giant fertilizer bomb' for life on Earth

New research shows, the space rock that slammed into Earth 66 million years ago actually may have been beneficial for the early evolution of life by providing access to the key nutrients phosphorous and iron to bacteria and other single-celled organisms

Washington, Oct 22: The space rock that slammed into Earth 66 million years ago at the end of the Cretaceous Period caused a global calamity that doomed the dinosaurs and many other life forms. But that was far from the largest meteorite to strike our planet

One up to 200 times bigger landed 3.26 billion years ago, triggering worldwide destruction at an even greater scale. But, as new research shows, that disaster actually may have been beneficial for the early evolution of life by serving as "a giant fertilizer bomb" for the bacteria and other single-celled organisms called archaea that held dominion at the time, providing access to the key nutrients phosphorous and iron.

Researchers assessed the effects of this meteorite impact using evidence from ancient rocks in a region in northeastern South Africa called the Barberton Greenstone Belt. They found ample signs, mostly from the geochemical signature of preserved organic material but also from fossils of mats of marine bacteria, that life bounced

back with aplomb. "Life not only recovered quickly once conditions returned to normal within a few years to

decades, it actually thrived," said Harvard University geologist Nadja Drabon, lead author of the study published Monday in The meteorite was a type called a carbonaceous chondrite that is rich in carbon and also contains phosphorus

the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. Earth was a much different place during the Paleoarchean

Era when this occurred, and meteorite impacts were larger and more frequent.

"At this time, Earth was something of a water world, with limited emergence of volcanoes and continental rocks. There was essentially no oxygen gas in the atmosphere and oceans, and no cells with nuclei," Harvard geologist and study co-author Andrew Knoll said.

The meteorite was a type called a carbonaceous chondrite that is rich in carbon and also contains phosphorus. Its diameter was approximately 37-58 km, Drabon said, making it about 50-200 times the mass of the asteroid that wiped out the dinosaurs, aside from their bird descendants.

'The effects of the impact would have been quick and ferocious. The impactor hit with so much energy that it and whatever sediment or rock it hit vaporized. This rock vapor cloud and dust ejected from the crater

would have circled the globe and turned the sky black within hours." Drabon said.

'The impact likely occurred in the ocean, initiating a tsunami that swept across the globe, ripping up the sea floor and inundating coastlines. Lastly, a lot of the impact energy would get transferred into heat, meaning that the atmosphere started heating up so much that the upper layer of the oceans started boiling," Drabon added. It probably would have taken a few years to decades for the dust to settle and for the atmosphere to cool enough for the water vapor to return to the ocean, Drabon said. Microbes depending on sunlight and those in shallow waters would have been decimated.

But the meteorite would have delivered a large amount of phosphorous, a nutrient for microbes crucial for the molecules central to storing and conveying genetic information.

In an interview with Bangla daily Manab Zamin last week, Shahabuddin said he does not have any documentary evidence of Hasina resigning as Prime Minister before she fled the country in August amidst studentled mass protests.

The Anti-discrimination Student Movement, which spearheaded the campaign that led to the ouster of Hasina, rallied in front of the Central Shaheed Minar here, demanding Shahabuddin's resignation.

"The president is an ally of fascism. He was in favour of genocide. We demand his resignation," Nasir Uddin Patwari, a protest leader, said.

Some of the protesters also said that the President might face a campaign against him.

A group of protesters under the banner of Shadhinota-Shorbobhoumotto Rokkha Committee (Committee to protect independence and sovereignty) also staged a sit-in protest at the Dhaka University campus, demanding Shahabuddin's resignation and calling for the termination of the Constitution and the formation of a "revolutionary government"

The protesters also demanded the disbanding of Hasina's Awami League party and its allies from political activities. They later marched towards Bangabhaban, the President's official residence.

"We request him to resign immediately and vacate the Bangabhaban. Otherwise, we will start another movement ২ like the one in July," he said.

In his interview with the Bangla Daily, Shahabuddin said he heard that Hasina had resigned as Prime Minister before she fled Bangladesh, but – he does not have documentary evidence.

## MFI loans decline 2.3% in June qtr, NPAs rise: Report

Mumbai, Oct 22: Loan portfolio of microlenders reduced by 2.3 per cent quarter-on-quarter to ₹4.32 lakh crore in April-June while NPAs surged, a report said.

Notably, for the last few months, microfinance institutions, banks and small finance banks which extend MFI loans, have been reporting challenges on this portfolio, and the regulator has also flagged the same. Over-leveraging among the bor-

rowers is being flagged as a key aspect, impacting asset quality. The report by Crif High Mark,

a credit information company said, there was 17.2 per cent increase in the borrowers having more than five active loan accounts in June when compared with the year-ago period, with highest growth seen in West Bengal and Karnataka.

Nearly half of the rise in stress on an incremental basis when compared to the year-ago period came from borrowers who have five or more active loans, the company said. There was 31.2 per cent QoQ drop in the amount disbursed in the first quarter of FY25 at ₹79.000 crore while the number of loans disbursed fell 32.1 per cent to 1.62 crore.

On the asset quality front, all the three classifications -- overdue for up to 30 days, 31-180 days and over 180 days -- showed an uptick, with the largest stress being in the 31-180 days overdue advances where 2.7 per cent of the loans were unpaid as of June as against 2.1 per cent in March.

The company said Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Odisha and Rajasthan showed the highest stress on the asset quality front, while West Bengal, Karnataka and Maharashtra witnessed the least increase.

Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh alone accounted for over a third of the incremental delinquency during the quarter when compared with the March quarter, it said.

Among the lender types, nonbanking finance companies showed a 2.7 per cent growth in portfolio, while banks showed the steepest decline at nearly 5 per cent. Lenders seem to be preferring higher ticket size loans as the over ₹50.000 amount loans showed the strongest growth.

Bullion traders attributed the jump in precious metal rates to the rising consumption in industrial and wearable segments in the domestic market.

Furthermore, prices were led by growth concerns especially in China, coupled with escalating geopolitical tensions in West Asia and the status quo on interest rates by most global central banks, traders added.

In futures trade on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX), gold contracts for December delivery rose ₹208 or 0.27 per cent to ₹78,247 per 10 grams.

On the MCX, gold prices have risen and the bullish momentum continues to drive prices higher. With the risk barometer staying high, this persistent demand for bullion is likely to keep driving gold prices upward in the near term, Trivedi said.

Market participants will be closely watching for any developments in interest rates, global conflicts and macroeconomic data, as these factors will play a key role in shaping gold's trajectory, he added.

Silver contracts for December delivery climbed ₹882 or 0.91 per cent to ₹98,330 per kg on the exchange.

## 40% of blue-collar workers looking for job change: Report

Mumbai, Oct 22: With attrition rate as high as 40 per cent in the blue-collar job segment, a recent report revealed that over 40 per cent of those interviewed are still actively seeking new opportunities.

Over 40 per cent of participants are currently employed but actively seeking new job opportunities, according to a report by blue-collar hiring platform WorkIndia.

The report revealed that the quest for a better salary is a significant motivator, with 22 per cent of respondents indicating that financial compensation is their primary reason for job hunting.

Additionally, 20 per cent of respondents cited career growth opportunities as a driving factor,



while another 20 per cent noted personal motivations such as relocation, completing education, or changes in family cir-

cumstances, it stated. The report is an analysis based on inputs from 1,100 respondents on the WorkIndia platform.

It further revealed that many experienced candidates feel they need to be more fulfilled in their current roles, prompting them to explore better opportunities. Concerns over layoffs or financial instability within their

current employer often trigger candidates to seek new jobs, said the report.

Meanwhile, the potential for higher salaries and superior benefits remained a primary motivator for many as candidates increasingly prioritise organisations that align with their personal values, particularly regarding work-life balance and company culture.

Around 48 per cent of candidates said they continue to use the job search application even after securing a job, of which 74 per cent of respondents said they are searching for better opportunities.

These statistics highlighted a significant desire among bluecollar workers for roles that offer improved financial compensation and promise enhanced job satisfaction and career growth, it stated

Another 16 per cent of the respondents reported that they are actively searching for job opportunities on behalf of others, said the report.

"This report sheds light on the evolving motivations of blue-collar workers in India. As we continue to support their job search journeys, we are committed to providing resources and opportunities that align with their aspirations for better compensation, career growth, and a fulfilling work environment," WorkIndia co-founder and CEO Nilesh Dungarwal added.

#### Adani Group to buy Orient Cement for ₹8,100 crore

NEW DELHI: Adani Group Tuesday said it has agreed to acquire CK Birla group firm Orient Cement Ltd in a deal valued at ₹8,100 crore, as billionaire Gautam Adani-run conglomerate snaps up smaller rivals to challenge India's top cement maker UltraTech. Ambuja Cement, India's No.2 cement maker. will buy 46.8% of its founders including chairman CK Birla, and certain public shareholders for ₹3,791 crore. This would trigger ar open offer for an additional 26%stake in Orient, according to a company statement. Orient, which has two cement plants in the south and one in western India, will be Ambuja's second acquisition this year. It will add 8.5 million tonnes to take Ambuja's operational capacity to 97.4 million tonnes. The Adani group has plans in the works to raise this to 140 million tonnes a year by 2028, just a shade below market leader UltraTech's current capacity of 149.5 million tonnes.

The 23rd edition of CWG is scheduled to take place July 23 to August 2, 2026 marking Glasgow's return as host after 12 years. "The Games will take place across four venues -Scotstoun Stadium, Tollcross International Swimming Centre, Emirates Arena - including the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome and the Scottish Event Campus (SEC). Athletes and support staff will be housed in hotel accommodation," the federation informed. The roster is a massive set-

back to India's medal prospects given that bulk of the country's medals came from the removed disciplines in the past editions. While announcing the Glasgow schedule, the CGF said "Glasgow 2026 will feature a 10-sport programme concentrated across four venues within an eight-mile corridor.'

The CGF further said, "Cost and operational risk were the main drivers. Every venue introduced brings added costs and complexity for venue hire, security, transport etc. To minimise those risks, it was determined that it would be too costly to add additional venues.

Hockey's omission from the Games would be a significant blow for India. The men's team have won three silver and two bronze medals, while the women have clinched three medals, including a historic gold in the 2002 Games. In badminton, India have racked up an impressive 31 medals – 10 gold, eight silver, and 13 bronze.

Shooting was a stronghold for India, with a staggering 135 medals in their kitty. Wrestling has vielded 114 medals for the nation, including 49 gold, 39 silver, and 26 bronzes.


